This is the best fit I have ever seen for preferences. Five of you got your first choices and the other two got their third choice. I usually feel good if a bunch get their fourth choice.

The rules for prophetic retreats, removals and builds are these: If you think you might have to retreat some unit specify your ordered preference of spaces it can go to If you do not state a preference then I will retreat the unit to the first space to the right of the attacking unit. It is is unavailable then I look to the first to the left; second to the right, second to the left, etc.. If there is only one place it could go then that's where it'll go even if you say nothing.

With you Fall orders you should get in the habit of telling me which unit you would like to lose, if you have to, and the three builds you would like, in preference order. That way, even if you don't have to do anything, you're covered just in case the unexpected happens. All it costs is a bit of ink on the page. If you don't tell me which one(s) you'll miss least then I will make removals starting with the furthest from home NOT on a supply center. If you forget to tell me your build wishes, tough, you'll play short for the following year.

This will be the format for all years after 1901: Spring & {Summer}; Fall & Autumn {retreats} & Winter [Builds/Removals]. In 1901 I like to have a separate Winter season. This is the time when diplomacy is needed to cement alliances. So even though you're not suppose to talk before builds, I do it.

Final Note: My darn disk crashedil! I took it to school to finish off some tiny things and print it. I died, but I didn't know it, I thought it was the laser printer fonts. Then when I got home it sucked down the virtually complete copy from my hard drive. I had to totally rebuild pages 6 & 7 and mostly rebuild 4 & 5 and spruce up page 8. I'm not a happy camper. Now I'm really angry, but I still have a s-t eating grin on my face.
