This here zeen comes out whenever I can get around to it, it seems. Deadlines usually run a month, and it takes a couple weeks for me to get it all together. Lexpect to put the next one out beforenew years, and still keep promising myself to get this onto a more regular six week schedule. But you've heard that before about a million times, I'm sure.

I'm also reconsidering the moratorium on game starts. Not that it'll be a dip game, mind you, what I had in mind was a quick game of 1830. Any interest out there in the masses? The 1830 would be run outside the zeen, much as the gunboat tournaments are being run now, to give it a chance to finish before the end of the century. I expect 1830 to take about as long to finish by mail as Dip, maybe even a little shorter.

The anarchy game has really started out with a bang. Keep up the great work, gang! Anybody who'd like to jump right in, feel free to send in some standby moves. And press, of course.

Lest we forget, this is still a Pentegram Publication. Leading the way into a kinder and gentler way of zeendom in the 90s. That's us. I forget most of the things I'm going to say here before I ever get around to committing them to electrons.

Meanwhile, Julie edges closer to taking the LSAT and applying to law school. She'll probably manage to pull it off, too. That'd be something, for sure. My wife the rock and roll lawyer!

Ask Dr Dicko

Q: What can you tell me about those nice maps? Are they PostScript documents or what? I've been thinking about a HyperCard stack which would allow you to drag armies and fleets into the appropriate spots. maybe you could even tie in an adjudication program into HyperTalk. Has anyone tried this?

A: Yep, the maps are Encapsulated PostScript documents. Wallace Nicoll made the original, and Ken Peel and I have touched it up a little since then. If you'd like a copy on disk, just ask and it's yours. I know there have been adjudication programs in the past (written in Pascal, I think), but nobody's ever tried it with Hypercard. This is your big chance to beat us all to the punch, and learn Hyperscript in the process.

Q: The press in your zeen reads very much like the players see the press incrementally between pubs. How does that come to pass, unless they routinely pass their press releases between each other prior to/concurrent with submitting to you.

Q: By the way, how do you get the back-andforth repartée in the press if you don't allow black press (cf Rome/Rockville on page 18)? Do you do this via E-Mail?

A: No, what looks like real dialogue is all smoke and mirrors—editing and rearranging of the press by yours truly. Of course, the Rockville releases are mine that I write after reading all the other press, so there is some dialogue going on here. Since I have to mix the press up anyway to keep the grey press from being too obvious, might as well make it more fun to read, eh?

Q: Where's a copy of the house rules for your dip? I notice your province and sea space abbreviations are different from what I'm used to.

A: Yeah, I'm out in left field for many things, and this is one of them. I've got my own abbreviations that I got used to in high school, and have been using them ever since. I don't list the abbreviations in the HRs, but they shouldn't be that hard to figure out.

Q: Where's Thorazeen? Who's holding it up?

A: As usual, one player hadn't gotten moves in. Seems like a different player each time, too. But if I told you who it was...that would be telling.

Q: If Italy NMRed this turn in 7 Wonders,

which unit would you remove?

A: If he did (which he didn't), I'd take off the F Ion. The rule is that units farthest from home dots get taken off first, fleets before armies. Since F Nap is in a home dot, it goes last. A Tyr, A Tri, F Ion

are all one move away from a home dot, so F Ion goes (fleets before armies, remember). If one of the armies happened to be in Tun, the fleet would still go first, as the army could get to a home dot in one turn via convoy. I don't count foreign fleets for this purpose, by the way. Thus, if there's a Turkish F Ion, Italian F Adr and A Tun, Italy's removal would be A Tun (can't get to a home dot, period). Switch it around a bit, Turkish F Adr, Italian F Ion and A Tun, and the F Ion goes first (fleet before army, each one move away from a home dot). Hopelessly confused yet? And this isn't even one of the paradoxes....

Q: Also, isn't it getting to be well nigh upon college hoop season? Going to grace an issue with a preview? As I write this Penn State football has only fallen once (to Virginia of all folks), but they

are not destined for glory this year.

A: If you want the full deal for college b-ball, you'll have to check out Brad Wilson's Vertigo. His next issue should be the big preview of the upcoming season. I'm a bit too much of a partisan Maryland/ACC fan to go into real depth.

Q: Could you send me the introduction section

for 1830?

A: Even better than that, it's short and I'll reprint it here. C'mon Russ, I dare you to call me the Stafford of 1830.

"1830 is a railroad game set in the northeastern United States and southern Canada. The players take on the role of railroad investors, promoters and presidents with the general objective of making money. Their methods may reflect a greater or lesser degree of public responsibility depending on

their personal inclinations.

"A player's wealth is accumulated mainly through owning shares of stock in the eight Railroad Corporations included in the game. Stock shares make money in two ways—they can provide ready cash via dividend payments and they can increase in value. The single largest stockholder in a Corporation becomes its president and operates the Railroad, ideally, but not necessarily, for the benefit of all stockholders. The game ends when either:

"1) The Bank funds are exhausted, or

"2) A player goes bankrupt.

"The winner is the wealthiest player at the end of the game. A player's wealth is made up of his personal cash and his stock certificates—at current market values. (Railroad Corporation assets, whether funds or trains, are not counted in the total.)"

There, now doesn't that just inspire you to run out and get a copy? Well, maybe not. But 1830 has jumped into my top 3 favorite games over the last year (along with Dip and Titan) -a great game for 3 to 6 players. I've certainly played more 1830 than anything else over the last two years.

Q: How about running an 1830 game in Retal? I'd jump at the chance to either play or run it.

A: Your wish is my command! If we get enough response, we'll start before New Years.







I guess you should have taken France's offer in 1904, even if it meant you wouldn't have reached eight centers until 1907 or nine until 1908, instead of your current achievements. (An aside to Erik—I didn't say I would support Scott to Spain; I just said that I promised him I would).

ANKARA to CAPTAIN ZIPPY: By the way, David, it was Scott who persuaded me to stab you, even though I was giving it serious thought anyway. As you will recall, in Spring 1904 we agreed

that you would take Naples from me, in accordance with our longterm agreement. 2) Civilization: Another recent rage, but then I don't know...I keep wondering if it's not a Golden Age of Rome version of Conquistador (to say that playing Conquistador takes longer than the actual time span of the Spanish Armada is like saying that the movie A Bridge Too Far cost more to make than Operation Market Garden itself--both are true statements, and no, I don't like wargaming that much).

3) (uncertain on name) Buck Rogers in the 25th Century: This game is boxed and packaged very much like the Milton Bradley Gamemaster series (big box, lots of plastic figurines). I'm a big fan of the Gamemasters series, so I'm equally puzzled as to why this



game doesn't move well in game stores.

4) (uncertain on name) Castle Greyhawk or World of Greyhawk: Again, much like the Gamemaster series, but then adapted from the six most popular string of D&D modules of all time (I believe they actually made a limited comic book out of it, as well as a calendar). The pieces look out of sight (dragons, elves, etc-and this is from someone that hates D&D).

I cannot honestly figure out why Milton Bradley hasn't gone ahead and done a "Civil War" game for their Gamemaster series--I would guess that Civil War enthusiasts outnumber even WWII hobbyists.

ROCKVILLE: OK, I'll see what I can do.... I think your judgement of Kremlin is right on the money. It's a game that sounds cuter than it really is. Civ is an old game that's very good when played by good players who are paying attention. It can drag on forever, but certainly doesn't have to as most things can be done semi-simultaneously. I think it's better without the extra trade cards (which make it too easy to advance). The others...never seen 'em. Hope that helps out a bit.

LONDON to ANYONE IN PARTICULAR: Assuming that game shops everywhere are beginning to fold, tell me, what do you guys think killed the market? For me, I would have to say that prolific rules and rising game costs curbed my game-buying habits. The price of games in general have doubled since 1980 (I remember buying Arab Israeli Wars for \$10).

ROCKVILLE: Games just became too complex while the market became flooded with new releases. Instead of everybody having some common ground, like Afrika Korps or Stalingrad, there were dozens of games which nobody had a chance to master (or even play a couple times). The field is still narrow enough in some genres to know all the relevant games (there are only about half a dozen decent choo choo games, for example), but as a whole...forget it.

LONDON to ROCKVILLE: One more game: Avalon Hill's Down With The King: This was advertised as a Machiavellian game, but for some reason it was always "on sale" in stores.

ROCKVILLE: Sorry, never seen it.

ROME to ROCKVILLE: Why is it you keep forgetting my army (which is now in Trieste)? Don't you like me anymore?

ROCKVILLE: Assuming I did in the first place, you mean? No, it's not that, it's just that once something is lost around here it is very hard to find!

LONDON to ROCKVILLE AND REIFF: As a newly converted baseball fan, you'll be proud of me--I'm listening to Steve Goodman's "The Dying Cubs Fan" ("The last time we won a national league pennant was when the US dropped the bomb on Japan").

ROCKVILLE: And sure enough, the Cubs died again.

ROME to ROCKVILLE: OK so I have one more win than I should. Make Dallas' record 3-13 and everything adds up, ok? As for the rest of it...well, it's still early. PS- The Browns just plain suck.

ROCKVILLE: I think you've overestimated Dallas's chances by about three wins. And it's hard to win when your starting fullback has been sacked by the local penitentiary.



In the other game that I am GMing, there seems to be a lack of communicating when it rolls around to Trade time.... thus there are very few trades made. With the Trade rules that include the Corrollary:Trade Loss (as we have in this game also!!!) rule, a number of players are returning 2. 3. and more cards each turn. Now, that may be acceptable with you, but I want to alert all the players to this upcomming 'event' so that you can prepare for it - or we can consider the following changes....

The following ideas are put forth for your discussion, and later a vote on them. I am inserting my reasonings for them, and or my own preferences.

Idea 'A: Leave everything as it is. This will work if you feel that you can make trades with your fellow players via mail (or some of you via planes). And in reverse also, if you feel that everyone will be affected by the Card Loss rule fairly equally, then again this would be the way to go.

Idea 'B' Delete only the Corrollary: Trade Loss portion of the rules. By this we mean the throwing away of cards more than your city limit. As it is sometimes very difficult to make trades when you don't write others, or they don't write to you, this is one method proposed that avoids the loss of cards - except then the basic Rules come into play that would allow only six cards in hand, just like in face to face play. I don't like this idea.

Idea 'C' <u>Also remove the expanded trade cards</u>. In this game that needs to be done before the next turn....as I would expect someone to start building cities, the I could wait a turn and adjust at that time.....

Idea 'D' Allow 2 more cards in hand over whour city levels. Thus 4 cites mean you keep 6 cards. and with 6 cites you would keep 8 cards. This is a middle of the road change as I see it.

Idea 'E' Same as 'D' except allow 3 cards more than your cities. I feel this is stretching to the far limits.

Idea 'F' The Trade Cards received by the Players would no longer be kept secret. I propose this for two basic reasons. 1) When you sit face to face you can hear the other porposed trades being offered and you get ideas of what each player has, and wants — and you can jump into a trade that you were not part of. And 2) no longer would you have to write to each player every Trade phase, instead being able to concentrate on those players holding the cards you wish to trade for. With this last, I as a GM would not list openly who obtained which calamitics...and I would need to limit your ability to try and lock out one of those cards...ic, you would not be allowed to state which cards you were expecting to recieve...only the one main

card, point values, and minimum number of cards.

2) To be valid, each player must submit his own orders. Orders *must* be legible. Orders should also contain the date, season, country, game name, and your signature, or the GM will get mad.

3) Orders received by the last mail delivery of the deadline day are always accepted. Late orders are possible until the game has been adjudicated, but I make no promises that late moves will be used or that this will necessarily lead to a later deadline.

4) It is legal to phone in orders, but the player accepts full responsibilty for any errors which may occur as a result.

- 5) The first time a player NMRs (No Moves Received), a standby may be called to submit alternate orders for that country for the following season. If the original player NMRs that next season, the standby orders are used, and the standby takes over the position. If the original player sends moves the second season, his orders are used. Players who NMR out of games forfeit the remainder of their sub balance.
- 6) Press releases are encouraged! For regular games, we use gray press-only the great powers may dateline press from their home centers, any other dateline is fair game. For example, only France may dateline press "Paris," but anyone may dateline press "France." For variant games all press is black: no datelines are protected. In all cases the dateline "Rockville" is reserved for the GM's use.
- 7) Players should feel free to bring any complaints to the GM's attention as soon as possible. Adjudication errors which are not corrected by the following season must stand.
- 8) Deception of the GM is strictly forbidden if game related, and is punishable by any means possible.
- 9) Players are encouraged to show some class and resign unwanted positions, instead of just dropping out.
- 10) The most recently dated set of orders will be considered valid for that season. In the case of multiple undated orders, the GM will use his judgement-attempting to use the most recent orders.

11) Ending the game:

Votes: may be proposed by any player still in the game, or the GM. All ballots will be due with the set of orders due immediately following the proposal. Not voting counts as a NO vote. Votes must be unanimously in favor to pass. All votes are public.

Win: 18 or more centers, or unanimously voted concession by all remaining powers. Must have at least one center to win by concession. In the case of two concessions passing on the same turn, both are void.

Draw: no net center change for three consecutive years, or unanimous approval of all surviving powers. Any power with centers must be included in the draw proposal. (Draws Include All Survivors-DIAS)

- 12) Conditional orders are permitted, so long as the condition is clear and precedes the orders (for example, on whether a standby takes over a country, or spring moves conditional on the prior winter's builds). Not permitted is making your builds conditional on another player's builds, and the like.
- 13) Failure to maintain a current subscription can lead to a player's removal from any games here.
- 14) When interpreting poorly written orders, it is assumed that the player is attempting to make a legal move.
- 15) In the event of a postal strike, deadlines for affected games will be delayed until two weeks after the end of the strike, if such a date is later than the scheduled deadline.
- 16) Seasons will be separated if half of the players so request, or at the GMs discretion.
- 17) In the instance of a Spring 01 NMR, the game will be delayed and a standby called.

To sum up, the rulebook is the primary basis for the way games will be run, and a thorough knowledge of that is far more important than these houserules. These exist to permit the postal play of a face to face game. I'm not aware of any significant difference between the 1971 rulebook and any more recent revisions. We go by the 1971 book because that's all I have. If a situation arises which is not covered by the rulebook or above HRs, the GM should use his common sense. The GM should endeavor to reveal as little about the progress of the game to the players outside the game reports as possible. And that's all for houserules. That wasn't so bad, now, was it?
