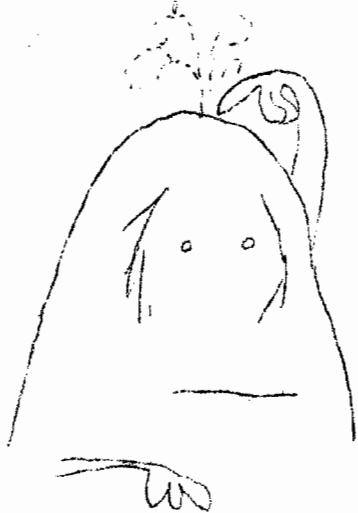


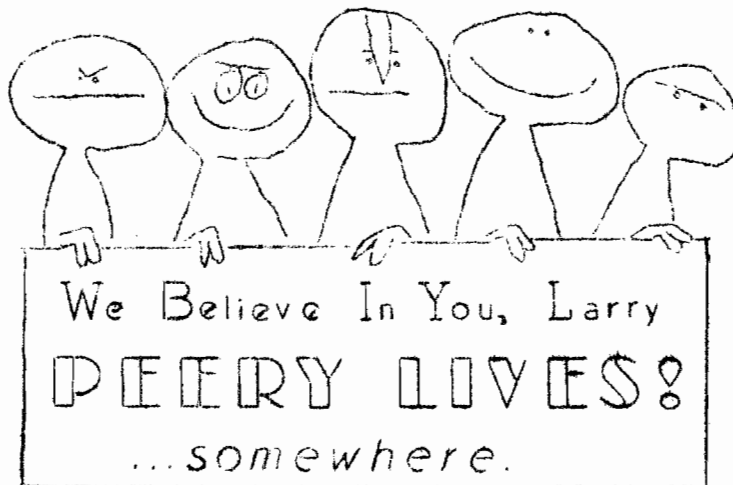

governments that lead the forces against us: It is with both fear and courage that I speak to you today following the recent Fear, not for Russia but for myself that I may not be able to carry the heavy burdens of the leadership of our country in this time of international conflict. Courage, however, I have because I have faith in my people, my advisors, and most importantly in you my people. As long as I have the confidence and support of all of you I cannot but be successful. So, I implore each of you to give us every assistance in this hour of great peril.

"To those nations who oppose our attempts to defend ourselves and our allies we offer our earnest pleas for peace.

"But to those nations who are responsible for our present grief they can be and are warned that we will avenge our losses. Serbia and Turkey will be no more. Also, we will continue on against the Germans. All those who stand in our way will be destroyed.

"That then is our message. To our people, love. To our allies, friendship. To our enemies, death."

ST. PEERIGRAD (14 March 1968) Obscure note in the pages of the St. Peerigrad Town Crier: "If it is to be assumed that we are indeed Jack Greene, Jr., then we must conduct ourselves in a manner befitting such a signal recognition. Therefore all are notified that from this moment forth we will abide by the Greenian Convention and use only those tactics and methods approved by the Greene League."

Other news from St. Peerigrad centered around two interesting meetings and competitions in the city during the past Fall and Summer.

During the summer the last Annual Peace Conference was held at the University of St. Peerigrad under the direction of Professor Peter H. Olmes and sponsored by the PPP Broadcasting Co.

The highlight of the Conference was a debate on the intervention of Russia in Serbia during the current war. Speaking at the conference were four of the world's leading political-military experts, who debated the pros and cons of the war, or as some one put it "that atrocious attempt at mass conversion using non-violent force!"

Representing the Hawks was Professor May Curtiss of the National Periland War College, one of the world's leading experts in peribomic warfare. Representing the Doves was Professor Francis D. Borke, of Simon Fraser University. Professor Borke, whose well known testimony at the Tivoli Trials helped to convict the assassins of Czar Justinus IIInd, spoke extensively. Speaking for the Vultures was Professor Ernest Reichauer of Walla Walla Junior College and speaking for the Chickens was Professor Olmes. The Moderator was Dr. Lawrence O'Peery, of PPP Broadcasting (this is not a further indication of Doctor O'Peery's Casanova abilities). The Conference went very well and following a survey of the audience showing

Doves 15%, Chickens 20%, Hawks 30%, and Vultures 35%.

LONDON (January 1908) The Admiralty announced that the British Fleet will occupy the waters of the Baltic Sea preparatory to pacification of that region. The fleet will pass through Copenhagen and be in the Baltic by Fall of this year.

COURT OF ST. JAMES His Most Britannic Majesty Edward VII announced that amicable relations have been established with all governments except Austria-Hungary. Britain has not renounced her claims to Portugal, but pending Italian success in the East will make no attempt to recover her rightful sphere of influence, as this might weaken the efforts against the Austrian.

His Most Britannic Majesty pledged full and continuing support to the legitimate Russian Government in St. Petersburg. The Norway Fleet stands at the disposal of the Tsar, and British units coming to the Baltic will aid in the liberation of the Russian homeland. British troops now in Belgium will depart to Holland and thereafter support the German Government in resistance to the Austrians, and British Expeditionary forces in France will continue their attacks on Bavaria. His Majesty has pledged to continue the war until all threats of Austrian domination of Europe are ended forever.

The speech from the throne ended with the ringing pledge, "NO TRUCE WITH TYRANTS!"

AN OPEN LETTER TO JOHN KONING:

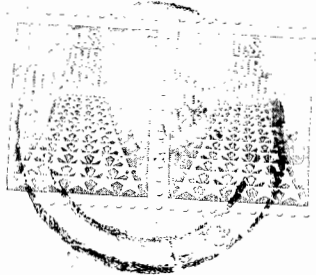
