Commentary: I'll be very dissappointed if civil war does not break out in Germany. Let me explain why. Unquestionably, the German throne has, until now, been controlled by the Paris-Vienna axis. All German commanders have had first loyalties to either France or Austria. But, Kaiser John Kador has chaffed at the bit. By passing the German throne to Phil McGee, the Kaiser switched sides. However, because he didn't

control his country's troopps, he could not swing his country. This means that the control of Germany is not yet determined. The rules encourage commanders to think of the country as belonging to them, as well as to the king. The commanders can still fight for control of the Reich.

By declaring civil insurrection, Doehrer and Dupuis can prevent the new Kaiser from making build orders, etc. It would also mean that removals would be made by lct from among the German units--not occupying centers. Furthermore, any unit not in a center is in danger of being lifted if Germany must remove a unit.

As a result, any attempt by Kaiser McGee to put down a rebellion is not assured of success. He will have to push the rebel commanders (that's a switch!) out of both Munich and Kiel. Secondly, they cannot be purged during the rebellion; they can hold out for quite some time if supported by their other units.

Since Doehrer and Dupuis have 3 of the 4 German units, with some luck and forethought, they are capable of deposing the Red

Kaiser fairly handily.
