A couple of important developments:

(me)

1) The Post Office have informed that, in fact, stapled self-mailers do not receive the same handling as first class mail in envelopes. They must be hand-sorted rather than machine-sorted, and this adds at least one day delay each time they are handled in an area where machine sorting is in use.

As a result:

(a) I have purchased some envelopes and developed a system for printing return address, etc., on them. All players' copies will henceforth be sent out in envelopes. (Subscribers', I should say, non-players, will continue to be sent stapled copies, as time is not as crucial for them.) There will be no increase in subscription rates, despite the extra cost of envelopes.

(b) All games sent out in the pre-envelope era will be delayed a week if orders are missing. This affects all games whose deadlines are Mar. 5 or earlier.

2) It has become evident that the postal deterioration is a very real one. For example, one US subscriber (er, player) reports that RUNESTONE regularly takes 10 days to reach him, sometimes longer. While a few days may be shaved off this by my converting to envelopes, this is nevertheless too slow to permit proper play on 4-week deadlines. As a result, all games with US player will convert to 5-week deadlines, all overseas games will run on 6-week (at least) deadlines. 7-week deadlines will be considered for some overseas games if the players indicate a need.

I'll try to keep this issue short, as next week looks to be a very busy one. I have quite a bit of material on hand, much of which I'll try to get into the Feb. 19 issue.
