RALSTONSTADT (25 December 1909) At a special press conference attended by representatives from all over the world Dr. Herbert Marcuse of the University of St. Peerigrad's Ryerson College campus announced that the College's Metaphysics Department had developed the Ultimate Weapon. Dr. Marcuse announced that the weapon consisted of the following components: slightly bored college campus, one incompetent governor, several unhappy teachers, a large number of unwashed students, a tight-fisted legislature, and a host of irresponsible reporters. When all of this is combined, according to the doctor, you have a Peeribomb, the Ultimate weapon which can be used to destroy an institution of higher learning.

At a later press conference Professor and Provost Walter Lippmann announced that the Ryerson College had agreed to accept demands of the militant leaders of the Students for a Greenian Society and would Institute a program of Greenian Studies. The new program would consist of the following courses:

The growth and development of the Greenebean theory (3 units), The development of Greenebean breeding methods (2 units)

"We offer an honorable peace to all nations and request only that each nation demobilize its forces and return their soldiers to peaceful pursuits.

"That all nations live in peace together and that no nation

feel superior or inferior to any other.

"That all men live in peace together and that no man feel superior or inferior to any other.

"Only in this spirit can a just peace return to Europe."

YOUNGSTOWN (2 January 1910) With the occupation of Youngstown complete Gen. Boris B. Bolinski today announced an expeditionary force had been dispatched to Clarion, Pennsylvania to seize the headquarters of the American Timex Corporation, which is located there. The famous clock-watching company will be converted into making medallions marking the 200th anniversary of St. Peerigrad which begins next year.

Meanwhile Dr. John Koning, President of Ohio State University, announced after returning to work at the school that a program was being instituted to stody oranges. This program is believed to be in competition with the program of greenebean studies at the Uni-

versity of St. Peerigrad's Ryerson College.

Dr. Koning said: "Our program to study oranges, along with the greenebean study at Ryerson, the carnation study at the University of Sacramento, the "weed" study at Whitman College, the "pot" study at Brooklyn College, the study of seashells at the University of the Pacific, etc. will further higher education throughout the country. All of these programs together will aid in furthering the cause of nature."

SAN DIEGO A raid on the Sun Valley Nudist Camp near El Cajon hast

evening revealed nothing as police failed to turn up any clues as to whom has been using the camp during the winter season. All police reported finding was a large number of small blocks of differing colors: including red, white, green, and blue. The blocks were of two sizes, long and skinny ones and shorter fat ones. Police could not determine immediately what the blocks were for.

PALESTINE (2 November 1909) Russian forces swept down from the hillsof Anatolia this season to enter the Holy Land. . It is rumored that this act was ordered by the Empress who it is believed is planning to dismantle the entire Holy Land and take it back to Russia. Once again Howard Hughes agents are in the area looking for a quick way to make a buck.

LIVERPOOL (undated) Russian sailers here today reported sighting large numbers of enemy troops in the hills above the city. These sightings combined with reports that French naval units are in the area may mean the end of occupation of the city by Russian forces. 
