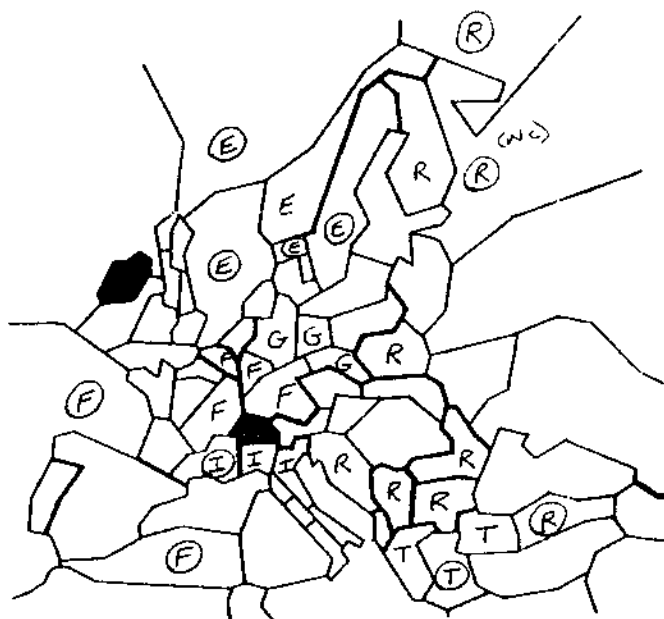

(Paul Boymel - Turkey, Winner) Lex, my first postal game in a dozen years, was the kind of game one dreams of but rarely achieves—through a combination of dumb luck and hard-working diplomacy, *everything* I tried worked.

In Winter 1900, I offered alliances to Italy, Austria, and Russia; they *all* accepted. Phil Reynolds

(Russia) was much too trusting, a condition he has happily outgrown (just ask his sister Vicki, if anyone can find her). He crumbled quickly. Ditto Jachera (Italy), whose sole contribution to the game was destroying the lead French fleet in the fateful Spring 1903.

I chose to ally with David Andersson (Austria) with much trepidation. Cap'n Dave (oops, sorry, Major Disappointment) was the "ideal ally—a master diplomat and a sound tactician—but I *knew* that if I left him the slightest opening, he would devour me without a qualm. So, I just had to be a little bit sneakier than he.

The key move in this game was Spring 1903. After 1902, France had fleets in Tys, Wme, and Mao and was in far better position than I (F Ion, F Aeg) to dismantle Italy. Unless England stabbed France, I was doomed to a long boring stalemate in the Med, probably ending with an Austrian sword in my back. But...in Spring 1903, not only did France NMR, but Italy came briefly out of his coma, destroyed the French F Tys, and then disappeared. As Puggsley pointed out, I couldn't have scripted that season better if I had been playing all three countries.

Once Weiss (France) dropped out, Scott Beckett (England) was free to dissolve the western alliance and accept my longstanding offer of a three-way alliance among Austria, England, and Turkey. David assumed that he and I would use Scott and then discard him without pity; I had other ideas. After I saw what was happening in Hyboria and read Reiff's article on Capcon XI, I knew a massive raid on Fort Knox was in order and that Fall 1904 was probably my best chance. (A major contributing factor was the grey press. David and I were, for about a year, responsible for the lion's share of the obnoxious grey press floating around in Retal, including my "Radcliff Pilgrimage" in #119 and my "Curare Turkey" grey press all throughout #118. Unfortunately, David was starting to take it a bit seriously, especially my portraying him as a pudgy 5'3" and my revealing his passion for the fair and noble Smurfette.)

My problem was to keep Scott friendly so that my stab wouldn't force the Western powers to form an all-out alliance against me. Fortunately, David came to the rescue. We had previously agreed that he would take Naples from me.

Instead of my simply moving out, I convinced David to double-attack Naples, *forcing* me out. Thus, we could pretend to the rest of the world that we were fighting with each other. It worked beautifully. Two days after the Spring 1904 moves came out, I got a card from England *demanding* that I punish Austria for the stab! So, I stabbed and the rest was simply a matter of technique.

Despite all of the silly things I said about Puggsley in the press, I consider David to be a great player and a terrific guy. If he could just get over his unwarranted embarrassment about being 5'3" tall and 234 pounds.... I apologize to Scott Beckett, who was a superb ally and a delightful person to work with. He deserved far better. Thanks also to long-suffering Dick Martin for his well run zeen, for tolerating the press Dave and I cranked out, and for his excellent sense of humor.

(Dan Gorham — Germany) Hay guys — Enjoyed the game, am happy to have survived as the King of Sweden — but I would have loved to do you all in!

(David Andersson — Austria) Not having access to my vintage *Retaliation* collection, I can't remember if I came into the game late, or if I started it. All I really remember is a series of "beyond the pale" falsehoods by Paul Boymel that tugged at my heartstrings (he said he had just lost his job, love, etc, etc) that gave me to understand that Paul places considerable emotional importance in winning at Diplomacy. Paul is a good tactician though, and played well, and deserves to win. I suspect though, that Paul's brand of negotiating works well only once, and then he must needs move on. Time will tell.

(Dick Martin — GM) This game certainly went smoothly for the Turks. Once the knife went into the Austrian back it was a simple question of whether the other players would unite to stop him. But Paul did some good diplomacy early, and the alliance never formed up. Good game, guys, and I enjoyed your press and other writings (even if some of it was a bit too much at times).

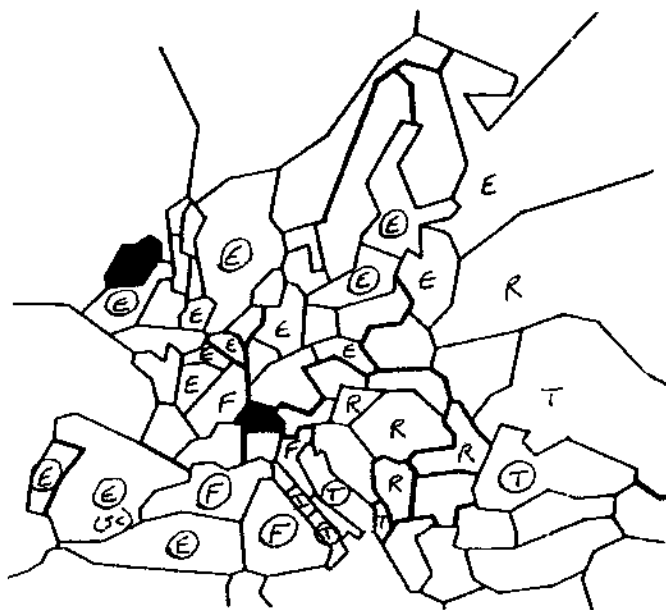

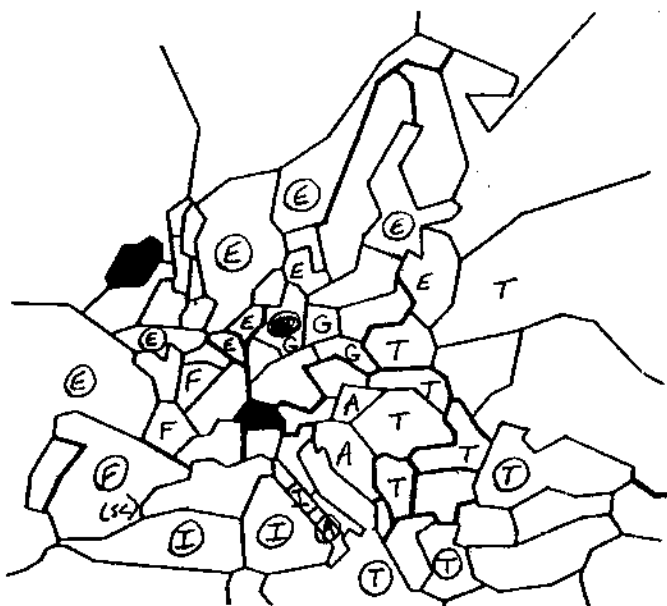

1830?! How Did *That* Get in Here?

The Halloween games were fun, for those of you who missed them. Besides 1830, we squeezed in a couple games of *Dinosaurs of the Lost World* (a cute, yet silly game), *Merchant of Venus* (an all-around neat game), and a few computer games (eh, Russell?). One of the 1830 games was an eight-player mongo-variant using Coalfields, Reading variant variant, and altered private companies. The Reading variant variant we used had a slightly different Reading base hex moved up to where the SVNRR normally is, with the mountain in that hex pushed up one space to the northwest. Also, the SVNRR price was boosted up to \$230, generated \$35 in income, and gave the lucky winner the triple-share presidency of Reading RR. We also tossed in the Western RR of Massachusetts private company, and gave each player \$330 to start. That might have been a bit low, but still workable.

Julie started the Norfolk & Western and built up the coalfields, while BO and NYNH also started up. I just sat on the Reading, collecting those big bucks and buying up other shares. The game turned out to be surprisingly playable and balanced, though I don't think the new New York upgrade improves things (the whole city merges into one big four-token blob at the brown level, making token plays there pointless — a three-token blob would be better). And we definitely didn't like the wimpy "run your dying trains one more time" rule. (As it's written, Alan, we couldn't figure out whether that "one more turn" rule meant that more than one company would be able to trade for the cheap diesel. Does it?) But that's just the way we play. The western stuff turned out not to matter terribly much, as most of the companies would have been better off just staying in the east instead of trying for the Gulf/Chicago swing-through (both can be run through in the Coalfields variant). As I remember it, there was a shortage of yellow track, as CO and NW used up the track that PA & BO (building out from Pittsburgh) needed to link up to the western routes. So in addition to the extra cities added in for Coalfields, some extra yellow track would be in order as well.

With a little tweaking, the Coalfields is a worthwhile extension to the regular game. Adding in the Reading variant too is a worthwhile project. If your games always "turn out the same" add these guys in and see if that's still the case. By the way, I've still got a few copies of the Coalfields lying around if you'd like one (thanks to Tom "The Source" Swider).
