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# The Turkish Power Position in Diplomacy By Charles Green Part II: Strategic Approaches

This is the second installment in a short series analyzing the dynamics involved in playing Turkey. The first one articulated Turkish characteristics, which included a positional advantage in expansion and defense along with a flexible build strategy. Having dealt with these initial considerations, we can now examine the dynamics of the strategic approaches available to the Turks in the short-term continuing through to mid-game.

The most obvious route of expansion for Turkey is across the "land bridge" to Europe, going through Bulgaria then continuing into the Balkans. There are five centers within two moves of Turkish home centers - Bul, Gre, Ser, Rum, and Sev. In addition, a solid path of centers leads all the way to Vienna. Therefore, expansion in that direction offers the most possible rewards. Variations on this theme would direct Turkey either north (Rum & Sev) or west (Ser & Gre). We can now list the three possible paths of expansion:

- 1. Moving outward from Bul towards Vie. This necessitates conflict with Austria.
- 2. Moving northward from Bul to Rum-Sev with placement of the fleet in the Black Sea. This initiates war with Russia.
- 3. Moving westward from Bul to Gre with the fleet in the Aeg initially. This can lead to conflict with Austria, Italy, or neither, depending on the diplomatic situation and whether Ser is an objective or not.

Trying to do more than one of these in the first few years will lead to ruin, since that requires simultaneous conflict with two other major powers (the "two-front" syndrome). On the other hand, if by the mid-game Turkey is successful in achieving one of the above three goals, accomplishing one of the remaining two is quite probable. The selection of which path to follow, however, is based not only on geography but on the alliance structure that is operating in the region. Expansion directed in Austria's direction is not realistic without having either Russia or Italy as an ally. Similarly, the Turk will have his hands full if he attacks Russia while facing a hostile or even neutral Austria. Westward expansion in Italy's direction is possible without allies, but is unlikely to get beyond Greece without active Austrian aid or the appearance of France or England in the Mediterranean "back door."

Given this, if the Turkish player wishes to plan his own strategy, he must start out in Fall 1901 with active and directed diplomacy in support of his objectives, which should be spelled out as much as possible (though not necessarily to his opponents). If this does not succeed, it is probably prudent to make the best of the situation as is and pursue the strategy appropriate to the alliances that appear.

In the next installment, a closer analysis of the strategies and alliances will be presented with a view towards establishing what the "best" choice is for the Turkish player.



Jack McHugh (PA): I think the press should be permitted to do what it wants and we should draw our own lines. As for Somalia - I have no sympathy for the Department of Defense, when the DoD controls the news, it inevitably slants it for its own purposes. What the DoD considers a breach of security is so ridiculous that if it were up to the military we'd only now be finding out about WWII.

John Schultz (IN): I have problems with the term 'free' country but that discussion is for another time. To the extent this country is free, it's due in huge part to an aggressive press...unhindered by regulation. I admire them greatly. as brave and determined as any warrior. That said, they can be incredibly cruel and stupid...as any warrior. But no worse than they've ever been and better than they have been historically at Just visit some archives to see the truth of it. time the press readily and routinely called for the literal genocide of indigenous people. The 'free' press wrote, in solemn earnest, that Lincoln was a result of his mother's affair with a negro. Just to mention a couple. The press has always been a part of combat and I wouldn't want to see that change. I was appalled at Reagans stranglehold on the press during the Grenada 'training exercise'. That said, I was also appalled (to put it mildly) at the press' handling of the beach landing in Somalia. As I believe I mentioned to you before, Andy, if Marines had died in that landing I believe the press would have been guilty of premeditated The press should use reason in those situations. government should call for reason and work something out with the press, rather than use such incidents to garner political leverage for the purpose of shackling the press.

Russell Wallace (W Lynn, MA): Now you really hit a topic I'm interested in. What's wrong with the media? The disgraceful showing of the media in Somalia and the destructive gossip about people's private lives area really 2 separate issues. Gossip sells papers to the ignorant. It just shows that money is more important than people and it is just one symptom out of many which are indicative of the moral decline of Western Civilization. But the other issue, ie Somalia. Getting the "scoop" is important. Since all the news organizations are present, or try to be present at major events, how do they get the "scoop" or the "real" inside story? Sometimes it flat has to be staged, such as the fiasco concerning GM and NBC. (If I need to explain this recent event,

you don't follow the news so what difference would it make.) Or, if the major stations aren't faking the news, they are trying to predict the future. Time magazine made Bill Clinton Man of the Year. Boy, figure that one out will you. He won an election, Big Deal. He still hadn't done anything. He's the liberals "Great White Hope." So they made him Man of the Year to get a "scoop". Who else would pick Clinton? They wanted to be prophetic. It is no longer enough to instantly report the news of the day, in order to beat the competition they have to accurately predict the future. So yes, I agree the media is out of control and has gone too far.

Me?: I guess my phrasing of the question gives you how I feel about the press in general. I completely agree that a free press is necessary, and imperative, in a democratic society. On the other side of the coin, the press must act in a responsible manner. Sensationalistic stories that only serve to sell papers or draw viewers only hurts the image of the press. The incident Russ mentions about GM/NBC only reinforces this point. With revelations such as these, the credibility of the press is questioned - thus diminishing their ability to perform their role in our society. True investigative reporting (ala Woodward and Bernstein) is what the press should be doing; not digging in the trash to discover which starlet is sleeping with the producer or creating their own version of reality by staging their own story.
