
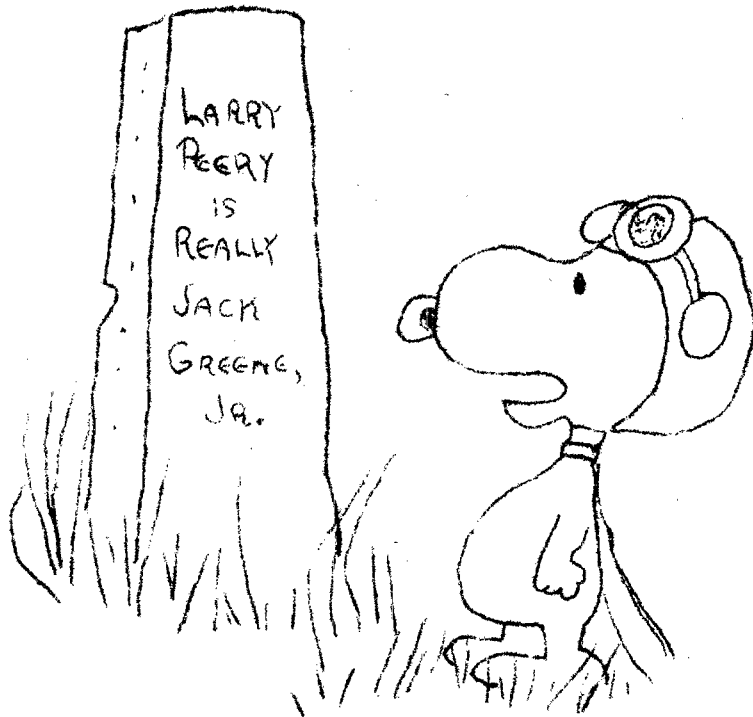

ST. PEERIGRAD Dr. Peter H. Olmes, current lecturer from the William Lawrence Memorial Chair in International Relations at the University of St. Peerigrad, today announced that he had accepted the position of Provost of Ryerson College, effective with the beginning of the Fall term. Meanwhile, Dr. Olmes continued his series of lectures at the University. This month's lecture is devoted to the "Leakey Affair"... an exploration of the evolutionary hoax. Joining with Dr. Olmes in presenting this lecture was Dr. Kamoya Kimeu Baileyoff, Professor of Archeological Studies at the University of Free Biafra. Olmes devoted his lecture to the discussion of several pre-historic "man-types" which predate the earliest previously known humanoids which indicated that certain types of developed homo sapiens existed at least fifty thousand years earlier than earlier discovered man-types. In a preparatory lecture Dr. Kamoya discussed previously examined anthropoidal types. Long held to be the first man-like creature was the Pithecanthropus erectus (erect man-ape) which was first found on Java in 1891. Since then a variety of man-like creatures have been found in Europe, Africa, Asia, and Oceania, and most recently in North America. Dr. Kamoya discussed the Swanscombe Man, Dordogne Region and Cro-Magnon Man, the Altamira Man, the La Madeline and Lascaux Man, the Homo Neandertalensis, and the Homo Heidelbergensis, as well as the Pitecanthropus majokertenis of southeast Asia. After this brilliant lecture, reviewing all previous archeological work, Dr. Olmes took the floor and revealed what his own discoveries in Periland had shown.

Dr. Olmes, directing three digging teams, had discovered an entirely new race of pre-manlike creatures which appear to have possessed all the attributes of men some forty-six thousand year earlier (using radiopericone dating techniques) than the previously earliest known man-like creatures. The three digs were conducted in total secrecy and only Dr. Olmes knew of their exact locations.

The first dig, at Peerijavo, in Europe, discovered what has been tentatively labelled as the Peerithropus wadjakensis. This appears to be the oldest of the three discoveries. Although little was found in the way of artifacts there were several interesting finds on the dig, which consisted of exploring the ruins of a great underground caveran located beneath the Peeritine Alps. Among those artifacts found were: a collection of splendid daggers or knives, most obviously well-used and well-cared for; a large variety of wall pictures portraying religious and semi-religious scenes. Among frequent subjects for the pictures were a small dog covered with black spots and possessing unusually large ears, a large great mouth, usually open and with the right forward tricuspid missing; and many half circles with an extended line across the top. These were always found in threes and appear to be similar to our present letter "P." Perhaps the most unusual find here was a huge collection of seeds.

Some of these seeds when planted grew and turned out to be a giant greene plant with a large flower that appeared to be man-eating; which may account for the mysterious disappearance of the *Peerathropus wadjakensis*.

The third and most extensive dig was located in the remains of what used to be part of Greater New York, specifically Brooklyn, which was destroyed in the Brooklyn Revolt of 1984 (consult Graustark 150 for details on this), or at least it is so believed. Anyway, Dr. Olmes' team found an exciting find here. Using a variety of highly complex computer analysis and hand-writing studies of the clay tablets found at the dig (which appeared to be some type of large institution, perhaps a penal institution, mental hospital, or school) he determined the existence of a new previously unknown species of creature, which have been named, *Homoblkeinius Boardmagnus fifi*. In addition to the main skeleton type he found a variety of subtypes, including: the *Gemignaius Terriblus*, the *Lindenfrinkanius*, the *Kuchian Lollipop*, the *Besharatanaboresus*, and the *Prosniwit degitalis*. Many other partial skeletons were found, but not in sufficient numbers to allow immediate identification. Interesting characteristics were noted for these skeletal systems:

Homoblkeinius Boardmagnus fifi: The tallest, widest, and most aged of the skeletal systems found, the HBF appears to have been the chief of the group, as signified by a large golden G found on his skeleton, perhaps some type of fertility symbol. Also, he possessed the largest weapon, a battleax, which appeared to be well used, though poorly made.

Gemignaius Terriblus: The GT was found only in the female gender and it was normally buried in pairs near the HBF, perhaps some type of female sacrifice was made when the HBF died. The GT derives its name from the unusually large digital bones which indicated that the GT had very large and powerful hands.

Lindenfrinkanius: The smallest and most underdeveloped of the various skeletons, the L appears to have been the runt of the litter. Exceptional was the well-developed cranial structure which indicated a strong intelligence.

Kuchian Lollipop: This species has the best developed system of extremities of any of the skeletal systems and appeared to be the most possessive of them all since it was almost always found huddled around a small green bag of some type of coins.

Besharatanaboresus: This monstrous figure on the average was about six feet high, although only three were found, and it appeared to be almost humanoid, with the exception of the skull which was almost solid bone, indicating a low level of intelligence.

Prosniwit degatalis: The Pd appears to have had a highly unstable status in the community since they were invariably found with a large dagger stuck in their backs, normally while in a pre-natal position. The Pd was also noteworthy for his six digitated hands, or, more accurately, paws.

These various skeletal systems will undoubtedly provide many hours of intensive study for scientists seeking to trace their modern day descendents; if there were any.

The second dig was located several hundred miles north of St. Peerigrad near what used to be San Francisco, prior to the Great Quake of 1972, which wiped out most of the western United States. High in the hills behind the bay located here were found a number of small villages connected by a large concrete tube which was called at different times and in different manners the RTS, the FMT, the Metro, the Sub, the Jackass, and the MTS. These villages revealed the several interesting specimens among which were the:

Turnergrabalot Digitalignitius: The small creature appeared to be some relation to the Lindenfrinkanius since it was equally underdeveloped except for its cranial areas. Also noteworthy was the unusually large verbal appendage, indicating this was a very noisy character; perhaps serving some function as a warning system of danger.

The danger might well have been the:

Infantenous Kinkigloatubi: This large creature, whose legs were only half as long as his arms, is noted for having unusually large hand structures. Almost always found with this IK was a small wooded tube with a bowl on one end, which appeared to be some kind of sacred vehicle for the transportation of fire, perhaps a fancy incense burner.

The only other creature found in this area was an unusual type of rabbit, which we have called the Greeneskinnitribraunblat. It was usually large, but showed almost no skeletal developed, which would indicate any muscle structure or even any degree of coordination. Indeed, the legs indicated some degree of bowlleggedness. In place of the normal cranial structure the G was equipped with a large sounding tube that also served as a food intake.

All in all Dr. Olmes' creatures provided a fascinating insight into anthropological man, or at least sub-human man.

Credence is lent to the rumors, in the opinion of many, by O'Peery's phenomenal success with San Diego females (rated $\frac{1}{2}$ * on the Nelson scale). "I mean," said one expert, "he has to be getting some extra help for somewhere."

BERLIN The Austrian mobilization along the German border has created a crisis for the government of Count von K6ning. It was understood that the Count enjoyed the confidence of the Habsburgs. As a counter measure the government has ordered the mobilization of the Third and Fourth Armies. Nearly 500,000 men are to be called up. To prevent war, K6ning has sent Baron von Passwater to Vienna. It is hoped that the Baron will be able to negotiate a treaty of non-aggression and mutual assistance.
