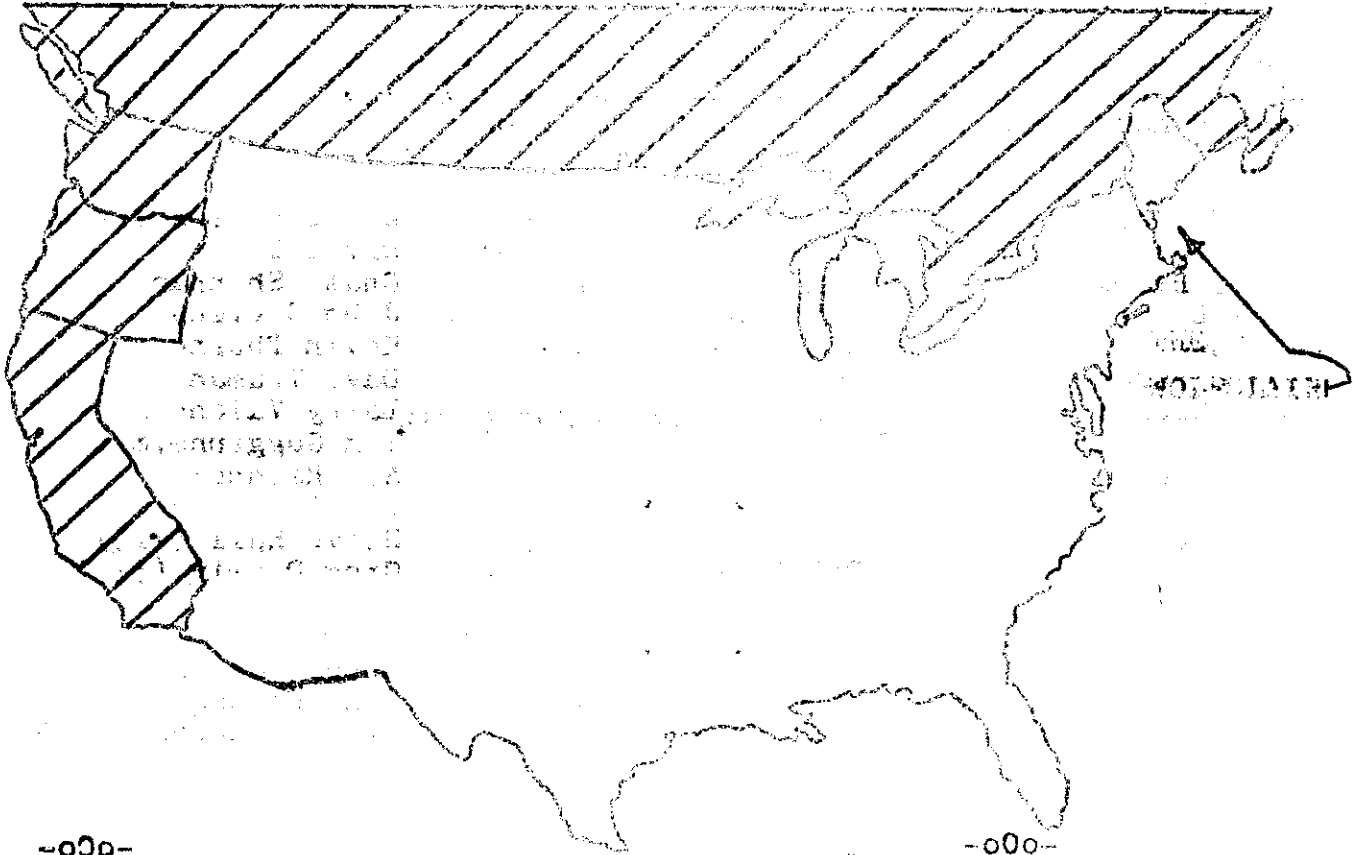

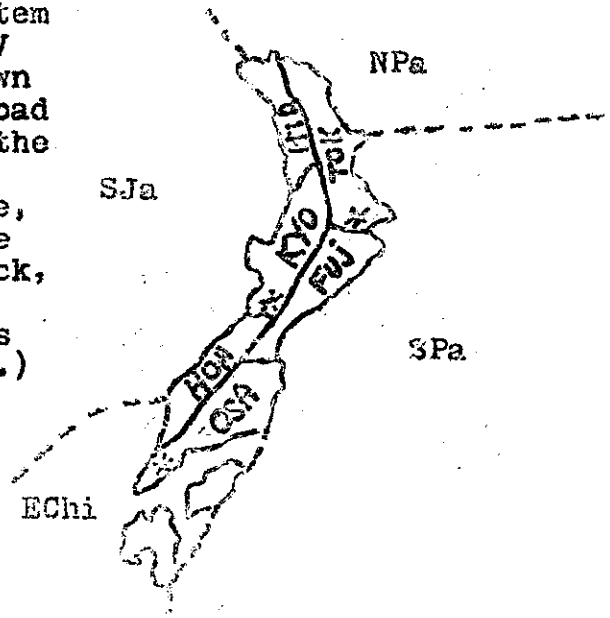

ROME-The King of Italy has ordered Italian Armies to withdraw from Austria where they were preventing hostile action, and to proceed with due haste to the French border, where the decadent scum are accumulating in Marseilles. A Fleet has been sent into the Western Med to help effect the liberation of Iberia. Meanwhile, a second fleet has been sent to the Ionian Sea to mediate the Austro-Turkish dispute over Greece. Long live Italy! (HA!)

BUDAPEST-It is hoped that military efforts endeavoring to attain Rumania have been successful and the Russian aggressors pushed back.

NEWS OF THE WORLD.....

London: England wishes to compliment Turkey for its brilliant move against Russia. England also wishes to state any further moves against Russia would make instant allies (sic) with England.

Rome: "Please accept my deepest apologies for the unjustified attack I have so recently halted. I realize my mistake and pledge undying loyalty to aximilian of Austria-Hungary for the future. Let there be Peace!" So spoke Pope Diocletian I from the Vatican, wishing the best to Austria in the hope that reparations (?) will not come Rome's way for the audacious surprise attack by Italian commandos the year before. Authority has it that the Pope isn't joking around, and really is willing to cooperate with Max in an attempt to restore the Pax Romana to the Mediterranean, something this reporter can only hope Max will realize and not take offense at the attack in Fall 1901.

Paris (5 March 1902): A spokesman for the French government announced that the successful Iberian campaign enlarged the public funds sufficiently to raise two new fleets and a new army without endangering the economic stability of France. In fact, a small surplus is to be used to renovate the Hotel Majestic. "Who knows, it may be used for a peace conference", the spokesman said.

Vienna (1 Jan. 1902): "The Austro-Hungarian Empire condemns the unprovoked aggression by the upstart who is posing as the Duke of Italy (who dat?). The Empire is confident that the Duke does not represent the will of the people, and called on the Duke to repent before it is too late." "No one who trifles with me does so with impunity." "The Empire wishes to note that the designation "Duke" is deliberate, and that the Empire does not recognize him as either King or Poep, or even Pope."

Constantinople (BDP): ...mosques throughout the city were ... Ottoman victories in Bulgaria and its Crimea. Leaving Hagia Sophia, ... Chief of the Turkish General Staff, addressing the huge throng gathered outside, proclaimed a holy war against all infidels and vowed that "...the scimitar shall not be sheathed until all humankind bows to the will of Allah, and His Parishes be sung in all the parts of the world. Ottoman diplomatic representatives were officially aghast at the General's speech. The Grand Vizier, Fakih al-Fani, immediately issued a statement disavowing any aggressive intentions on the part of the Ottoman Empire. He stated that the Turkish occupation of Sevastopol and the Crimea was in response to a plea for intervention from the Moslem Tartars of the region to protect them from mounting persecution by the Christian Russian authorities. The invasion and reannexation of Bulgaria the Grand Vizier explained as a preventive measure, designed to guard against the possibility of a Russo-Bulgarian assault against Constantinople. Despite an official disclaimer of aggressive intentions, most observers here feel that Sultan Abdul Hamid II, swayed by the brilliant victories of Stehfehni Pasha in Persia and Egypt, has given the General his blessing for an attempt to turn the Black Sea into an Ottoman Lake. Added to this has been given to this opinion by the recent large increase in size of the Ottoman army, the doubling in strength of the Turkish navy. The big question, in the eyes of many Western diplomats here, is whether Stehfehni Pasha, a fanatic Moslem Ghazi from the highlands of central Anatolia, will be content to conquer the Black Sea littoral, or whether he will try to translate his proclamation of a jihad into bloody reality.
