Charles Jones (Ita) - When I was assigned Italy, I first decided on a strategem. Control of the Med & in the long term control of the sea zones. With the diplomatic strategem of always telling the truth & keeping my word, this meant conflict with other players who built fleets. With only 2 ways to advance in the early game, I wrote to France, Austria, & Turkey to see which player would be the easiest to work with. Turkey was agreeable to my intervention in Austria but made no secret that it was me next. Austria was open to an alliance with France openly hostile. So, in the beginning, I used my units to control the Western Med & diplomacy to limit the size of the Austrian fleets. Then in the "Rebel", Melinda asked the question why there were so many draws. This decided me that I would either win or help an ally win. In the early game, I tried to put together a 3-way of I/A/G. It never really worked since Germany & Austria were at odds off & on. At first, I thought that either Germany or Austria would win; & I'd have helped either of them pull it off. They both jumped to 6 centers quickly. I wanted this game to have a winner so if I couldn't win, I wanted either Austria or Germany to get the win (in that order). Then, for some un-understandable reason, they both just stalled. Austria couldn't get Sev & War; Germany wouldn't take Par. I'd write both telling them how to do it & they would do something else. So, at that time, I decided that if they didn't want to listen, I'd go for the win myself since I was close to a position to try. So I wrote Russia, Germany, & Austria a letter dripping with glee. GM-Players: It's evident now that the press is really getting personal and sinking fast. So everybody gets their licks in this issue and then I don't want to see any more of this. I've been letting things go in the past, but I will edit ruthlessly in the future.

Angry Pope-English Twit: Your assistance to the French in destroying my fleet in Portugal was the last straw. The only reason I have tolerated you for so long was at the insistence of Italy's game-long ally, Austria, who for some reason thought you deserved a part of the draw. Even his patience, however, has worn thin & has come to regard you for the snake you really are. Indeed, Thomas' press was far too kind. You have weaved such an extensive web of lies & deceit that I doubt even you remember what the "truth" is anymore. Frankly, I'm sick of all your lies & I'm sick of you. Hopefully, you did the board a favor & NMR'd out. If not, you will regret it. I will veto any draw that includes England. I'll settle for a 3-way with France before I'll setting for one with you. At least Dave plays honorably & with integrity. But, of course, those words are quite meaningless to you.

Eng-Rus: Your press message in #71 was nothing but a pack of lies, insults, and self-serving rationalizations. Your claim that I would have accused you of anti-Semitism had your press contained an unflattering appraisal of my strategy and tactics is the most mean-spirited lie I have ever heard in 9 years of playing Diplomacy. An accusation of anti-Semitism, or of any other form of intolerance, is such a serious one that I would never, and have never, made such a charge against anyone for personal gain. Additionally, while you have shown yourself capable of creating extremely vulgar press messages, it is my opinion that bigots reveal themselves through hateful comments related to race, religion, ethnicity, etc., not through an inaccurate analysis of a Diplomacy player's skills. After you introduced the topic of my religious faith into this game's press, you stated that your "problem" with me was not with my "background" but with my being a "fart" who "lies" and "refuses to take responsibility for [my] own actions." While your insult was vile enough to prove that you are, as you speculated, "childish", your comments about "lies" and about ducking "responsibility" are nothing but lies themselves. At no point in this game have you and I ever been allied or had an agreement of any sort. I never made a single promise to you so what, pray tell, were the "lies" of mine which you found so unbearably offensive? As for the issue of responsibility, it seems that it has become my responsibility to remind you of certain of your own actions in this game. You entered this game in S'02 as a replacement for a player who had resigned. In your press message in #71, you accused me of having a "game-long ambition" to steal St. Petersburg from you; but the truth is that in S'02 (your first turn in this game) I moved the 1 unit (F Nwy) which I had adjacent to your UNOCCUPIED St. Petersburg AWAY from St. Petersburg. In fact, in F'02, when you began your unannounced and unprovoked effort to steal my Norwegian

supply center. I had NO units anywhere near St. Petersburg. If anyone is ducking responsibility for his actions, it is YOU, my foul-mouthed fellow gamer. When the opinions which you expressed in your press message are compared to the facts (which anyone can easily verify for themselves by examining our respective moves for 1902), it is clear that you have not offered an honest explanation for your real reason, whatever it may be for claiming that I am "personally annoying" to you. Perhaps the truth is simply that you are a mean-spirited, misanthropic madman Manning and that you just cannot bring yourself to forgive me for putting up too good a fight. Who knows? Whatever the reason, your vulgar & obscene press messages and your even more obnoxious personal notes have made the unchallenging task of dispatching you to the dustbin of Dipdom an extreme pleasure.

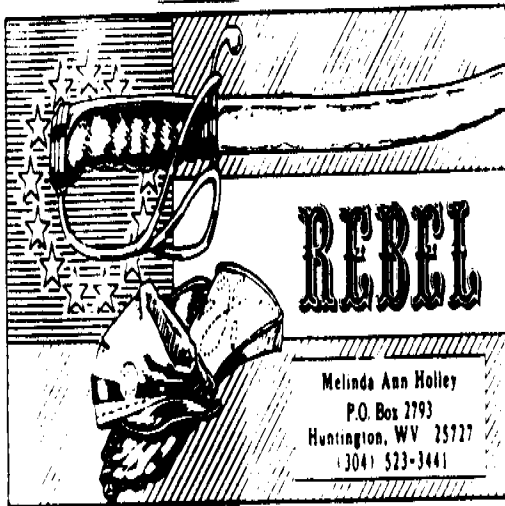
