## PRESS

VATICAN CITY, ROME (API) The Pope today denounced Turkish aggression and called upon the leaders of all Christian nations to thwart the Sultan's designs on the European continent. "At a time when we are again threatened with Muslim domination, we should stand united and cease quarelling amongst ourselves," His Holiness remarked.

TURKEY accepts the Serbian invitation to liberate it from the oppression of the Austro-Hungarian infidels. Serbia, like Bulgaria, was part of the Ottoman empire for almost 500 years (from the first battle of Kossovo in 1389 until the Treaty of Berlin in 1878). We shall not soon part with it again.

Turkey and Russia hope Austria-Hungary enjoys its just dessert, following a transparent attempt to interupt (sic) our fruitful conversation at the banquet table.

Geneva (Reuters) — Representatives of Austria-Hungary and Italy today publicly announced a treaty of mutual defense. Accordingly, any nation which violates the borders of one nation shall be considered to have also attacked the other. During an informal question—and—answer session, the Italian ambassador said that "Although some world leaders may have felt our nations would be easily conquered, they shall soon see that this is not the case." The Austrian representative, Antonio Harrisburg hailed the breakthrough pact as "the first step towards stemming the aggressions of those who cannot live peacefully in this world within their own borders."

Helsinki (Reuters) -- In a speech to the House of Lords, the English Prime Minister last week announced that in the coming world conflict, the seas shall belong to the English Navy and to no others. "The High Seas Fleet shall, as always, be the strong arm of the mighty No other nation shall be able to stand against us. brave sailors sally forth to the east, we build still more fleets with which to crush any navies who are foolish enough to venture into the We shall make an example of the Czar and his measly ships all to heed. The Kaiser, I suspect, has been thinking of challanging He would be wise to exercise restraint. (sic) us. We shall, for time being, tolerate small fleets in that area east of the Baltic Sea. But not for long. Soon, all the worlds (sic) oceans will solely to the great British Empire!" His stirring speech lasted than an hour. By the end, the normally reserved Lords were standing and cheering the Prime Minister and his words. Since then, the entire nation has rallied around the cause and all eyes turn towards the High Seas fever has struck England with the force of a winters (sic) gale.
