

There is a Turkish Army Galicia (as stated in sTab #12) which is unordered, and holds. The Turkish attack on the Ionian fails because of the equally supported attack on the Ionian by the French Fleet Tyrrhenian.

Turkey.

LIVERPOOL (Reuters) The following are on-the-record comments by the GOC of the III Italian Army which recently landed in England; as interviewed today: ... Did I have any problems getting here? No, of course not... although the mutiny did cause some concern. No, not in the Austrian fleet -- in my army. You see, we have a peculiar disease in my forces that seems to affect no other nation. No, its not syph, everybody has got that, but my men also come down with lethargy.

How was the landing proper? Fine, although I must admit two kids with peashooters held us up for two hours. The troops were so seasick it was a miracle they could even stand when they got ashore, let alone fight. No, it's not true they laid most of the day on the beach barfing their guts out.

Was there any opposition? Not really. What we took to be a heavy English artillery barrage turned out to be a so-called musical

group playing what my Intelligence Starf calls the Mersey Sound. Yes, it's true we've had some conflict with the civilians. how were my poor fellows to know that in England short hair and jeans means girls, while long hair and tights means guys? It's terribly confusing and the local police have arrested a whole battallian for indecent assault...

The general military situation today? Well... it could be worse. The cavalry patrols I've pushed inland have disappeared. Someone has told me they're out chasing foxes. We've also lost a number of men to guerilla actions by what we take to be political extremists --Mods and Rockers. And for a while some joker named Artos the Bear was running around on a white Ajax charger making a nuisance of himself and scaring my men. We finally caught him in an open manhole and put him back in the zoo where bears belong.

The weather? Well, I would like to see the sun again. When its not raining its snowing. Although the latter is rather fun. Every day we take a little tramp through the snows... even the

tramp enjoys these little outings.

Any particular complaints? Well, one... As you may note from the water falling on your head, the roof leaks. What's so infuriating is that the local workers say they're on strike and can't fix it. They even picket my HQ and in consequence my own engineers won't cross the picket lines. They keep jabbering to me about proletarian solidarity and saying things like "I'm all right, Gino, you do it!" I'd shoot them if I had enough men for a firing squad, but everybody seems to be out liberating pubs...

(As the general began to cry at this point we decently cut the

interview short.)

LVOV (8 Sept. 1904) With the collapse of the Russian government in Moscow, control of the remnants of the Russian Empire was seized today by the Naked Union of Doukhobor Enlightenment (NUDE). A NUDE cabinet, seated in unclad dignity in Lvov, today assumed direction of the remaining Russian armed forces.

"Our first order to the armed forces," announced the new Chief of State, Patriarch Wrapsoff, "will be to follow the Doukhobor example and take off all their clothes. If the other armies of Europe follow this pious and salutary example, it will be impossible to distinguish friend from foe, and the war will be over."

SPITZBERGEN (27 Sept. 1904) The Russian Arctic fleet today declared itself in a state of mutiny against the anti-clothing order of the NUDE government in Lvov. From Admiral Frozenoff down to the lowliest tar, every man in the fleet opposes this measure. "Peace be damned," said one spokesman of the mutineers, "if we take off our uniforms, we'll be frozen solid long before the war is over.

The admiral announced his intention of disbanding the fleet if it is unable to secure a harbor in English-occupied Norway this fall. "English prison clothes are warmer than the new government's 'uni-

forms, " he explained.

The following is a two-man game played under my Gamesmastership by Robert Lake of Scarborough and Kim Pattee of the YUDC, between No-vember 1965 and May 1966. It is a small corner of the never ceasing warfare between Scarborough and Youngstown, which continues as a mass of two-man struggles and occasionally erupts into a motorcycle foray by the Canadians deep into YUDC territory, or a frontal assault by the Youngstown forces, with John Smythe leading the way atop his mighty Chrysler.
