Underlined moves do not succeed. The French Fleet Western Med., active at last, retreats to North Africa. The English Fleet south coast of Spain retreats to Portugal, as the only open province.

The Italian attack on Kiel, supported by the Turkish Army Berlin, is stood off by the English attack from the Ruhr, supported by the Fleet Baltic. The Army Kiel remains, under the rule that a player cannot force his own pieces to retreat or to be annihilated.

In sTab #8, Austria's "F Livo" should, of course, be "A Livo.."

Phil Castora, playing England, has protested the destruction of his Fleet Gulf of Lyon and Army St. Petersburg last issue, and protests in general the rule concerning temporary collapse of civil government. I point out that there has been precedent in this game in my and in John Smythe's treatment of French forces when routed, and that all sTab games are played under the mail Diplomacy rules set forth by John Boardman (unless clearly stated otherwise). In any case, only the Army St. Petersburg had an open retreat, though this would have made easier the retaking of St. Petersburg.

It would, however, have been possible for England to retake St. Petersburg, by having the Fleet Baltic cut Livonia's support, and the Army Ruhr support Kiel. Sorry, Phil...I respect your protest, but must overrule it this time.

MAGADAN (28 January 1903 - DWE) Violence erupted in the quaint Monastery of St. Ivan Yurowdivi for the first time in three centuries today. The incident occurred when Ivan VII, former ruler of Russia, struck John Lewis, former Sultan of Turkey during a literary argument.

The dispute arose over the various merits of two anti-war cantatas, composed by Ivan VII and Lewis as entry's in Dr. John Boardman's anti-war cantata contest. Boardman, one of several hundred men deported to Magadan for the crime of impersonating a Russian Ruler, had begun the contest to distract the monastery's inmates from their sole occupation of planning coups against the Russian Government. Ivan insisted that Lewis' continuing chorus of:

"War, war, war
Is a bore, bore, bore."

was not in the true spirit of contemporary cantatas. Lewis replied by suggesting that DeMille get Lon Chaney rather than John Barrymore to play Ivan in "Russia Aflame."

In the resulting scuffle the Eastern wing of the monastery was totally destroyed, and 37 of the monastery's "guests" received slight injuries. These proved fatal in all but 4 cases.

Boardman, encouraged by the spirit in which his fellow imposters have entered into the pacifist movement, plans to run several more contests, as soon as the walls of the monastery have been shored up sufficiently.

YOUNGSTOWN (DWE) John Koning, sole editor of the YUDC's only Diplomacy Magazine (S*T*A*B), was nearly killed today. Koning, fearful of assassination since his chief rival returned from mystic Chicago, has for some time taken extensive precautions to guard himself from the evil minions of the insidious John Smythe.

The latest attempt on Koning's life was made with the newest device from the dread labs of Smythe. "Smythe calls it, I believe," said Koning, "the brick. It is horribly simple... a heavy rectangular solid of stone, which is thrown at the victim. Oh, where will it end?" Where, indeed.

This was the second seven man game played on 15 November 1965, when the YUDC traveled to Scarborough for a Diplomacy session. After the first game, in which Christian was double-crossed several times by both Smythe and Koning, the Eastern situation was bound to be tense.

The avoidance by both Turkey and Russia of a move to the Black Sea gave evidence of a treaty of some sort between them. Each plied Austria with offers of aid against the other, however.

Germany said: "The Germans announce they are joining the Turks in a Berlin to Baghdad Railroad with one stop in Vienna. This is a strictly economic move and Austria is to take no offense since we are picking her ancient, beautiful, sophisticated capital for our base of operations."

The Turks answered: "Thanks, Germany, for the new railroad. In response the Sultan promises to protect German interests in Bora Bora." Everyone laughed nervously.

The emergence of an alliance between England and Russia-Turkey cracked the German offensive against Russia, and made victory for the Eastern powers inevitable without a vast reshuffling of alliances. France seemed to have revealed herself as an ally of the English-Russian-Turkish alliance... though whether by design or accident was a good question.

The YUDC almost invariably plays the moves strictly as written... we do not follow the rule that "a vaguely written move which nevertheless allows only one interpretation may be made," though this of course was not even vaguely written.

At last awake to their danger, the central powers united with France to fight England, Russia, and Turkey. In this marvelous agreement, Italy apparently agreed to give up Venice and Tunis in return for French support, Germany agreed to give up Holland in return for French support, France agreed to give support in return for various supply centers, and Austria-Hungary agreed to give up.

On the other side, the Russian takeover in Bulgaria created some hard feelings that were soothed when she agreed to return it.
