#### LETTER BOMBS

Robert Lesco: Egads, I'm bedating with someone who finds the CBC "reputable". I still can not accept your view of Japan as a socialist state. [Incidently, a differential is a part on your car.] "The corporations have money but we don't". Sound familiar? Actually, it's Kobe resident Yuriko Kite quoted on page D1, Globe & Mail, 13 March 93. It hardly sounds socialist to me. These are people, the article goes on to state, who work an average of 2000 hours per year, compared to 1600 in Germany.

The practice of investment houses re-imbursing their large accounts for losses on the stock market certainly doesn't benefit the entire society. Nor does the continual corporate bribery of government officials, for example the scandal that cost Prime Minister Takana his post. I just don't see it.

Two issues ago the recession of the early 80's was Now, it may have had its initial Reagan's fault. causes elsewhere." It doesn't sound like you've got your recessions in order to me. How can you say that the USA became the only place where one could still get a return on investment? Page B21 of the 20 March 93 Globe & Mail prints a chart courtesy of Melland-Walwyn of the Best Performing Markets which I reproduce here: 92-Hong Kong; 91-Hong Kong; 89-Germany: 88-Australia: 87-Japan: UK: Japan: 85-Germany; 84-Hong Kong; 83-Australia: 82-USA [once!]; 81-Singapore; 80-Hong Kong; Hong Kong; 78-Japan.

Clearly, lots of places did well. Rates of return for managed portfolios show similar results.

Did you see the review of Martin Moore-Ede's book, The Twenty-Four Hour Society? He proposes that, on average, we operate on a 25-hour cycle. The hypothalamus must be kicking itself. Missed it by THAT much!

It must be frustrating for the UN in Yugoslavia. How can we stop people from hating? My view is that the Serbs are using UN imposed cease-fires as a means of dealing with their new neighbours one at a time. Once there is peace with Bosnia I wouldn't want to be in Macedonia. I rather hope I'm wrong.

ECY: You are of course correct that Japan is not an openly socialist country. My premise is that their society operates in the same manner as if it were a socialist country. In a true socialist state there is an agreement between government, labour and capital

which acts to the mutual benefit of all concerned. They do not have the adversarial system that western capitalism seems to foster. They all get behind the same ideas and then work like heck. They waste much less time and energy on non-productive activities.

I conceded that Reagan may not have caused the recession of the early 80's but he certainly did manage it. He determined how it was played out. In that sense it was HIS recession. I was agreeing with your point, that it was on its way when he came in. There is no confusion in my mind about it, nor how it was handled. You should check the balance of investment figures for the USA over the same period as your table. You will find that massive amounts of capital flowed in during that recession. Lots of places did well, but in comparison to the previous decade the USA did very well. It is always the rich who do best in a good, deep recession because they are the only ones who have any capital [tho' reduced] with which to scoop up the 'fire sale' bargains.

I fear you are only too right about the Serbs. The Jews showed everyone how to handle cease-fires and really outdo ones antagonists, when they were fighting to set up Israel.

Brent McKee: The big question about the UN's role is when do you use its power. In the old days the power could only be used when the issue wasn't Communists vs Capitalists. Hence the UN involvement in Cyprus and the Congo rather than Vietnam. Korea was an aberration - the Russians weren't around to disagree. Today, because there really is only one superpower, the decision is less clear cut. The amount of UN power used depends on the opinion of that one superpower. Thus you have extrordinary deployments to Kuwait and Somalia, supporting US interests in the former and US public opinion in the latter. On the other hand there are the "normal" deployments to Cambodia and Bosnia. US interests aren't as involved there. Is this cynical? Maybe. Is it true? I suspect it probably is.

ECY: Not so sure about Korea. It was the Chinese who backed the North and even then the Soviets didn't mind that China should take a few licks to keep them closely tied to the Soviet hand and path.

Robert Staats: Are you still stuck on the idea of that world government will solve many of the problems we currently deal with? Sach as war, famine, and possibly wide-spread poverty. Please. In order for the UN, or any body, to enforce policy upon nations many changes need to be made in the current political environment. 1st- Nations must be willing to give up sovereignty. Not likely to happen anytime soon, countries such as Iran or Pakistan would not be willing to do so on religious reasons alone. 2nd- Who wants to pay? Try hitting up Russia, Mexico or China for the billions needed. 3rd- Who will serve in this force? Try telling ma back in Mississippi that her only son was killed by a Somalian capitalist (or

whatever you want to call the warlords). She ain't gonna be too happy.

These are just a few of the reasons why the UN does not work today. I might mention that a world body (whether it be polity or military) may not be the best for the people of the planet Earth. In the US we are having a hard enough time separating the powers of the Federal, State and local governments. Throwing in a world government will not make law much easier to enforce. Granted, you are only advocating a body to prevent atrocities such as those in the former Yugoslavia. But the vast number of people on this planet may not want a world body looking over their government. I might also mention that many nations that we don't commonly think of (eg. Indonesia, Guatemala) do not have the infrastructure or constitution that our government had in 1820. Meaning, they are conceivably 150 plus years behind us in government institutionalization. Interesting considering Indonesia's population is 180 million people! ECY: Well you guys, it seems that no one wants a world police force. On the one hand the bully doesn't want it because he doesn't want to lose the sons and daughters nor does he want to pay for it. On the other the little guys don't want it because they are still at the stage where they like to pound on their own people. I don't think that anybody has to give wh sovereignty. As long as a country is acting within its own borders and the world community is not advised of any atrocities then it's okay. If anyone sends troops into another country then the UN steps in to stop it. The problem is the US. Being the big guy, it has to agree to keep its troops at home forever unless the UN calls. Most people in the US are pretty isolationist anyway and it helps out ma in Ole' Miss. If everyone agrees, then the political will is there. Who pays? Always the same question. I love it when I hear that if the world spent 10% of the money it does on arms, on food, no one would ever be hungry. There's plenty of wealth and money, we just spend it badly. Julien Beasley: I disagree with your and Jim Lewis' view on the draft. When you join a society you agree to a "social contract". You agree to give up certain rights, including freedom, for protection. A group of people living without a social contract live with no property rights, no rights at all. People can steal from you, murder you, and no one will be there to stop it. It's like living in South Central L.A. Obviously, it is advantageous to form a society which will protect you from these dangers. This protection is given in the form of a constitution, police, army, etc. It doesn't come free! You can't just pull soldiers out of thin air! We have a paid standing army, like we have a paid police force. But it is inefficient and economically wasteful to have a paid standing army the size we need it to be when we go to war. Therefore, we draft citizens, the society has no army and has no defence against threats, and can't do its duty of

economic waste or you don't want to live by a social contract. If the former is what you want, vote Republican. If the latter's the case, fine. You can start by following rapper Ice Cube's advice in How to Survive in South Central, Rule #1: Get yourself a gun. ECY: I can buy in to just about all of your argument except when you "exclude the middle". You set everything up and then say, "See, it's black or it's white!" What happened to gray? Sure, we all give up certain freedoms in agreeing to live by the same set of rules. It doe not follow that the only means to supply an army in time of crisis is to draft people against their will. That may be necessary, but it may not, depending on the severity of the crisis. If the cause is just then the enducements to fight in it should be great enough to draw the numbers needed. I also feel that as citizens we should all have the right to stand up and say that the way the society is going is wrong and that it should re-assess what it is doing. attitude of "America, Love it or Leave it!" is patently harmful to the society. There are a multitude of correct ways of thinking. Are you sure that you meant to say that Republicans are in favor of economic wastefulness? [I likewise feel the political spectrum could use some 'gray' areas between Repub's and Demo's.]
