THE PRESS:

BUCHAREST (Feb 19, 1902) : Tensions remain high in this small and now isolated country as "The Great Siege" continues. Rumania has been surrounded by the three major powers of eastern Europe for close to nine months, and military observers here are amazed that the tiny native forces have held out so long. Some military strategists blame a lack of cooperation between Austria, Russia, and Turkey for the protraction of the conflict, while others admire the Rumanian army and its perfection of a new battlefield tactic. This tactic, known as the "duck and burrow" technique, causes ones opponent to fire over the defender's position and create casualties on another enemy force on the opposite side of the perimeter. The use of this tactic not only prevents friendly losses but also conserves ammunition.

"The Great Siege" has caused a halt to the long civilwar in this country, which has raged for 50 years over the proper spelling of the country's name. The Romanian guerillas have left their mountain hiding places in great numbers in order to join the

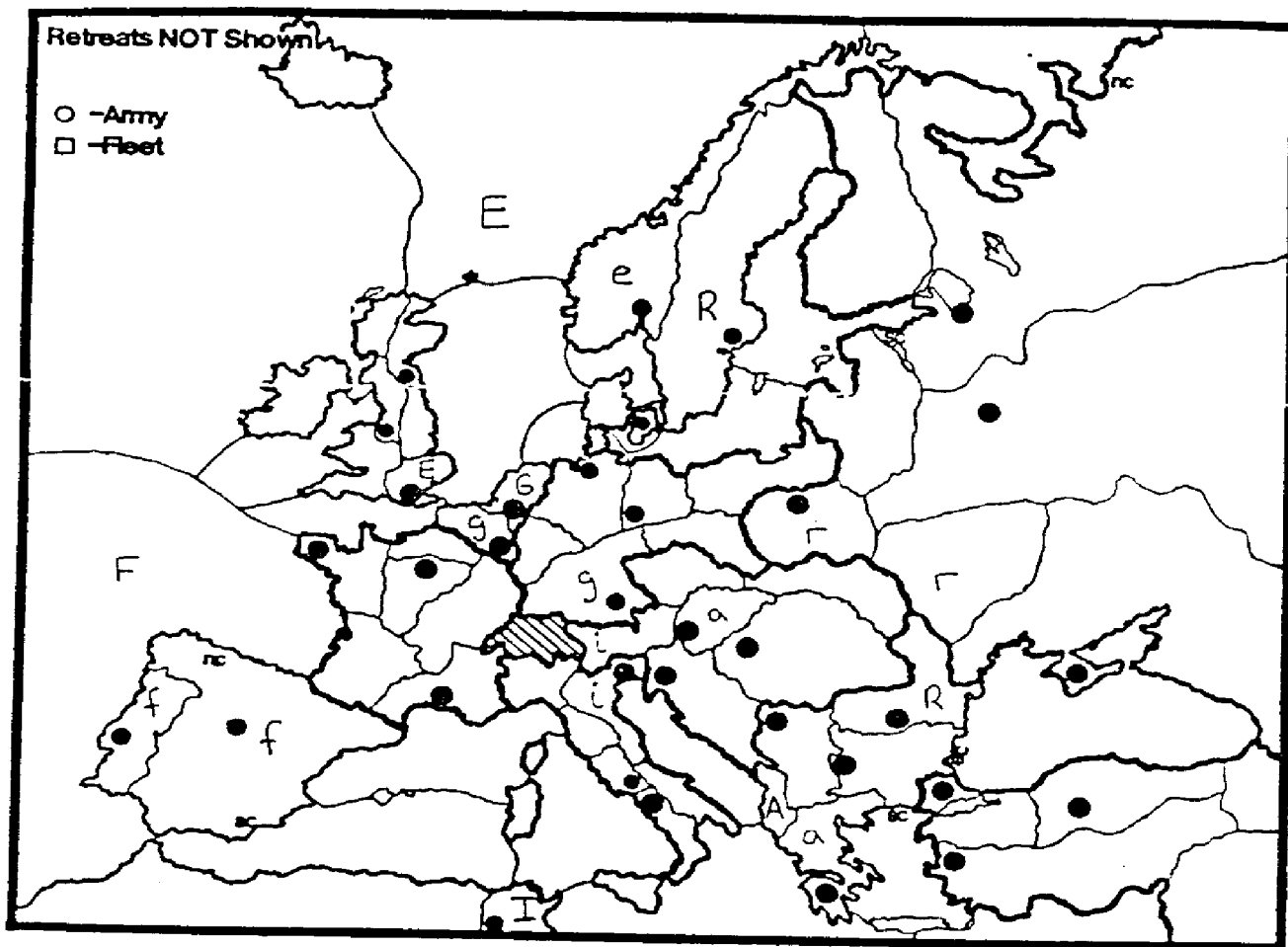
THE PRESS:

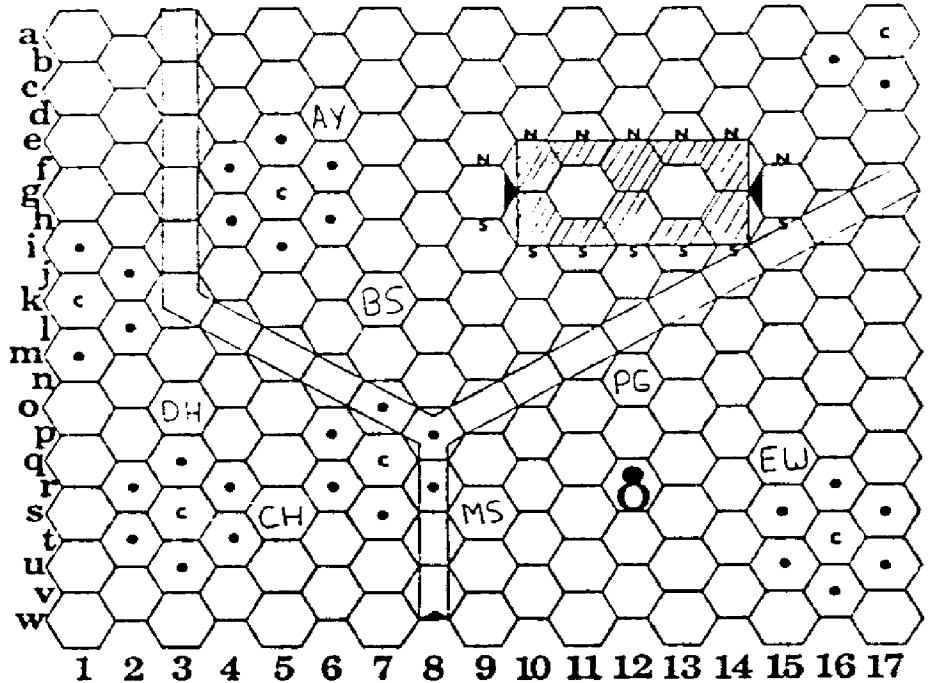
Most of the optional rules will not be used, however, the one optional attack, the "Hise Hammer" will be allowed. So crank it up guys.



Actual Handwritten Correspondence To You (maybe)

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT

Been There, Done That is a Diplomacy subzine to both Mark Lilleheht's The Scribblerist in hard copy and distributed through the U.S.P.S., and Ken Hill's The Armchair Diplomat in electronic format and distributed via download from Data Library 5 of the Gamer's Forum on the Compuserve Information Network. Players, standers by, a few traders, and anyone else whom the fancy strikes me will also receive it through the mail. Diplomacy is owned by the Avalon Hill Game Co., and was invented by Alan Calhamer. But you already knew that, didn't you?

Hello. Welcome to the second issue. I'm losing it. This has not been my week, or two for that matter. Ever since returning from our vacation through the southeast in the end of October through early November, through Mark's territory for that matter, the Blue Ridge Mountains, Shenandoah Valley, down through N. Carolina to Charleston S.C. (a thoroughly charming city), and back along the coast, through Myrtle Beach and the Outer Banks, ending up in Williamsburg for a day on perhaps the loveliest late Autumn day in my memory... it's all been down hill. A small example but typical: I experienced my first NMR in almost 3 years of PBM and PBEM Diplomacy. Checking with the GM, my orders got there alright, 2 days late but postmarked a full week before the deadline. This was in BOAST, and effected 3 games. In one, I was a 9 center Germany in 1904. Then Thursday, it got worse. I was flying to Columbus to teach a day-long workshop. First, I brought the wrong ticket with me to the airport. Then, as there was only one ticket agent on duty, I missed my plane. So I got a different flight connecting through Pittsburgh. Unfortunately, my connecting flight had a flat tire on the runway in Boston, so I laid over for 2 1/2 hours in the Pittsburgh airport. It's just been like that recently. I need another vacation.

Mike Morris was the only reader to explicitly identify the name of BT,DT's first game - Choo Choo Coleman. Not only that, but knew his 1962 batting average. If you don't remember Choo Choo, maybe you'll recognize the name of BT,DT's second game - "Elio Chacon."

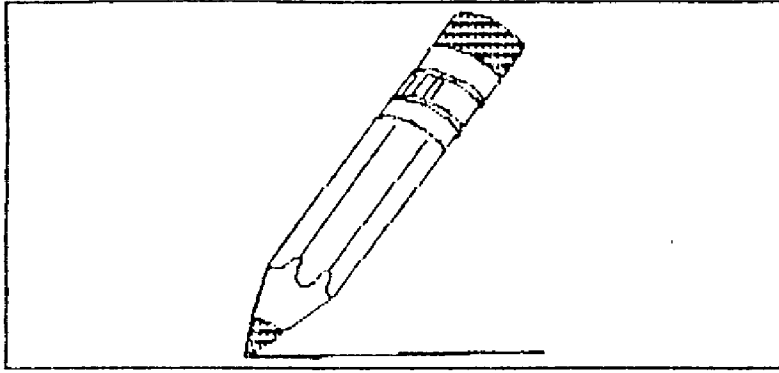
What alliance structure do you pursue and why?

Being so new to the hobby itself (dare we say.... novice?), I agree that the feuding going on in the hobby is entertaining, intriguing, gives an albeit colored view on the history of the hobby, and is fun as hell to watch. But with so little info on how it all started, I'm really lost as to

who did what to whom. I guess what I'm trying to say is that you could probably do a retrospective of the highlights (tongue in cheek) much the way your Dipdom Tattler is. It would make great reading!

Hindu cooking? what is it? With all the different house rules, how do you send out your orders (at staggered deadline times) correctly? I'd like to know what makes a hobbyist tick. Care to help me out?"

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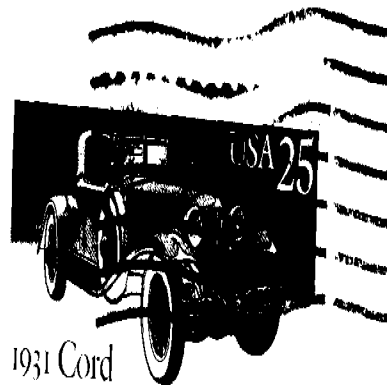
