London (May Day, 1901) (Special to St.G & the D) - For the second time in English history, the monarchy has been overthrown and a Commonwealth established. The old regime collapsed suddenly when the Queen Mother was caught stuffing Her bustle with colonial two-dollar bills (actually worth \$1.15), as a hedge against the declining value of the Pound Sterling. Acting promptly to prevent runaway inflation, the newly appointed Lord Protector of England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, North Africa and Syria issued a warrant for the arrest of an unidentified "lone stapler" who "did willfully and seditiously encourage a member of the Royal Family to attach foreign currency to Her undergarments." Luxembourg Free Press: The world watches in stunned silence as sickness

Luxembourg Free Press: The world watches in stunned silence as sickness spreads throughout Europe. Western Europe(particularly the Netherlands) has seen the outbreak of the Black Plague, which until this year had been contained in Germany. Tunis is rumored to be suffering from the Green Gang, a disease that is expected to kill off the native Tunisian population by the end of 1901. Yellow fever is gripping the Balkans. All in all Europe is not a very healthy place for non-combatants to be.

"Crap, here comes Boris. No doubt he wants to borrow my wife to help with his planting. Well, he'll just have to find something else to pull his plow; I need Natasha to dig a new well..."

"Hey, Ivan!" croaked Boris, "Have you heard the news?"

There were representatives from Germany, Austria-Hungary, and Italy, but the exact areas which they agreed upon were not disclosed at this time. Berlin (Feb 5, 1901) This reporter has just finished an interview with the new Chancellor, and this is what he said. It has been said that he doesn't believe in war, or that war is the only answer to our (Europe's) problems. But he would take the usual and appropriate measures to see that peace in the East will be quick and certain. For he has tried to keep the peace, but will act with all the force necessary to keep the peace and his allies safe from the agression of other European powers. And that's how it happened, Feb. 5, 1901. For you heard it as it was told to this reporter. (Press continued on page 6) \*

Turkey:

Moscow (26 March, 1901)

The Ministry of Defense (MOD) announced today that the Tsar's 17th Fleet would leave this Spring for Sweden. The announcement followed the Russian Intelligence Processing Organization to Fight Fascism's (RIPOFF's) discovery of a plot by the nations of Rumania and Sweden to conquer Europe. While no plans for an attack on Rumania are public, a military aide said there was discussion of a massive assault to be known as Operation Czebra (also spelled Tsebra).

Washington (30 March, 1901)

The President today confirmed rumors that American troops would soon be sent to Sweden to defend that nation from Russian attack. The President said he was taking this action under the Jackson Doctrine. It was later explained to newsmen that the powers the United States had claimed in the Western Hemisphere under President Monroe's Doctrine - namely to aid any country under attack from an outside powerwere claimed in the Eastern Hemisphere under President Jackson's Doctrine.

Washington (31 March, 1901)

The mystery of the Jackson Doctrine, invoked by the President yester-day, remains unsolved. One newsman, speaking to a State Department official, said that a thorough search of President Andrew Jackson's papers had failed to turn up anything resembling the so-called Jackson Doctrine. The aide responded, "Not that President Jackson," and then turned away. The newsman shouted to him, "We'll get the 'scoop' on this yet!" and then he too walked off.

Reporte Berlin Journal (24 Feb., 1901) from Hans Glötz

It's now been three days since the aides to the German and Russian governments met in Silesia. They are said to be waiting for word or an emissary from the Austro-Hungarian government to put the final touches on a possible non-agression/mutual aid pact. It has also been said that the German aide was sent for to avert a possible war between the two giants and to act as mediator.

Berlin Reporte Journal (23 Feb., 1901) FLASH!!

Just in: It was said that the new German Chancellor checked his southern boundary ((in a mirror?)) and warned Italy that the Tyrolian province was neutral territory and that movement into said territory was an irresponsible act of agression which would meet with appropriate action. All treaties and pacts would be voided. The same was said in Austria as the Chancellor and the Austrian ruler had lunch later the same day in Vienna.

Budapest(28 April, 1901 Sleepy Hollow Free Press):

In a dramatic culmination to several weeks of intense diplomatic manuevering, the Imperial Government today issued a proclamation renouncing the Treaty of Berlin, which has for years defined the order of things in the Southeastern corner of the continent, and announcing the unilateral incorporation of Macedonia and Greece into the Hapsburg Empire. The Porclamation, to which Emperor Rudolph affixed the Imperial Seal only in the wee hours of the morning after an intensive twenty-hour session during which the document was composed, makes no mention of reaction, potential or expected, of the other Great Powers, all of whom are signatories to the Treaty; however, it is widely reported that Austro-Hungarian diplomatic entreaties have resulted in firm offers of support, if not encouragement, from more than one nation. According to one highly placed source, extensive contacts with all four immediate neighbors which constituted the prelude to today's activity have "prepared a foundation ample to support the stress" which is admittedly expected to result from the potentially highly disruptive moves which the Proclamation entails.

In a related development, standing forces are manuevering in the vicinity of the Southeastern borders of the Empire, and it has been made unofficially clear that the Government is likely to make some sort of military demonstration to back up the Proclamation. The Territories in question, tho meminally under the aegis of Turkey, have long been festering sources of unrest for that country, comprising as they do a heterogeneous collection of various nationalities, religious groups, and economic sub-systems(and are expected therefore to fit in well with the hodge-podge composition of the Dual Monarchy).

Rome: The Ministry of War announced today that the failure of the Italian invasion was due to three key factors: 1) the use of the here-to-fore untested three-wheeled Isetta light tank(nicknamed by wags "the Contadina tomato paste can"); 2) the minister's wife who announced the projected invasion to the French Minister's wife at a Tupperware party in Marseilles; and 3) the conflict in timing with a clean-up Venice campaign in the wake of Austrian tourists littering which required a major part of the Italian armed forces.

<u>Vatican</u>: Pompous St. Iconoclast, the Holy Father, banned the use of cracker jacks by all Catholics. He stated further that use and abuse of this substance had contributed much to the decline of Western

Civilization.

Naples: Hohenstauffen family spokesman Carl Albert Franz-Franz della Bella expressed his concern that German relatives may end up getting the shaft in the Entente Cozy that seems to be developing in Western Europe.

Tunis: Hero's welcome accorded Italy's "Desert Pox" here.

Berlin( 1 October, 1901) Confusion reigned in the German capital among the local populace as well as at the highest levels of government. It was well known that Germany was at war, but who were her enemies and who were her friends remained unclear. Rumors continued to spread unchecked. It was believed that confidential German diplomatic pouches were being widely circulated throughout Europe, where they were being laughingly referred to as "good bathroom reading". The German High Command was ready to denounce whoever was responsible for the leaks, as soon as the culprits could be flushed out.

Panic nearly seized the capital, as an invasion by unnamed power or powers was rumored to be imminent. Prime Minister Bethmann-Holweg attempted to calm these fears, and reported that diplomatic discussions were continuing around the clock. "We should know where we stand any

day now..."

Belgium(15 November, 1901): As he marched with the First Infantry Korps into Belgium, Hans Rattner((any relation to Hans Gruyere?)) peered intently ahead, looking...for what? No contact with the enemy was expected, but then no one seemed to know who the enemy was! The day before they'd been prepared for battle - now all was quiet; there was no resistance. Nothing could be worse than this endless waiting, endless anticipation. He'd heard from his cousin Franz, who'd moved out to Holland, but whether they'd face opposition, no one knew. Tales of complete disorganization in Berlin spread constantly through the ranks - he didn't know whether to believe them. Meanwhile, nothing to do but wait...The inactivity called to mind a saying he'd once read: "War is an organized bore."

Vienna: It was announced today by the Federal Trade Commission that all handguns sold after June 30 must bear a legend to the effect that discharging a handgun into the body of a human being may be hazardous to the health. This action has been taken following the release last year of the Surgeon General's report stating that in 92% of 1, 284 cases studied the recipient of a discharge from a handgun was either killed or wounded seriously enough to be hospitalized. The cases were limited to trajectories of less than ten feet, but while the percentages drop for greater distances, they are still above 50% in all cases. The Surgeon General's report did note that concentrated experimentation on rats failed to provide a link between handgun wounds and cancer, although it was pointed out that after discharging ten rounds into each test rat very few traces of tissue remained for analysis.

Our sources indicate that the action by the Federal Trade Commission was undertaken in lieu of firmer action by Congress. Apparently great pressure has been put on many Congressmne, including most of the influential House and Senate leaders, by what has been termed the Big Crime lobby. Lobbyists for this group insist that the economic blow to a large segment of our economy would be too severe if free sale of handguns were stopped immediately. Cited are the hundreds of thousands of policemen, prisom officials, judges, parole officers, employees of



Lord Admiral Hansen reiterated his position that the English armada was now in top readiness to face any challenges which might arise in the future. Meanwhile, in Parliament, Lord Bissel noted with obvious consternation that the supposed simultaneous "field exercises" being held by all the Great Powers of Europe were indeed providing "the unholy catalyst for world-wide warfare". His Lordship also took advantage of this occasion to announce the proposed construction of a third English fleet in London this winter. "Without a doubt." Lord Bissel observed, Her Majesty would prefer that such action not be necessary. However, events over the past few months establish that Her Royal Pants must be kept up."
