


VIENNA (31 December 1904) On this New Year's Eve the Konditoreion and cafes around the Ring are bright with light, as the Russian army manages to celebrate New Year's Eve despite another year of military reversals. In fact, the celebrations were expressly endorsed by the new government, the Hedonist Union Group (HUG). In a surprise coup last night, the HUG overthrew the Doukhober theocracy, aided by a sudden cold snap which caused the

Doukhober theocracy, aided by a sudden cold snap which caused the army to rise against the Doukhober policy of compulsory nudity.

To judge from the interiors of these cafes, the Doukhober advocacy of nudity is not entirely rejected by the Russians now celebrating the beginning of what is likely to be their country's last year of independence. Unclad girls, pursued by equally unencumbered soldiers, are seen affirming their belief in the policies of the new government.

NARVIK, NORWAY (8 January 1905) "Dammit, we surrendered too scon!"

Such were the words of Admiral
Frozenoff, former commander of the Arctic Fleet, when in an English
prison camp he heard of the HUG coup in Vienna. "We surrendered to
the English last fall, rather than obey the Doukheber order to take
off our clothes. Now that we're interned we find that the Hedonists
have taken over what's left of the Russian Empire. If we'd stood
out, we would now be under orders to improve Russian-Eskimo relations
by means conformable to both Eskimo custom and HUG policy."

KRAKOW (31 March 1905) In a lightning coup, command of the remaining Russian forces was seized today by General Stanislaw Woronowsky, commander of the Army of Warsaw. The coup apparently represents an uprising by non-Russian elements in the army against the Russian leadership. General Woronowsky lent credence to this rumor by proclaiming himself a direct descendant of Matthias Corvinus, a 15th-century King of Hungary and Bohemia. The Russian armies, quartered for the last two years on Polish and other Slavic territories, have recruited locally to fill up the ranks, and now include men from all the nationalities to be found in western Russia and Austria-Hungary. The new Russian chief of State is familiarly called "Old Crow," by his men, and also claims to be related to the Bourbons.

WARSAW (9 April 1905) Since the collapse of Russian forces, Polish nationalism has been rearing its head again in this ancient Polish capital. Today the population hailed with rejoicing the announcement by General Woronowsky, new Russian chief of State, that the Russian Empire would be reconstituted as a federation of nationalities. Jubilation was tempered only by a few sober reflections on how long this federation would last after the

English and the Turks moved in. However, General Woronowsky met this problem by releasing several hundred barrels of vodka to the populace, making sober reflections about anything extremely difficult. The vodka is believed to come from the warehouses of one Andrzei Sawiczewsky, who received from Woronowsky the title of Provisional President of the Polish Republic of the Russian Federation.

KIEL (3 May 1913) Originally, May Day was a European spring festival whose origins dated back to pagan times.
Then, during the German Empire, it was a day for marches and demonstrations by the labor movement and Socialists -- frequently met with gunfire from Hohenzollern police. But none of those street riots were as spectacular as the recent inconclusive battle between

the English and the Turks.

It began on 27 April, when the Turkish Third Army, which has been immured in Berlin for six years, struck out westward into the unoccupied territories now under the ineffective rule of a British Military Governor named Orts. They there encountered advanced units of the English Third Army, which has been based in the Ruhr for an equal length of time. An inconclusive action was fought near Hanever, and the fighting drifted northward to Kiel during the next five days. Finally both sides withdrew to their original positions, and Orts and the other inhabitants of Kiel, German and British, came out from their cellars.

Despite the British failure to relieve the minuscule Kiel garrison, Orts is much encouraged by the resolution with which the Earl of Thompson's administration has met England's desperate plight. "Damme, this Thompson chap's just the ticket!" Orts told your reporter over a brandy-snifter filled with schnapps. "Wogs in Liverpool—what's England come to!"

Asked about whether he expected any further military activity in the Kiel district, Orts hiccoughed and replied, "Deuced right! While we sit 'ere drinkin', I've got two labor batallions of Jerries buildin' stockades for the wogs in Denmark. We expect to take that

whole army prisoner this autumn."

Orts is probably right. The overextended Italian First Army, presently in Denmark, is facing overwhelming English force, and the

army in Ruhr is prepared to cut off their retreat.

But, even with this victory, England's position against the Austro-Italian Alliance of Desperation is serious. Even the miserable band of stockade commandoes, sheriffs' volunteers, and 40-year-old reservists which constitutes the Military Governor's garrison may be sent to the front by Thompson. England stands at the eleventh hour; whether Thompson can save her from the malaise and misgovernment of the previous ministry is doubtful.

Readers should be aware that Mr. Water's despatch above was eriginally intended for \underline{sTab} #15, but was mislaid. Any dating is therefore the fault of the editor, and not of our ubiquitous correspondent.

MUNICH (DWE) In the tenth year of its life the dual alliance of England and France came to a dramatic close and the numerically superior English armies fell upon the French force garrisoned in the city and destroyed it entirely. The English soldiers, grim in their battle-dress, roamed the streets killing Frenchmen on sight. The French force, too long inactive, will ill prepared to such a move, and most of its members were slaughtered in their bods.

The southern movement of British fleets bodes ill for the French Republic, since its fleet is entangled with the Turks off Italy and Greece, and cannot possible return to its homeland for more than a year. The only French force in France, actually, is the Army Burgundy, and even at top speed it cannot prevent the fleet new in the English Channel from taking Brest this fall.

Things look black for everyone... except England, or course.
