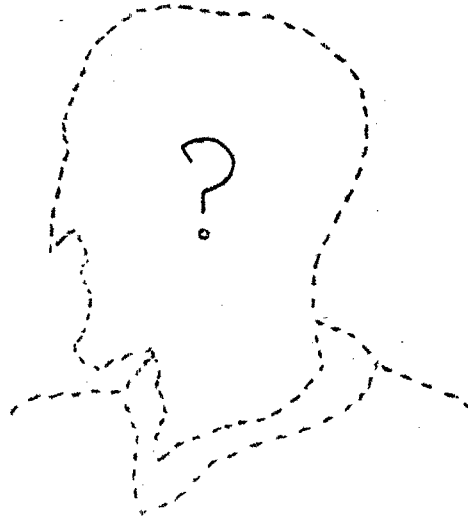

TZUDIKER VANISHES

DENVER (DWE) The disappearance of Roland Tzudiker, noted gamesmas and prominent tax expert, has caused great dismay across the country. Police are at a loss to explain the absense of the IRS official since no motive can be found. Tzudiker and his ward, the Empress Sarah F. Allen, were first noticed to be missing some weeks ago, and a concerted search by Denver police and the FBI has failed to turn them up.

 lar" games. However, I am certainly not the arbiter of what is
 and what is not acceptable in postal Diplomacy. I am only the clerk
 who keeps track of games and game numbers. Since a number of people
 consider all the games I have listed as normal, I assign them num-
 bers for their convenience -- be they rating list buffs, or merely
 players and gamesmasters looking for a handy label for the games
 they play in and/or run. The prefixed symbol, #, however, points
 out that I consider them variants. Each editor/player/rating list
 compiler must make his own evaluation.

VERSAILLES The tenseness of the past Winter has melted away as word arrived that the First Fleet under Admiral Weiser had occupied the city of Liverpool and that Marines had begun to

extend control over the remainder of the district. No organized resistance exists yet in any of the occupied areas. However, it was learned that the English Second Army has made a forced march to make an attempt at defending London. Reports from our observation balloons indicate that the English have moved all industry and governmental functions to the North. It is apparent that a stiff battle is in the offing for London. It is hoped that assistance from the Russian fleet will be forthcoming.

LIEGE Heightened preparations for defense have been in effect the past several weeks as the defenders of Leige await the expected advance of the Germans from Holland. Should this attack materialize, it is doubtful if the fortress can be held, as it was extensively damaged in the assault in August 1901.

PETROGRAD (13 January 1903) The Imperial Government today reported that the infamous John Koning, extradited last week by the United States, had recanted his heinous crimes and was, as previously stated, locked in a room with John Smythe, a pot of tea, and a single bottle of beer.

"Well, Mr. Smythe," said John (his close friends all call him "Mr. Smythe."), "I have to go potty."

"This is not National City, John."

"I know. I really must, you know, Mr. Smythe."

"I fell for that trick once, John." In a flash, Mr. Smythe dashed for the beer. In the scuffle that followed, the pot of tea was overturned and Mr. Smythe got the beer, consequently consuming every drop. So all John Koning got was John Smythe, who proceeded to lecture him on his sins for three solid days, without stopping. In the end, Koning was anxious to repent even sins he hadn't committed. But, alas, there were none. Thus endeth the sad tale of the notorious Mr. Koning. Imprisoned forever in a Siberian salt mine -- or perhaps a treacle well, nobody knows for sure -- he will never be heard from again.

SIBERIA (DWE) That's what you think, buster!

PETROGRAD (15 January 1903) Lest anyone doubt earlier reports of the utter destruction of Berlin and Munich by Russian Imperial Horror Weapons, please note that the sole German build was in Kiel. Be on the lookout for our next group of second-generation Horror weapons -- millions of tons of (gasp) Press Releases...

I am incensed by Conrad's suggestion that the House of Kamchameha would adopt the motto "In Dole we trust," whereas the House of Kamehameha was overthrown in a pseudo-revolution concocted by and for Sanford Ballard Dole's pineapple interests. It is my firm opinion that if Satan vs. Jabel Stone were being tried at the present day, Sanford Ballard Dole would be foreman of the jury. Where did Conrad learn history?

While I am on the subject, I must point out that the House of Kamehameha is not in the least "The only legitimate legitimate true royal house ever to exist in America." In the first place, Hawaii is not in America. If Polynesia is part of America, then so is Australia. In the second place, how does Conrad characterize the

House of Hanover, the Spanish Hapsburgs, and the House of Romanov as illegitimate? But even if we confine ourselves to royal houses originating in the Americas (which do not include Hawaii) the only way in which the House of Kamehameha can be considered more "legitimate" than the House of Iturbide or the House of Christophe is that Kamehameha succeeded, whereas Iturbide and Christophe did not. ((I question whether it ever existed. jgk)) Of course, His Grace's death would leave another problem, as he has no heirs. By applying the salic law, however, we easily arrive at the next King, Prince Henry, the Duke of Gloucester.

To John McCallum: Actually, one is treading upon very infirm ground when one begins to talk about "wild" blueberries, apparently

as compared to cultivated blueberries. No blueberries are cultivated in the usual meaning of the word. In Maine, one simply either does or does not own land on which blueberry bushes grow. The really BIG COMMERCIAL growers (and there are not many) burn the ground every three years, and that, added to praying for rain, is the extent of the cultivation of blueberries.

I have several times been in the area of which you spoke, John, and can, on top of everything else, guarantee that the girls there do NOT bear any resemblance to blueberries. French curves, yes; blueberries, definitely not. ((Yes, but which do you like better?))

Now, to Roddie: I can tell that you are just one of them what has to be told. First of all, of course blueberries stain things badly. This phenomenon is due to the fact that their juice is sufficiently concentrated so as to have flavor and character. Take an orange, and it doesn't stain; of course not. How could it? It is 98.32% water to start with. The crud has to be concentrated before it is usable!

Let me point out, first, that residents of Maine are Mainiacs, not Mainites as reported by poor, beknighted Bill Linden. Let me also point out that the Aroostook valley outproduces L.I. in both quantity and quality and that the reason they are not shipped out is that they would kill anyone except a New Yorker. Washington and Michigan are 'way behind (Washington weighs in at 3,900,000 pounds), along with North Carolina and Massachusetts is not even mentioned as having significant production. I guess, Hal ((Naus)), that any berries growing in Mass. really do grow in abandon, but your letter did not confuse me. Despite Maine's obvious first-place position, those reference works which mention states mention New Jersey, Michigan, Washington, North Carolina -- and then, in passing, throw out "New England."
