This is a listing of most of the magazines devoted to Diplomacy and such related topics. While it is not inclusive, all of the major ones are present. With each listing is the cost, the type of reproduction, the size, frequency, and number (and type) of games being run. There is also a 100 word paragraph about each zine, written by either the publisher or S. Billenness.

Subzines, hobby services, and foreign zines are also listed. The cost is \$1.50 per issue. It may be worth your while to get a copy.

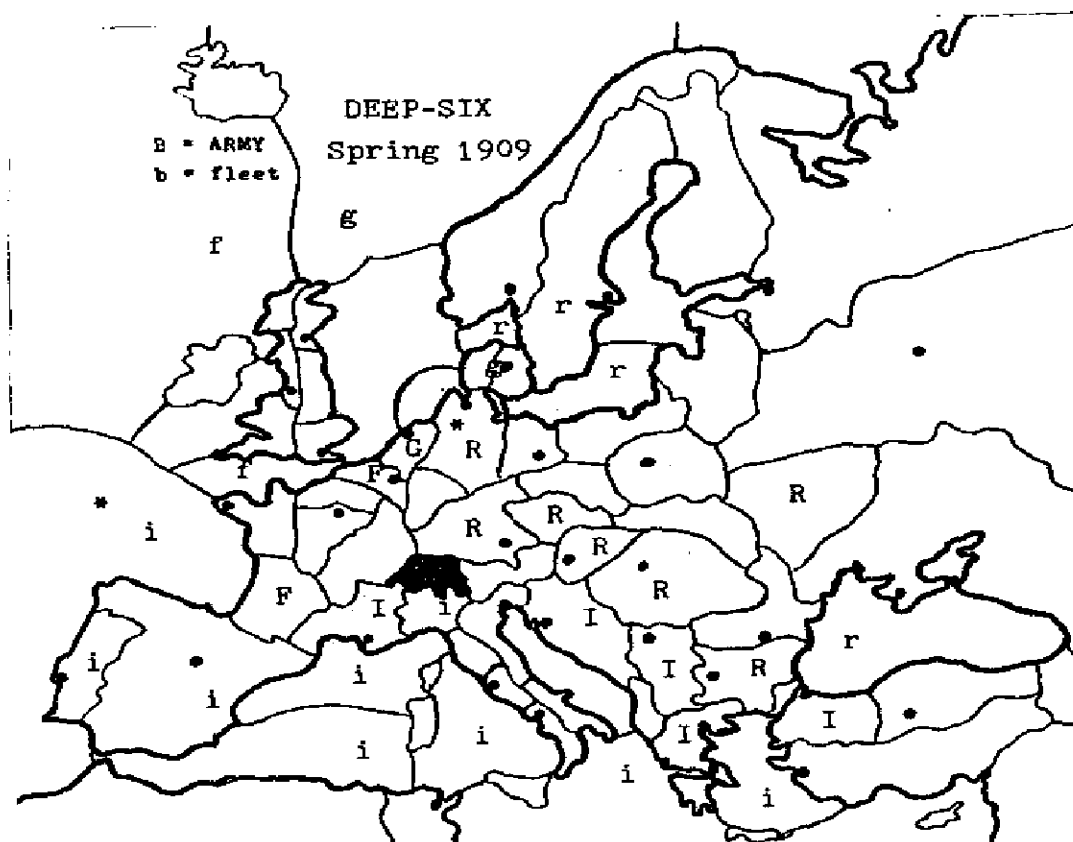

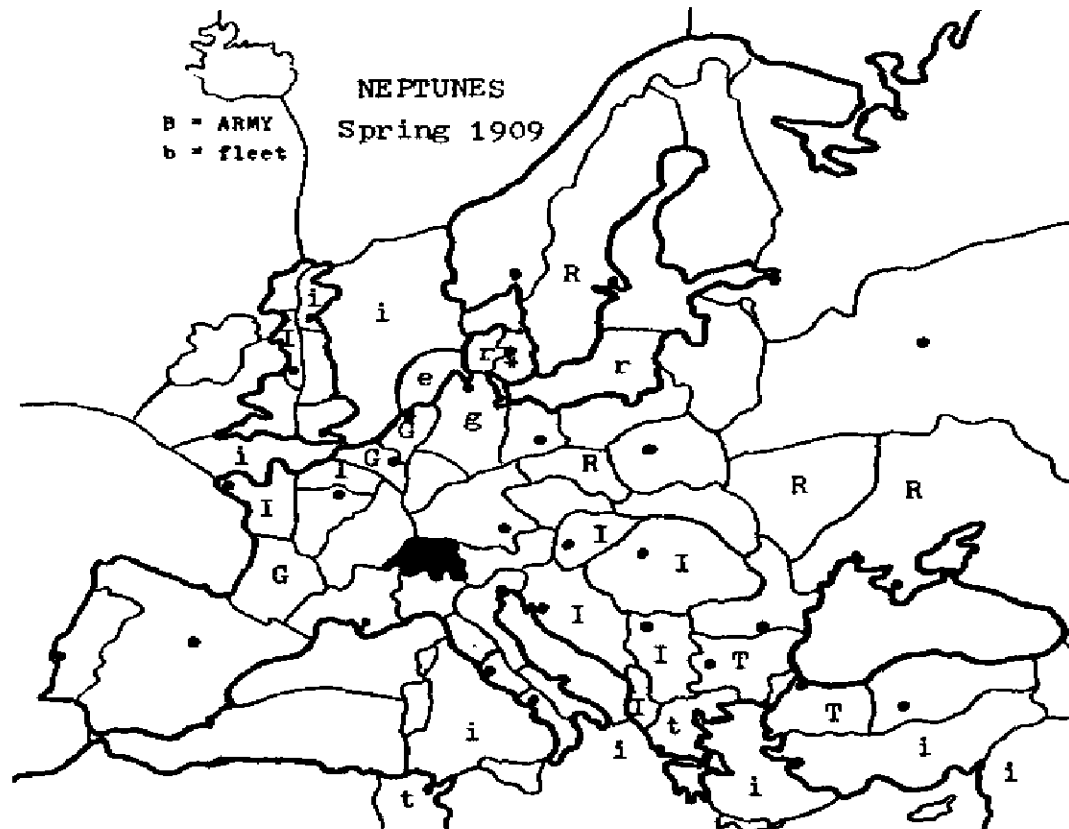

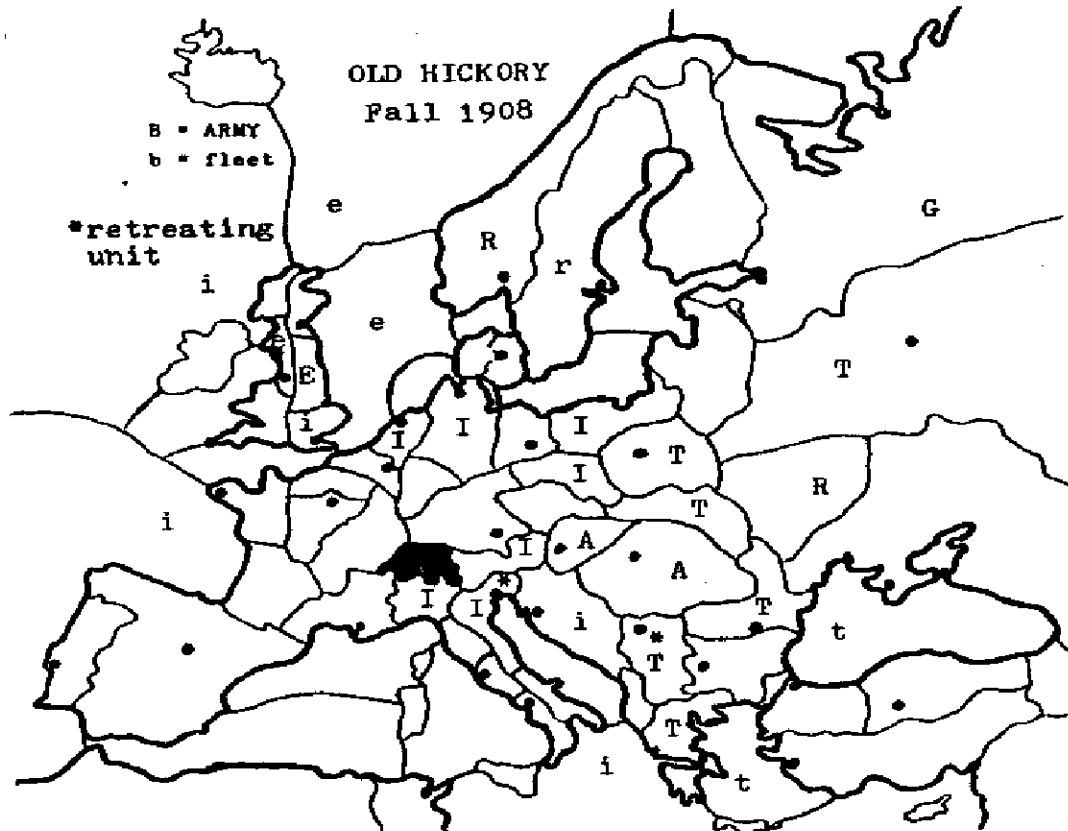

Pretoria-Peking: Don't worry about a RUS/USA attack. I think you will prove to be a tough nut to crack.

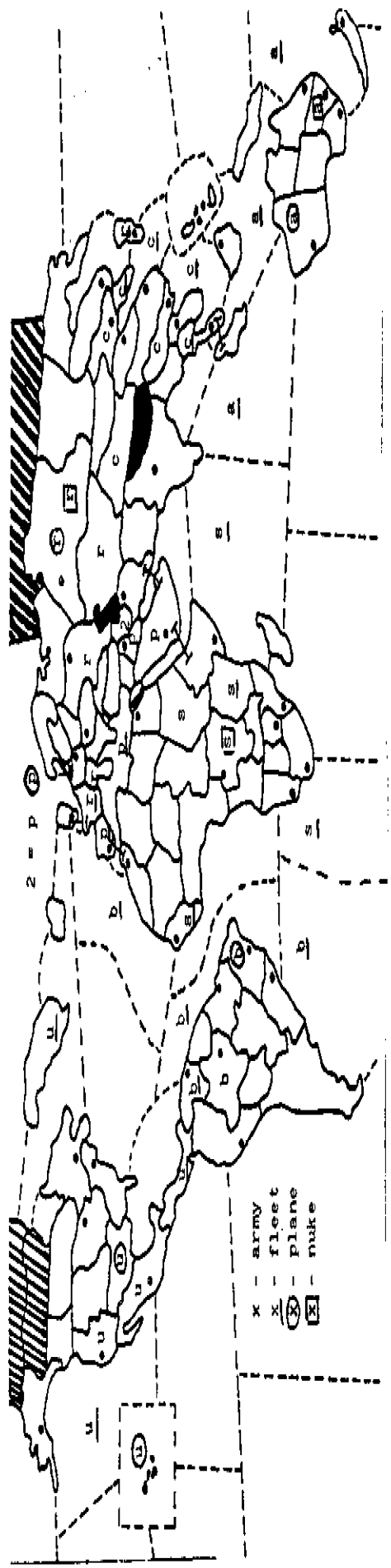
GM-World: One press article last issue was incorrectly typed. It read from 'Forbieen City' instead of 'Forbidden City'. I am very sorry to the author.

London Times, January 24th, 2102. "The politco-military position of the United States of North America is still uncertain this morning in the aftermath of the unexpected death of the President. The Vice-President is reportedly on his way to Washington from Alaska, and may take the oath of office en route. The Soviet Ambassador is expected to meet with the new President shortly after he arrives back in Washington."

Government Information Ministry press release, 2 February 2102: "In view of the increasingly unstable international situation, the Assistant Foreign Minister for African Affairs, Rafael Brites da Silva, arrived this afternoon in Pretoria, the capital of the South African Federation. On the top of Minister da Silva's agenda is our government's concern with the South African nuclear force and with the Pretoria regime's deep suspicions of our motives and goals. We devoutly hope for a peaceful resolution to the present situation."

Pretoria Free Press: March 12, 2102: The government announced today that it is embarking upon a new naval program, to be completed by next winter. This comes on the release of classified documents to the Free Press which indicate a lack of response from Brazil to diplomatic overtures. Similar plans to modernize the army were scrapped after a high-level summit between the South African Government and the Pan-Arab League.

No parades for WWII GI

FOR THE PAST few days, I have been reading about all these wonderful parades that the World War II veterans came home to. If there were any such parades, I would sure like to know where they were held.

When I arrived back in the States in early 1946 after three years in the Pacific, there was no one to meet me at the station. I threw my seabag on my shoulder and hiked five miles to my house. Many cars passed me, but nobody even offered to give me a lift.

I also don't know where all this rhetoric about watching John Wayne movies came from. We were too busy shooting at Japanese kamikaze aircraft and dodging submarine torpedoes to watch any movies.

I believe the Vietnam veterans' problem lies in that they were the ones watching John Wayne on the movie screen, single-handedly wiping out a Jap machine gun nest on Iwo Jima or blasting a Jap garrison in the Philippines. Naturally, he never got a scratch. The World War II propaganda movies glamorized war,

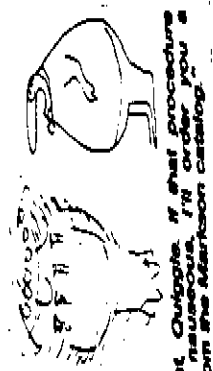
fare to such a degree that when the Vietnam War began, our soldiers thought that it was going to be "a piece of cake."

Regarding Tokyo Rose, she made our day. Not only did she give us a laugh, but we learned what was happening in our area of operations. War has never been a game, and the Vietnam soldier is no better than the veterans of World War II or the Korean conflict. I might add that

there were almost 100,000 missing World War II servicemen. I don't see anybody hunting for them — and by the way, where's our wall with more than 700,000 names on it? I think it's about time we had our day in court.

Let's hear it from more of the World War II vets. Did any of you guys ever get a parade?

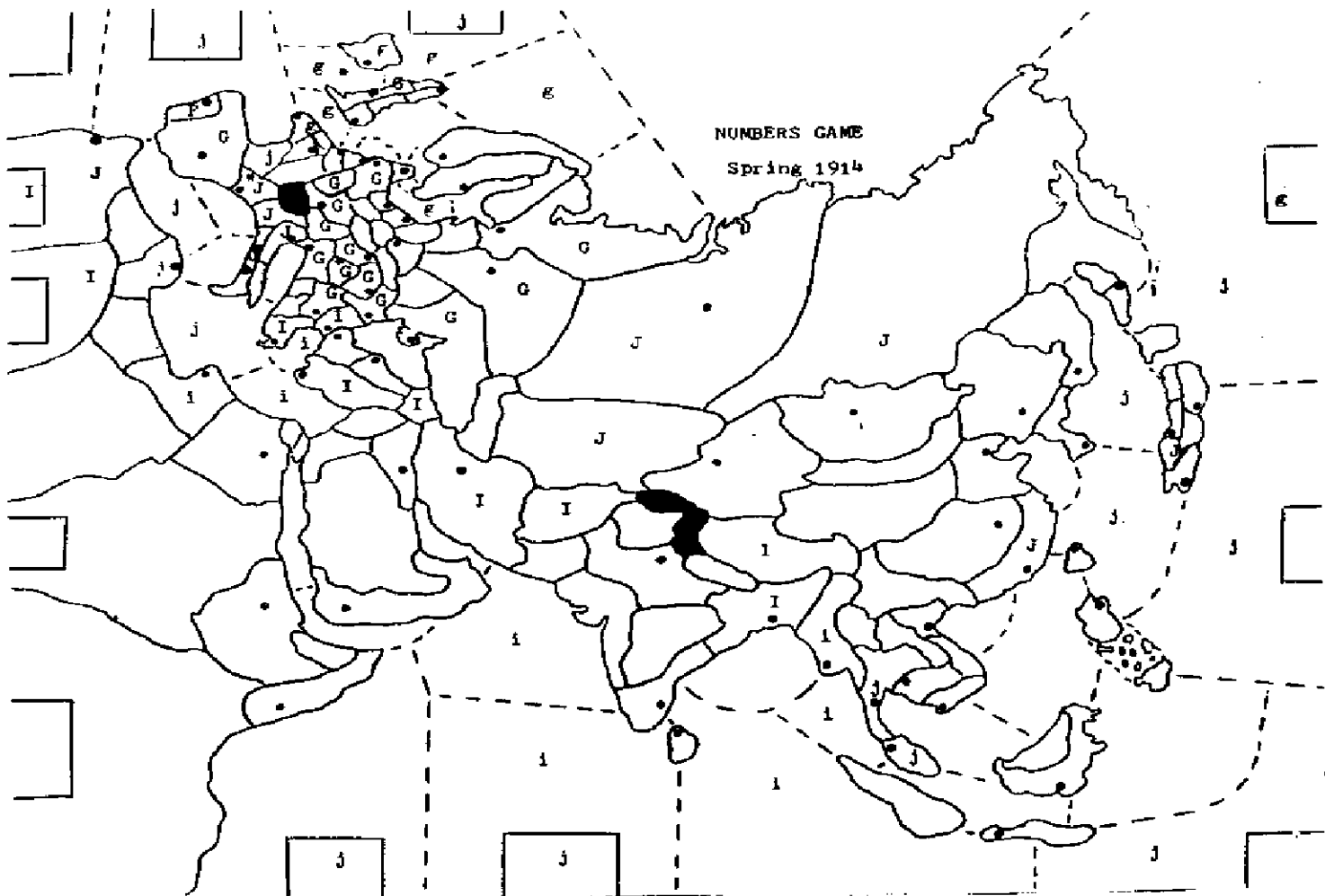

BABYLONIANS CHANGE LEADERS FOR THE FOURTH TIME

ITALY trades three cards worth ten points of which one is Papyrus, to THRACE for three cards worth fourteen points of which one is salt.

CRETE trades four cards worth sixteen points of which one is Spice, to EGYPT for four cards worth 13 points of which one is Wine.

EGYPT trades three cards worth 12 points of which one is Gold, to ASSYRIA for three cards worth 10 points of which one is Bronze.

ASSYRIA trades three cards worth 11 points of which one is Salt, to THRACE for three cards worth 10 points of which one is Grain.

___ you are still part of an unconfirmed trade.

I have four trades that are unconfirmed. One will be confirmed as soon as another is (i.e.-trade listed match, but one side does not have the cards said to be traded.)

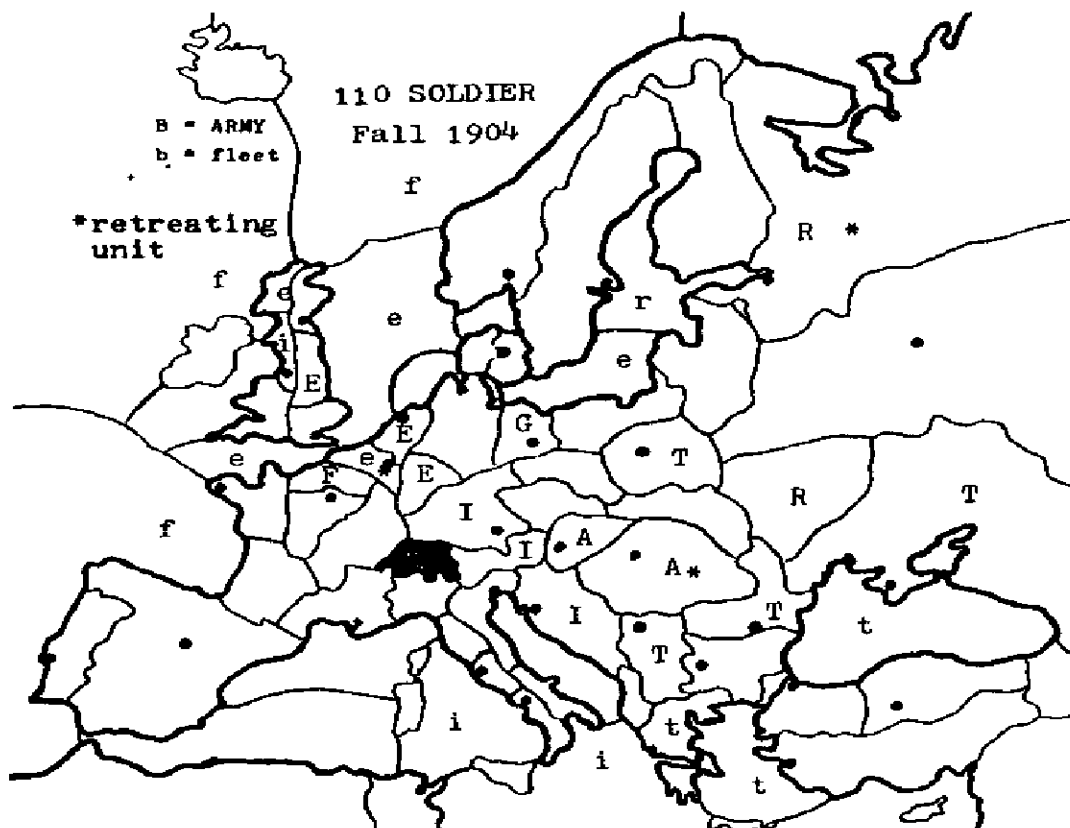
