<u>RULES CHANGES</u> The following rule goes into effect with this season.

19.5 Royal Whim.

In any season, the Kings of original and recognized countries, Grand Dukes of grand duchies, and Princes of principalities can change the names of their respective countries. Such name changes are subject to absolute veto of the Gamemaster.

note. I assume it will be fun for the players to name their countries. I don't want to be a stick in the mud, but I will reject any name which is not in the spirit of the game. Names like "Nameless Dread," "Bikinla," or "Rumplestilskinsvillentag" are out. Slobbovia this game ain't.

Commentary

This has been the most interesting season so far. The French Emperor has

succeeded in destroying England by subversion. By Military moves this would have taken a number of gameyears. Congratulations, Marley Jordan.

The entry of Charles Dupuis and Phil McGee into the French ranks may also make for some interesting developments. Mr. Dupuis is now the second most powerful player in France since he has four units under the French flag. This could mean a lessening in the Austrian influence over France, since Chuck Doehrer is no longer so influential with the French autocrat.

The defection should be almost as much bad news for the Italian king as it was for the English. Bob Sacks was counting on a continued and protracted war between England and France. He needed the war to go on to be sure of his western flank while he finushed stabilizing his position in the eastern areas. It's almost silly for France to attack Russia with the very much greater threat possed by Italy. I expect that war between France and Italy is about to begin. (Oops. Bob Sacks is now the Holy Roman Emperor, not the Italian King.)

Just what went on in Greece is hard to figure out. Clearly there was an armed clash between Austrian and Roman units. It seems clear that Bob Sacks expected the defection of the army in Greece since he drove the unit out and would not have if he did not expect to lo the center because of the defection. However, if the Romans and Austrians are now at war, why didn't Bruce Martin defect A Ber at the same time?

Jim LaWhon doesn't really want to play. If he doesn't indicate an intention to play by the Winter deadline, I'll appoint to the German throne the only player on the standby list 7 John Kador.

Phil McGee seems finally to have found a country that wasn't in immediate danger of being overrun. Jumping back and forth from sinking ships must be nerve-wracking.
