Saint George Speaks

"Bubble gum" Science Fiction

There is currently a trend in television to present an action-adventure series and label it SF because of one element. This type of show is becoming known as "Bubble gum" SF because of the theory that this is SF of the type to the adelescent. This is fellowing on two counts

which appeals to the adolescent. This is fallacious on two counts. Such a show is not SF, nor does it draw most of its audience from teen-

agers.

What are these shows? Six-Million Dollar Man and Bionic Woman are two examples, and I have heard that Man From Atlantis will be on in the fall as a third. These shows take a science-fictional element, cyborgs or alien intelligence, and essentially waste it as a gimmick for what is really only another spy series. I have seen Six-Million Dollar Man and Man From Atlantis. I have not seen Bionic Woman, but I am sure it follows the pattern of the other two.

The idea of the Cyborg is an interesting one. How does a person learn to adjust to being partly electronic? And from time to time the show does mention there are problems. One whole show presumably dealt with this problem when a second bionic man was created. We know he was having problems because he started robbing banks. But of course, the good guys talked to him, turned down his "super-powers", and he was all right.

In Man from Atlantis, the origin of the Super-hero is unknown. However, it isn't really important. He merely muses about it as he hunts down underwater criminals. There is no prospect for improvement; the show simply isn't intended to be SF.

Science fiction cannot be written by injecting one superfluous element into a non-SF story. A spy story with a Cyborg as the counter-spy is still a spy story. Good SF need not be morally instructive, although some of the best is, but the SF element must be central to the story.

The Planet of the Apes series a few seasons back was not morally instructive. But it was SF. Why? Because the alien element was essential to the idea. Man From Atlantis so far appears as a remake of Sea Hunt.

The question is why we are getting such schlock? I'm afraid the answer is because that is what we want. People who point to the continued popularity of Star Trek overlook the obvious point that Star Trek is in reruns because it failed to maintain a sufficient audience while it was in production. The vocal minority clamoring for the resurrection of Star Trek is simply that, a vocal minority.

The American population does not want great drama, Roots notwithstanding. Charlie's Angels is crap. I am told that with three girls who look like that, the show doesn't have to be well done. Agreed. But does that mean that it has to be poorly done? I think it does. There are essentially two audiences in America. One for Charlie's Angels and Six Million Dollar Man, and one for Star Trek. And unfortunately the former is in the majority.

As someone once said(it escapes me for the moment who), no one ever went broke underestimating the taste of the American people.

Budapest(30 August, 1906, SHFP) The General, his face swollen and red, could scarcely contain himself.

Berlin(26 September, 1906) Joy and jubilation swept through the capital city in the wake of the news that the Russian government had at last fallen, after six long years of war. German armies moved to subdue the pepulation centers and surrounding countryside, thereby securing the Eastern Front. Some dissidents spread rumors that the war in the east had been won at the cost of jeopardizing the safety of German citizens closer to home. Official government sources refused to comment on the close proximity of Austrian and French forces to the homeland.

Ruhr(31 August, 1906) A secret diplomatic pouch from Germany to France was intercepted here. It contained the message: It is better to die on
