

SAINT GEORGE SPEAKS

The Standby - or Why pay your money if you don't play the game.

One thing a Gamesmaster had better prepare for when he fills his first game is that at least one, and probably more of the original seven players is not going to finish the game. A rester of people willing to take over what is almost certainly a losing position is vitally necessary if the game is not to be hopelessly fouled up.

I have been guilty of dropping out of two games, both variants. They sounded interesting to play; they were not. I sent the GM a letter of resignation so that he could find a replacement before the next set of moves were due. Neither was a losing position. The game was simply not

fun to play for me.

However I have not resigned from any regular game that I am in although I have three losing positions, and possibly more. I knew what Diplomacy was like to play before I signed up for my first game. I enjoy playing. In one game, only two people have ever written me. One has dropped out, and the other has evidently broken his hand because he can't seem to hold a pen long enough to write again. You knew what's going to happen to me in that game; I know what's going to happen. But the game is still fun to play. I am indulging in heavily sarcastic press and since I have no agreements with anyone, I am free to attack as I please. Since I know I am going to get wiped, I am not even wasting time defending. But the idea of dropping is not a valid one.

Too many people play this game to win. Now I know the rules say that is the objective, but it's really not. The point of this game is to have fun. And fun can be had from any position, even if it is a losing one. If you find yourself in a losing position all the time, then unless your tastes run to masochism, perhaps you ought to find another game to play. I think most of us have had the experience of picking up centers that were not really earned, but were gained because someone dropped, and standby moves were not available. Most GM's do not ask for standby moves until someone has missed once. I ask for standby moves so that every country is assured of moving every season. Any moves at all, even if they are made without diplomacy, are better than no moves at all. And I, for one, would rather beat a player because I out-smarted him or out-guessed him than because he didn't send in moves.

I will play a position to the last piece. For those who doubt that, look at 1975GV in DIMAN, where my Turkey is getting absolutely wiped by Gary Cohen's France and Larry Bresslour's Germany. But I am still fighting. When they beat me(and that's when, not if) they will know that they have earned the win. They simply played better diplomatically and tactically; they did not get any unearned centers. I think they will feel happier with the result than if I had simply quit after I was attacked.

The point to all this (yes, Virginia, there is a point) is if you find for personal reasons you must resign, send the GM a note saying so with the last set of moves you submit. But quitting because you can't win is not fair to the other players, and by your agreeing to play in the first place, I think you owe them the satisfaction of an earned win.

Hush ! A sound ! There are footsteps on the beach....



Vienna (20 March, 1902, SHFP): King Rudoph's Royal Carriage was bombarded with eggs today as it made its way through the streets of this gloomy former Imperial Capital. While the colorful flags which bedecked the streets danced in the light Spring breezes, the starkly morose and moody atmosphere of Vienna set a contrast which underlined the deep splits which exist in the Empire. Precisely why the Emperor, who since His succession to the throne has boldly favored His Hungarian crown more than the Hapsburg mantle itself, chose this city --which knows him as the man who moved the capital to Budapest--to proclaim a war in concert with the Slavic Russians against the Turks is decidedly unclear. However, if it was thought that this war would serve to tie together the seemingly unraveling strands which compose the Hapsburg Empire, that conjecture was clearly proven wrong today.

Despite the restive nature of the populace, the Emperor insisted on personally addressing a crowd somehwere to make the Proclamation concerning the Declaration of War against the Ottoman Empire. But even with Rudolph at His most conciliatory—sources close to the Royal Party allow that He had even intended not to deliver the whole speech to the German-speaking Austrian crowd in Hungarian, as is His normal practice, but instead to lapse into Yiddish to—wards the end—the tenor of the gathered throng was nasty and brut—ish, and none of the speech could be heard over the tumult and the cries of "Sic ihm, Dreksie", the slogan of the protestors. The address of the normally valuble Emperor had to be cut by nearly 4/5th as He was able to continue for only forty minutes before the unruliness obviously threatened to get out of hand.

Meanwhile, amid wide rumors of some sort of anti-government move, Austrian leaders continued to meet among themselves. While ominous reports that foreign diplomats opposed to the war had gathered secretly in Vienna were denied by an Imperial spokesperson, former Foreign Minister Count von Beust did arrive here from the countryside, terming the Declaration a "grave development", and is meeting with associates to discuss the situation.

reported by Hans Glötz; released by Lt.Col. Bruno Kimmel There were many changes during the last few days of the fall campaign, but the major event took place when Lt. Col. Mark Müller, Commander of the new Western front, second-guessed a letter from the French government and changed the orders of the "First Composite Army" to support the Italians to Marseilles, rather than attacking Paris. As a reward for his effort in reducing the French threat, the Colonel was promoted to Lt. General and was made Field Marshall for the Western front.

As to the promotion, the Chancellor was sad to lose his top man to a field command, but the new Field Marshall assured the Chancellor that this replacement as aide to the Chancellor, Lt.Col. Bruno Kimmel, could more than handle the job of bedyguard and aide. Since he, Bruno, is also head of the special forces, the "G.B.K.", it would be child's play. (Also it was rumored that Bruno and Mark are cousins.)
