


The situation around Vienna is complex, and may need elucidation for players new to my methods. There is an obvious standoff in Vienna, since the French attack with one German support, and the Turkish Army Galicia attacks with the support of Budapest. This does not affect the Army Vienna. However, since the Army Galicia is moving, it can have no support in Galicia itself, and thus the German attack from Silesia, supported by Warsaw, succeeds.


