Comment from Bernie Oaklyn: "I am not sure of the mechanism that Horst used to let another player order his unit in Rumania. ((Using codewords is not "a mechanism... to let another player

order his unit..." It's a perfectly ordinary device to telescope negotiation time, and has been in use in RUNESTONE for years. I'm surprised you haven't come across it before. The fact that I mentioned that it was in use divulges no secret information - other players might deduce that Austria has an ally (or thinks he has), which is hardly earth-shaking news. There's nothing unethical about using codewords nor in mentioning that they were used, in my view.)
