Well, RUNESTONE is back in business once again. Not without problems: In addition to getting used to the vagaries and idiosyncrasies of a new machine, I'm also using different paper. Advantages: it's cheaper (good for me) and marginally lighter (lower postage costs, good for you). Disadvantages: it's harder to work with, prints through more easily (not having a glossy surface). Between the new machine and new paper, print quality last issue was not up to the standard I hope to regain (although vastly superior to the few previous issues).

You might have noticed that I screwed up the paging last issue. Too bad it happened that particular issue; when I print variants in the zine I try not to put rules, etc., on the back of maps. Makes the variant easier to use. You'll notice (if you've ever gotten a variant from me) that I always leave the backs of maps blank so that they can be easily put together to form a game board without the necessity of making copies.

New Boardmen Number Custodian: Shows how out of touch I've been: EVERYTHING #43 came out and was the first indication I've had that there's a new BNC. Also, for the first time since I've been around the hobby, it's someone with whom my dealings have been minimal: Lee A. Kendter, 4347 Benner St., Philadelphia, PA 19135, USA. However, Lee publishes a highly-regarded zine and is a highly-respected player, so I'd have to applaud the choice on the basis of my second-hand information, at least.

More serious matters. Lee mentions: "I do not have back issues of EVERYTHING, nor are the files prior to Bernie Agosta's custodianship in good order. Therefore, a lot of questions that have already been asked of me are unanswerable! Also, I cannot accept your copy of a game finish for this zine, I must have a xerox, or original, of the game in question. Many games are simply not being reported to the BNC, and I have very little control over this."

The latter is a deplorable situation. Any gamesmaster (including carbon copy GMs) who does not send copies of his issues to the BNC, drawing to his attention gamestarts and game completions, is behaving in a grossly irresponsible fashion. Get with it! Pass the word! Let's eliminate shoddiness in our hobby!

Corrections to Colonial Winter Variant:

-The "Oceans and Seas" map should be corrected in the Pacific region in conformity with the new spaces (133-139). Compare with the Oceania map.
 -Space numbers omitted: African map: sea space 66 (south of land space 64), land 80 (east of land 19), land 81 (east of land 80); Asian map: border between 2 and 3 omitted; sea space 102 bordering land 27 to 29; South America: sea 58 east of land 38, sea 59 south of land 40, sea 120 west of land 40, border between sea 46 and 52 goes from land 12 to 13; Oceania: sea 102 not labelled (see Asia above); North Polar: erase border between 105 and unnumbered square to the south; South Polar: erase border so that 134 extends northward between 67 and 68 to border 53; also the impassable areas marked with an "x" are not supply centres (Fred used "x" to indicate impassable areas, and I neglected to erase them).

-I did not label the continental maps, as they're pretty obvious to any person with a rudimentary knowledge of geography.

 My face is red. I neglected to mark this game on my calendar, so it's two weeks late. An important event, too...
