ABOARD THE AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN THIRD FLEET IN STOCKHOLM HARBOR (25 June 1915)

Ever since the first invading armies relled into Scandinavia 14 years ago, the traditional celebrations of Midsummer Night have been overwhelmed by the sounds of gunfire. Now, however, with victory in sight for the forces of the Holy Roman Austro-Hungarian Empire, the people of Sweden are beginning to recover something of their traditional good nature and hospitality. Chief beneficiaries of this policy are the officers and men of the Austro-Hungarian forces now in occupation of all the Scandinavian nations except Denmark. Assured of autonomy within the European Empire which is the Habsburgs' postwar aim, they have accepted the soldiers and sailors of the Dual Monarchy as their protectors against any further invasions from abroad.

COPENHAGEN (1 August 1915) My recent passage from Stockholm to Copenhagen is, as so many of my border crossings have been during the war, a passage between two different worlds. From the sublime Austro-Hungarian confidence in victory I have gone, via a Japanese freighter, to the capital of English-occupied Denmark.

Here all is gloom and confusion. The Second Fleet, in occupation of Denmark, is relatively intact, but the Fourth Fleet has just been expelled from Kiel by an Austro-Hungarian effensive and has suffered severe losses. It is not even yet sure in which direction the Fourth Fleet has retreated, if it was indeed able to make good its escape. Admiral Musgrave, in command of the Second Fleet since the recent suicide of Admiral Lord FitzBulmer, is said to have confidence that the two fleets can hold off Austro-Hungarian attacks for the remainder of the present year, but to have no hopes for future campaigns. All other British forces have been called home to take part in the final battle for control of the British Isles.

Without bothering to find out whither Admiral Lord Rokosle has taken the Fourth Fleet, Francis Orts, British military governor of Kiel, has arrived in Copenhagen after a precipitate flight from the Austro-Hungarians. Orts was a remittance man in Tonga before the war, and is rumoured to have advanced to his present position only through a wrong-side-of-the-blanket relationship with Lord Rokesle. As usual, Orts was hopelessly drunk; he arrived in a confiscated horse-drawn fire wagon driven by a sluttish blonde and carrying three more such as cargo.

His flight into the city, which left a trail of empty schnapps bottles, only furthered lowered the morale of the English marines in the local garrison. In particular, sailors and marines of Irish ancestry are now shewing open sympathy with the Austro-Hungarians, probably won over by Dual Monarchy promises of autonomy for a united Ireland within a Habsburg-ruled Empire of Europe.

PARIS France declares "total war" against Turkey!

VIENNA (31 December 1906) Ever since the Hedonist Union Group (HUG) took over the government of the Russian Empire, now making its last stand in the gay old city of Vienna, the famous old St. Stephen's Cathedral has been ordained as a Temple of Hedon, the deity of the Hedonists. Today General Count Oblowoff, commander-in-chief of the remaining Russian army, led a group of HUG dignitaries into the Temple for a New Year's Eve Thanksgiving service.

To a temple packed with Russian soldiers and Viennese girls, the Hedonist Patriarch Donakhev (formerly Count Oblowoff's personal chaplain) said: "Though armies have fallen, and fleets been scuttled, all across Europe, Hedon has preserved us here in Vienna for another year. Let the Hungarians or the Germans seek military glory, and perish thereby; we faithful Hedonists seek only life and pleasure. Particularly worthy is the contrast between the Russian worship of Hedon and the recent French action in establishing Mars as the only true God of the French state. Military victory has eluded the forces of Russia, showing us its true worthlessness, for from sour grapes only sour wine can be made."

"You said it, Patriarch old boy!" Oblowoff interrupted, as the cork of another magnum of Burgenland champagne flew towards the

ceiling of the Temple.

"But; pursuing the phantom of military glory," the Patriarch continued, "the First Consul of France has declared war to be the supreme good and only end of mankind. From his embattled frontiers in the Bavarian and Maritime Alps, to the poor Asians who toil and die under his lash in distant Indo-China, the ruler of France has pledged his troth to death, hatred, war, and desolation. Yet, as he strives towards a phantom victory, his forces are stalemated in the Mediterranean by the numerically inferior Italians, and his coastal provinces lie open to the inroads of the English. Let France beware! For with Hedon's help we will celebrate many more

New Year's Evos in Vienna when Italian cavalry is stabled in Fon-

tainebleau, and English floots sail up the Scine!"

At this point, apparently feeling that the sermon had become overly long, Count Oblowoff brought it to an end by the simple expedient of throwing a creamy Viennese pastry into the Patriarch's face. This was the signal for the beginning of a New Year's Eve party which all Vienna confidently expects to last well into February.

DUPCON GAMIF

This game was played across the board at the Diplomacy Convention held in Youngstown prior to the Tricon. Played on 31 August 1966 under the Gamesmastership of Dan Alderson, the game was unique in one respect: Each player kept notes, passed to the Gamesmaster and sealed unread into an envelope, on what his relations with, intentions toward, and fears about each of his neighbors. Therefore, during the "Spring 1901" orders, you will find each player's notations concerning the others. Thereafter, a player made a notation only when some new factor -- such as a change of heart on his or on his neighbor's part occurred -- entered into the relationship. The game was played only through 1906, but I think it effers a fascinating insight into the patterns of alliance that develop during a game, and if carried out in other games offers promise of developing some interesting theories of motivation in Diplomacy play.

I would only add that attempting to read an opponent's notes was considered not only completely bad taste, but a violation of all

rules of play.
