THE NEW DIPLOMACY ORGANIZATION

Well, at last, the new organization for the Diplomacy player is taking shape. Received just the other day was the Proposed Interim Constitution for this organization (which is unnamed, but referred to as DipOrg) and I and many other publishers have been asked to publicize and comment on it.

Why the need for a Diplomacy organization to serve the player? And what happened to the old one? Let's jump back about 9 months or so to March of 1971. The original idea of a player oriented Diplomacy organization was first established in March into a firm organization by a small group of New York City friends under the leadership of Ed Birsen. After Birsen's resignation of the seemingly organized Diplomacy Association (as it was called), the organization fell into the hands of John Beshara. About July of this year, this Diplomacy organization began to teeter as internal and external forces collapsed on an irascible and irresponsible Beshara. Because of his inability to fulfill the earlier promises made by TDA (the Diplomacy Association) and his conflicts with almost everyone else, a movement was launched by Larry Peery and Walt Buchanan to either take Beshara out of power as head of TDA or to get Beshara to change his ways. Since that time (August), many things happened, all unsuccessful except for the beginning of this new organization. Oh yes, the original TDA is still around with Beshara as head, but it is not widely accepted; I have no time to go into this further.

Well, the man most responsible for getting this new organization off the ground is Bob Johnson (Box 134, Whippany, NJ 07981). He has constructed the interim constitution and will head this new organization until elections are held. Basically, this new org will be much like TDA as it will be doing the same things, but it will have free elections, no secrecy (hopefully), and will have a more diverse power structure. Almost anyone that knows of Diplomacy can join, and the dues are much the same as in TDA. There will be an Executive Council to take care of the operation of the organization, such as the the Board of Directors for TDA. In addition, there will be a President, one or more regional secretaries, but not necessarily. This organization will have a written, defined constitution, something that TDA has not. A complete constitution is promised by 1972 to replace the interim one.

Because of the space limitations in this issue, I can't go into a whole lot of detail. There will be more about this further in the next issue. Meanwhile, I would like to here any initial reactions to this new organization or anything you may wish to say about the old one.
