Austria (Doug Hayward): a nap-tun; f tun-tyr, s by f tus; f adr-apu; a run h; a pie-mar; a mun-ruh, s by a kie; a sil-mun, s by a boh; a ven h.

England (Gord Bartman): f wes-tun; f ion-nth, s by f eng; f wal-lpl; a vor-edi.

Germany (John Morgan): NMR! a fin dislodged; f bot, a den, a bel, a bur & a mar all hold unordered.

Russia (Eric Kirchner): a pru-sil; a war s a pru; f ion c Aus a nap-tun; a ber h; a stp-fin, s by a nwy; a nos-stp; f bar-nrg; f edi-nth.

Fall 1908: LONG-RANGE PROSPECTS FOR RUSSIA-AUSTRIA (BARRING STABS):

Austria: a ruh-bur, s by a mun; a kie-hol; a pie-mar; a boh-tyr; a nap-tun; f tus-lyo, s by f tyr; a rom-tus; f apu-nap; a ven h.

England: a vor-edi, s by f nth; f lpl-cly; f eng-mid; f wes-lyo.

Germany: (Retreated f fin-swe); a den-kie; a hel un; a bur-bel; a mar-bur; f swe h, s by f bot.

Russia: a fin-swe, s by a nwy; a stp-mos; f edi h, s by f nrg; a ber-kie; a sil-ber; a war-sil; f ion c Aus a nap-tun.

Retreat: German a bur to pic, par, gas or disband.

Centres: Austria: home, ser, bul, gre, con, ven, rom, nap tun, mun, kie, hol (14) Build 3.

England: ion, lpl, bre, por, spa (5) No change.

Germany: bel, M¹, par, mar, den, swe (5) If a bur disbands, no change (otherwise remove 1).

Russia: home, rum, ank, smy, ber, nwy, edi (10) Build 1.

I'm going to ask for Winter/Spring orders (if you want Winter only, just ask), due Monday, Oct. 29.

John Morgan has been in Germany and expects to be posted to St. John, N.B., as of Oct. 1, and has no address there yet. At his request, a temporary substitute for Germany is called for; 'tis Margaret Gemignani (addresses last issue).

Goof of the Week: In 1977AIid (4-player Ladman) the Russian retreat to Smy gained that centre for him, giving him a total of 13 centres and 3 builds; Italy has only 15 centres but still builds 2. It's obvious where this build will go, and it's well behind the lines, so I'm going to allow Bob his third build with Spring orders. Other players may change their Spring orders and may make them conditional on the Russian build if they want. New deadline: Mon., Oct. 22. (Sigh....)

Game 1978Fha (Flintlock II), Fall 1654: (reprint from carbon copy mailing)

Note a couple of small errors. The English army in Cayu froze; there was none in Onon. Also, I omitted the order for the Algonkian unit in Musk.

Algonkians (Steve Norris): GulfStLawrence-TerreNeuve; Quebec-Gaspesie, s by StLawrence; Algonquin-Quebec, s by ThreeRivers; Montreal-Frontenac, s by Ottawa; Frontenac-Huron, s by Muskoka & GeorgianB; LakeHuron-Petun; Detroit h, s by Michigan; "Nippissing counts toes".

English (Robert Fisher): DA Adirondack-Montreal, s by DA Champlain & A Chaudier A Oneida-Cayuga, s by A Pennsylvania; A Catskill s A Pennsylvania; DA NewEngland-Maine; A Maine-Acadia, s by F Louisbourg; DA NewYork-Philadelphia.

Iroquois (Vic Melucci): (Retreated Adir-IOnt); Gaspesie-Acadie (ann.); LakeOntario-Onondaga, s by Cayuga (latter ann.).

Ohio Tribes (Steve Cartier): LakeErie-Niagara, s by Seneca & Onondaga; FortPitt s Onondaga; Erie s Seneca; Miami s Erie; Ohio s Mingo; Mingo s FortPitt; Kaintuck s Delaware; Chesapeake-Philadelphia, s by Delaware; Virginia-Chesapeake, s by Allegheny.

Wendat (Robert Cheek): Huron s Petun (ann.); Neutrals & Petun s Niagara; Niagara s IRO LakeOntario-Onondaga.

Centres: Alg: Musk, Nipp, Algo, Sagu, RivN, TeNy, 3Riv, Mack, Pott, Ngan, Detr, Musk, Huro, Fron, Outa, Molt, Queb, Gasp (17). Remove 1 Hur, GeoB, StL due to freezeup; build 3 (3 short).

Eng: Phil, NYrk, Bost, NEng, Main, Chau, Loui (becomes a centre), Cham, Mont, Iroha, Onei, Huds, Cats, Penn + 2 offboard (16). Build 2; remove A Acad, A Cayu due to freezeup (2 short).

Iro: Gájú, Adir, Gájú (1) IOnt removed due to freezeup; no units, 1 short.

Qui: Miam, Ohio, Shaw, Erie, Ming, Sena, Onon, FtPt, Dela, Kain, Appa, Alle, Virg, Ches (14) Léri removed due to freezeup; build 1 (1 short).

Wen: Mif, Petu, Niag, Neut (3) No change. (I omitted Neut in carbon.)

An Algonkian-English joint victory is proposed; do both powers agree? (Oops; see below)

Winter 1654: Algonkians built in Algo, RivN, Pott. English built F Phil, A Bost; Ohio Tribes declined the build (2 short).

Spring 1655: TROOP TOTAL ELUDES ALGONKIANS! SMALL NATIONS UNTOUCHED!

Algonkians: Detroit h, s by Michigan; Pottawatomie-Lake Huron; Nippissing-GeorgianBay, s by Muskoka; Huron s Frontenac; Outouaia-Montreal, s by Frontenac & TroisRivières; Gaspesie-Acadie; Rivalord-GolfeStLaurent, s by TerreNeuve.

English (Robert Fisher): DA Montreal s A Chaudiere; A Chaudiere s DA Montreal; DA Champlain-Mohawk; A NewYork-Philadelphia, s by A Pennsylvania; A Catskill s A Pennsylvania; DA Maine s A Chaudiere; A Boston-Champlain; F Louisbourg-Acadie; F Philadelphia-Chesapeake.

Iroquois: No units.

Ohio Tribes: Onondaga-LakeOntario; FortPitt-Onondaga, s by Seneca; Delaware-FortPitt; Chesapeake-Delaware, s by Mingo, Kaintuck & Allegheny; Virginia-Chesapeake; Erie-LakeErie, s by Miami; Ohio-Erie.

Wendat: Petun s Niagara; Niagara s Petun; Neutrals unordered.

Fall orders are due Mon., Oct. 29. Note that a joint victory is not possible at this time, since the Algonquians have 14 units, while the other native powers total 15.

Fall press, held over:

Kaintuck: Chief Crazy Toe of the Ohio Tribes has announced his intention of seeking the appointment of the Governorship of New York, citing his insanity as being the only requirement for the job.

Game 1979Km (Sacred Rhino), Fall 1901 corrections: (reprinted from carbon copy mailing)

France (Bob Albrecht): a pic-lon, c by f eng; a spa-por. (Monc: Baboon-England (François Cuerrier): f nth-lon; a yor-wal; f nrg-nwy. Nyassa)

France thus does not gain bel, owns 4 centres, builds 1. Winter 1901:

Austria (Peggy Genignani): Removes a vie; has f adr, a boh. African ally: Boers.

England (François Cuerrier): Builds f lon; also has a wal, f nth, f nwy. African ally: Zanziber.

France (Bob Albrecht): Builds a par; also has a pic, a por, f eng. African ally: Monomotapa.

Germany (Robert Cheek): Builds a ber, a kie; also has a mun, a hol, f den. African ally: CABOS.

Italy (Dan MacLellan): Builds f nap, a tyr; also has a bud, a ven, f tun.

Russia (Vic Melucci): Has f lva, a pru, a ukr, f arm. African ally: Masai.

Turkey (Raynald Provost): Builds f smy, a con; also has a gre, f bulsc, a syr. African ally: Rotse.

It strikes me that the rules use both Louba and Baluba. Think I'll stick to the latter. On to the DA placements...

Baluba: DA Apu; Boers: DA Cly; CABOS: DA Bur; Masai: DA Gal; Monomotapa: DA Sil; Rotse: DA Alb; Zanzibar: DA Yor.

I can hear the shrieks from here, so I'd better go into the process in detail. The preference lists were: Baluba: tyr, gal, boh, alb, apu, syr; Boers: tyr (yes, that's all...); CABOS: ruh, bur, gas, pic, tyr, boh, tus; Masai: gal, fin, sil; Monomotapa: ruh, yor, sil, cly, gal, boh; Rotse: alb, gal, tyr, tus, and 10 more; Zanzibar: yor, gas, bur, fin, pic, sil, gal.

First round: Zanzibar, Masai and Rotse get their first choices; Boers and Baluba conflict; CABOS and Monomotapa conflict.

Second round: Boers have no second choice; Monomotapa second choice taken; CABOS get their second choice; Baluba choice taken.

Third round: Boers no choice; Monomotapa get their third choice; Baluba choice occupied.

Fourth round: Boers no choice; Baluba choice taken.

Fifth round: Boers no choice; Baluba get their fifth choice.

Sixth round: Boer destination chosen randomly from remainder of unoccupied non-centre spaces.
