Following Spring 1901 moves, Russia retreated a Gal-War. The French fleet must retreat to Mid, Gas, or otb. The Russia army War must retreat to Pru, Liv, Mos, or otb. The Russian fleet Sev had to be taken off the board per the rules. Underline moves fail and capital letters show unit postions. The Winter 1902 builds and removals are due by IMMEDIATE RETURN MAIL so they arrive by 9:00PM on October 19. Spring 1903 orders will be due at 9:00 PM on Friday, November 2. The supply center chart is shown below:

1. The 1976 Diplomacy rules are used except as follows.
2. The game begins in Spring 1939. Player countries and initial units are as follows:
FRANCE: F Brest, A Paris, A Marseilles, A North Africa
ENGLAND: F London, F Edinburgh, A Liverpool, A Egypt
GERMANY: F Kiel, A Berlin, A Prussia, A Munich
ITALY: F Naples, A Rome, A Venice, A Libya
RUSSIA: F Lenigard, F Sevastople, A Moscow, A Urals
3. Finland, Poland, Romania, Spain, Sweden, Turkey, and Yugoslavia are occupied by an army in civil disorder. This army represents that countries armed forces.
4. Kiel, Denmark, and Constantinople act as Kiel, Denmark, and Constantinople, respectively, in standard Diplomacy for movement purposes.
5. Spain and Morocco, Silcey and Naples these four spaces act as Land brigdes for movement of armies and fleets.
6. The northern portion of lenigard becomes a new province, Archangel. This contains a special Build center (not a supply center) for Russia: If Russia still owns Lenigard, and she is otherwise entitled to a build, she may build a unit in Archangel.
7. A High Ocean Box is added at the SW edge of the board. It borders 3 bodies of water, as indicated by the arrows on the map. Any number of fleets may be in the HOB at any one time, so that fleets in the HOB may not be attacked and dislodged.
8. Spain and Finland both have a North and South coast.
9. Western Med Borders on Mid Alantic and South Alantic, and Visa Versa.
10. The total amount of supply centers are 38. The victory criterion for 1939 is 20 supply centers.

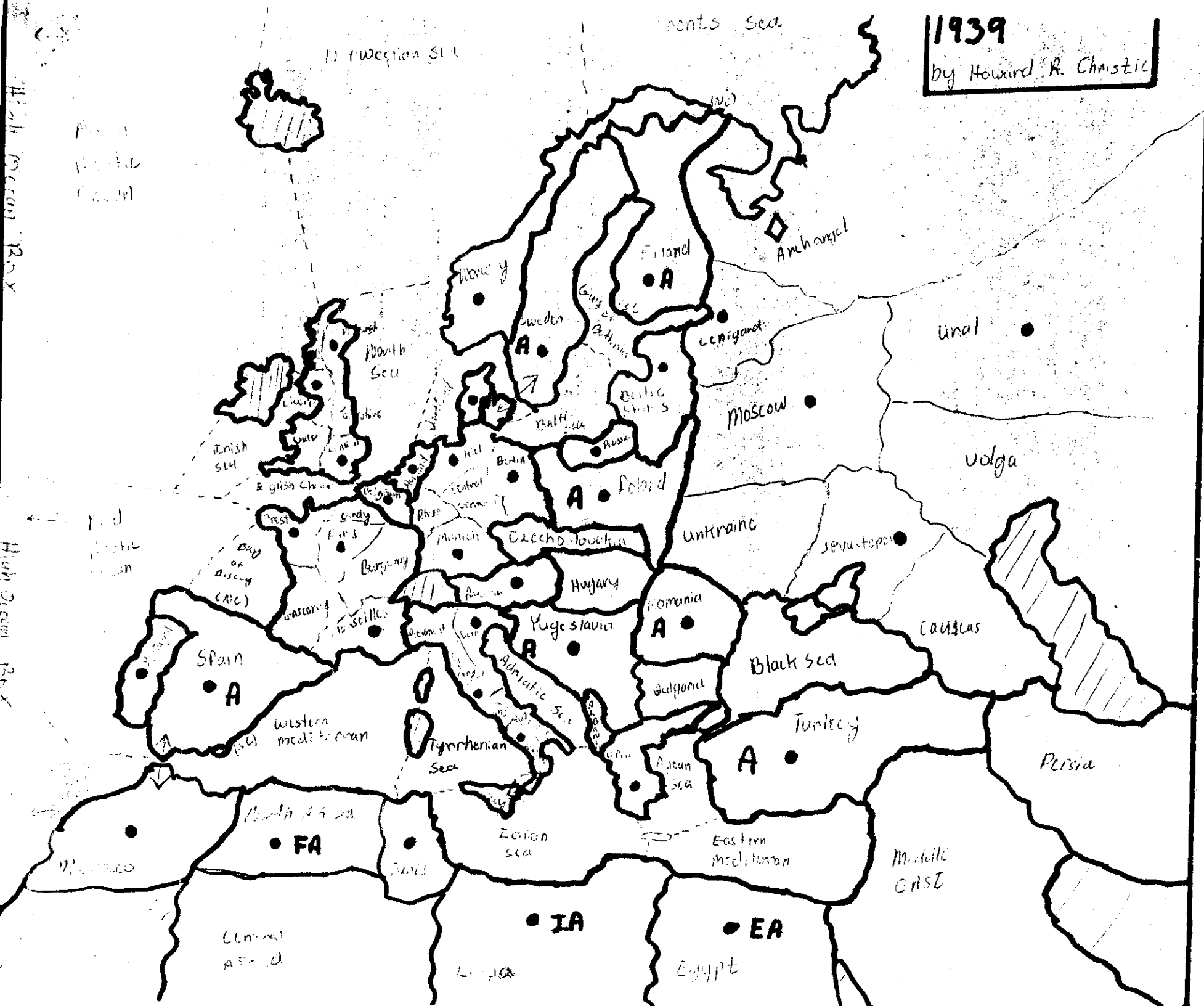
 = crossing arrows

● = supply centers

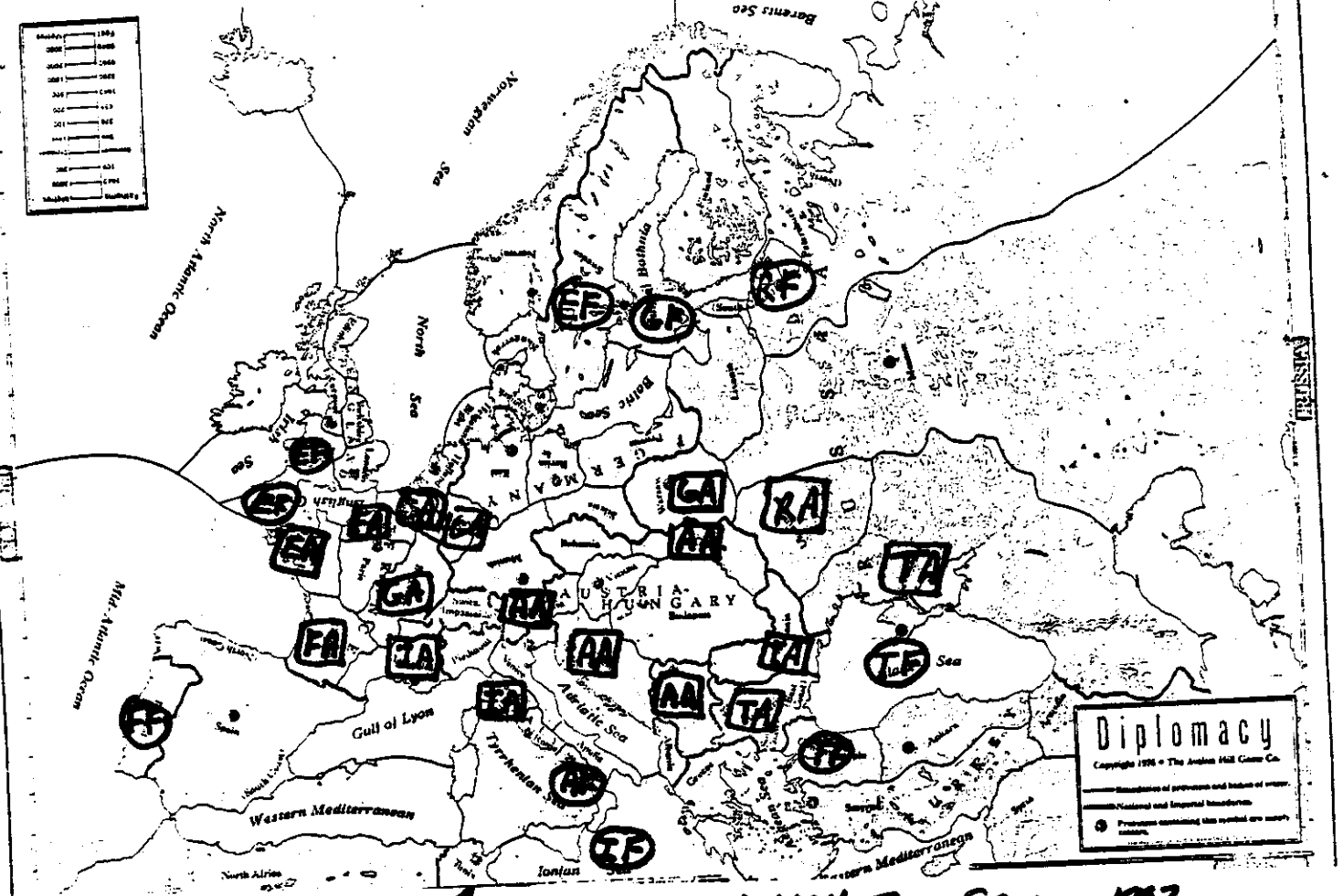
◇ = special build center

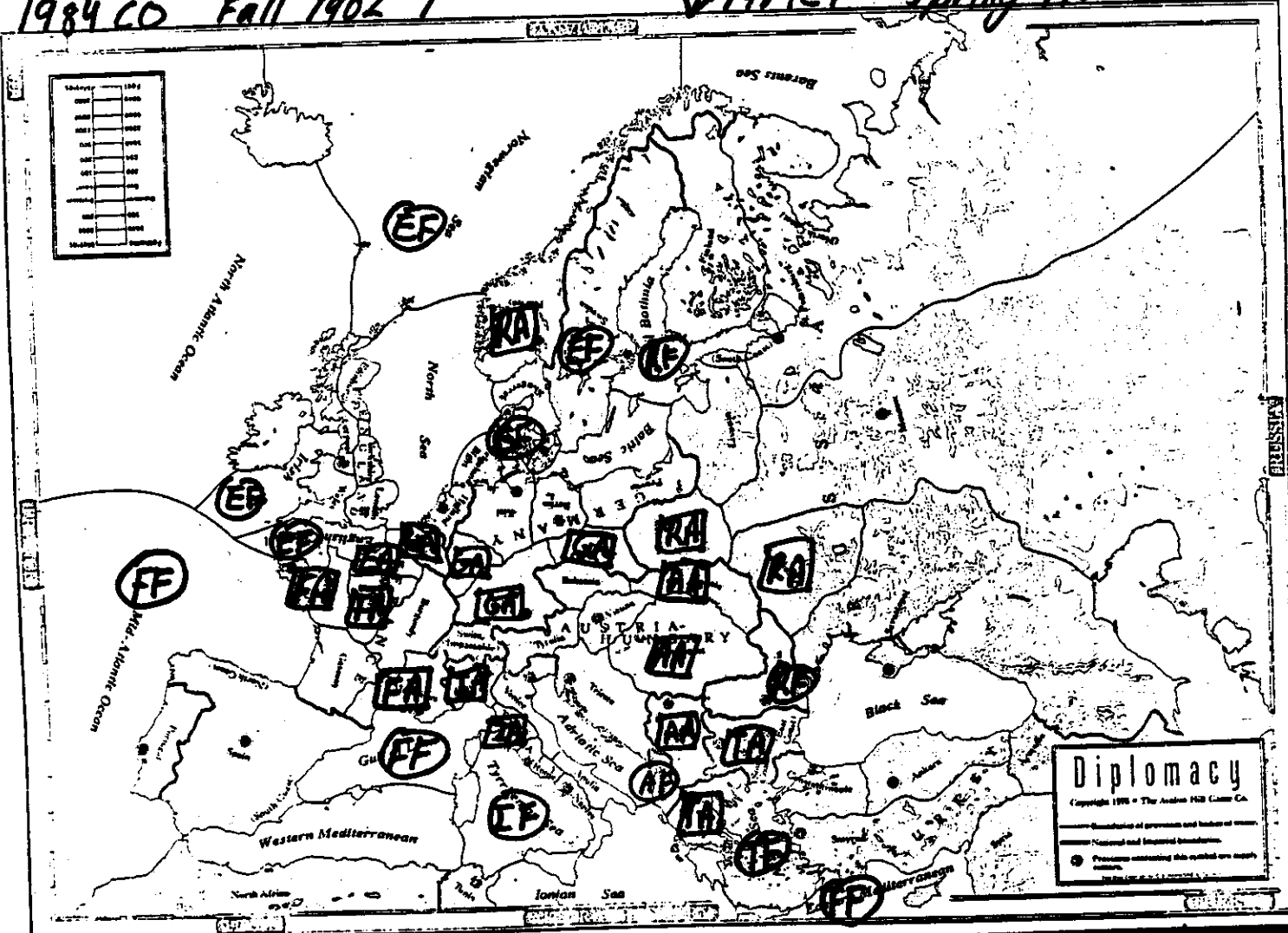
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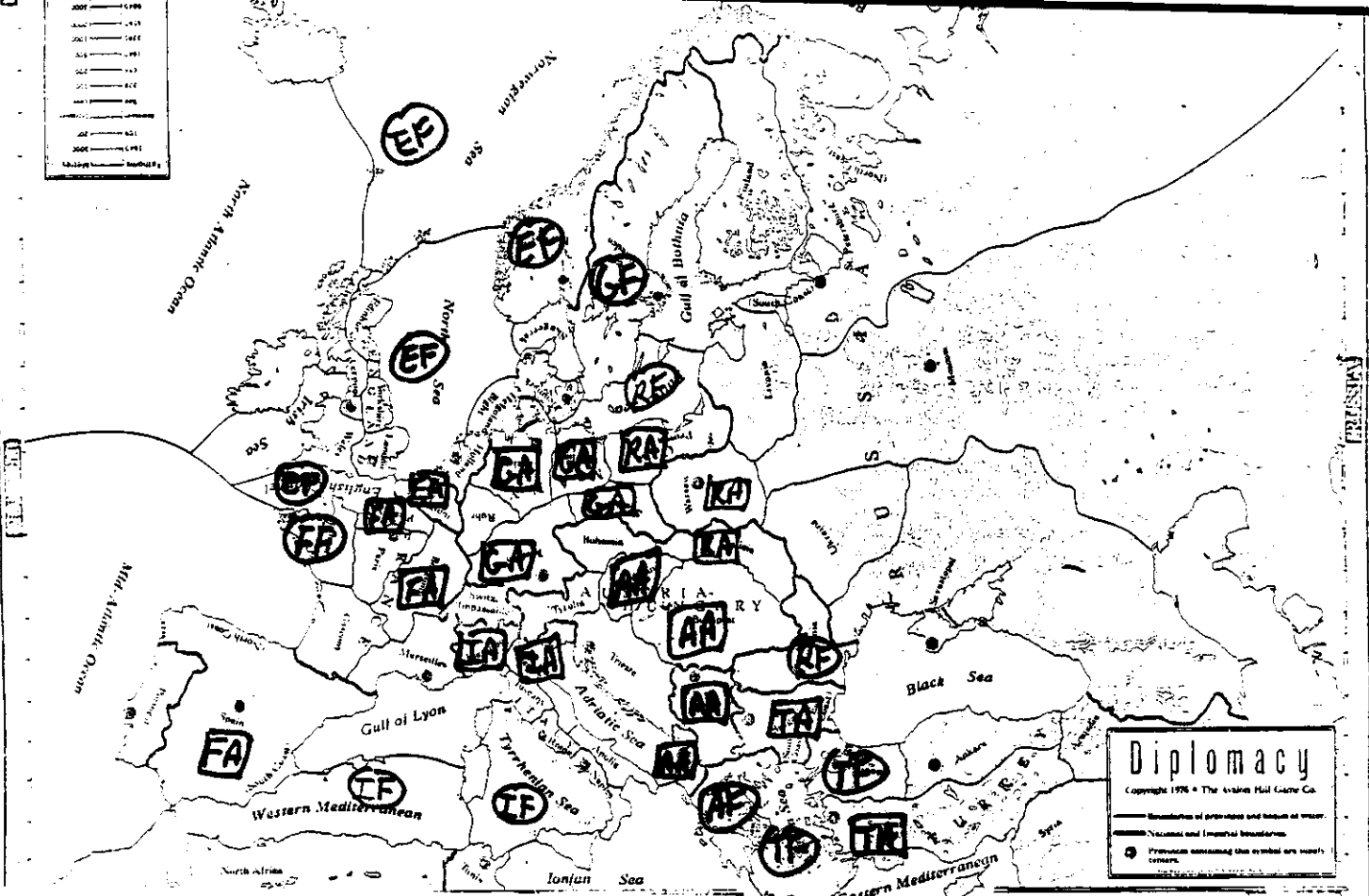


1984 CO Fall 1902 ↑
