Thank you very much for your patience. I did not receive a single phone call asking when the adjudications would be finished. Unfortunately, my thesis did not get finished in the time that I had alloted. I had some intense discussions with my committee for three days about my project. By advisor and myself wanted to stop where we were, while the other two members wanted me to continue and expand it into a PhD project. We came to a compromise, and so I spent the past month working 10-12 hour days to do that research. It is now completed, and I have begun writing my thesis. There is no big rush since I will not be defending until November. Turns will be a little late, but not as late as for this issue. The ban on phone moves is still in effect, but I will accept changes over the phone.

The players in Beethoven's Last need to look at the turn in this issue. Evidently most of the players did not receive Turn 120, based on the number of times and notes from players. I have updated the trades made and listed a new time date for Turn 126.

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The 1987 Runestone Poll is now history. The number of voters increased to 441 this year, up from the record of 265 set in 1985 and more than double the 211 of last year. California cast 48 ballots, followed by Illinois and New York at 32. The Appalachian General received 37 votes, although I was able to identify only 28 subscribers in the voter list. Eleven of those have now voted for three straight years. Eleven other people donated to the American Cancer Society Fund Drive, helping to raise more than \$1400 in pledges. (Naybe some of it will go towards my PhD research project.)

The TOP TEN in this years poll include: Costaguana, Blunt Instruments, Praxis, Europa Express, Diplomacy Horld, House of Lords, Redwood Curtain, The Canadian Diplomat, Magus, and Over There. While I have cut back on the number of zines I receive, four of the ones I have read over the past year were included. Several of these listed have already folded, and some are cutting back on frequency, so I expect a big change next year. The SECOND TEN this year includes: The Zine Register, Retaliation, Sleepless Knights, Cathy's Ramblings, Feuilletonist's Forum, Diplomacy Digest, Rebel, Frobozz, Perelandra, and Bushwacker. I receive only two of these.

The Appalachian General fell to a distant 31st this year from its high of 20 last year. I was a bit upset about this for a week or so, but I have decided not to let it bother me. Those subscribers that bother to give me individual comments are usually positive and very happy with how I run TAG. Most of the suggestions I have received for improving TAG would take it away from the warehouse format that I use, however a few recommendations were incorporated such as listing the addresses with each game and keeping the maps for gunboat games. I have about a 75% renewal rate, with some players subscribing as long as 10 issues waiting for a game opening. Marehouse zines traditionally finish in the middle of the poll, which is were it finished this year (55th percentile). I also did not push voting like I did in the past, and I noticed several people that voted the previous two years failed to vote this year.

The TCP FIVE subzines were High Inertia, Humboldt, The Mega-diplomat, Out To Pasture, and Fiat Bellum. The only one I have seen is this years winner of the Rookie of the Year, Life Goes On, produced by Robert Smith and appearing in Over There.

The TOP FIVE GMs were Andy Lischett, Lee Kendter Sr., Dick Martin, Gary Coughlan, and Jeff Richmond. I came in 23rd, down eight spots from last years 15th. I expected this because I made several rule interpretations on variants that some players did not like. A couple also got angry when they MMRed after the turns had been adjudicated and I would not re-adjudicate their games.

There are several interesting tidbits in The Cream Shall Rise #3, the tabloid in which these results appear. Host of it is different analyses of the results and some comments on it. There is not as much non-poll information as there has been in the past two years, but the different manipulations of the votes is interesting. The cost is only \$1 if you voted, \$2 if you didn't. One final comment. There is a small discussion in TCSP#3 about what the numbers mean. Is a "10" the best possible zine, or the best


you have seen this past year? The same for a "O"? Is a score of "5" average, or is some other number an indication of average? I think some explanation should be included in the ballots. Personally, I tend to vote a "5" as average. As a result, my votes are normally in the bottom 50% of the scores that those zines get. This year, I gave one "9", one "2", and the rest grouped around "6". While not everybody would follow the printed recommendations, I think it would help eliminate the inflated scores that we now see. From talking to some of my subscribers that voted, they feel the same way. For next years poll, I am going to make up a set of recommendations for voting for TAG. It will reflect this viewpoint. While I will probably place much lower than ever before, I think that it will be more useful in helping judge the players reactions to TAG.

found was in locating the book.



There has been a lot of confusion about where I live in Virginia. I am going try and clear some of this up give you a little history of my area.

Most of the confusion arises because of where I mail 7/3. have used several locations such as Blacksburg, Catawba, Christiansburg, and New Castle, but the most common is Newport. This is what causes the confusion. The most obvious thing when you look at a map of Virginia is the big black print on the shore of the Chesapeake Bay that screams out "NEWPORT MEWS". Naturally, everyone assumes that the Newport on the postage mark on TAG is the abbreviation. Unfortunately, this is not the case. If you will look at the enlarged map section (if it copied) below, at the junction of Route 460 and 42, you will see that there really is a "Newport", Virginia. This Newport is in western Virginia, almost within spitting distance of West Virginia. If you continue north on 42, you will come across Sinking Creek. Don't blink, or you might miss my house. Further north is New Castle, my mailing address. Backtracking to 460, if you head east you run into Blacksburg, which is where Sharyn and I work. As you can see, Newport is on the way. The reason I mail there is that TAG will not always fit into my home mailbox, and the drop hox in Newport is convenient.

Sinking Creek made the map because there is nothing else around. There is Maywood and Simmonsville (all three have the name on both sides of the same post), but Sinking Creek has the headwaters of Sinking Creek in addition to a store. The Great Eastern Divide runs along the ridge of the two mountains that form the valley we live in. From Big Mountain behind the house, you can see Best Virginia. Across the valley, the Appalachian Trail runs along that ridge. Audie Murphy was also killed in a plane crash just over the crest. It is a tiny community. Small farms dominate. Most of those that don't farm, work at Virginia Tech. The roads north drop over 500 feet in less than two miles, making travel in that direction hazardous and time consuming. The air is clear, the sound minimal, and the sky almost free of night lights. (Salen-Roanoke can usually be seen over the eastern parizon.)

Newport is the local town with the most history. It was

Newport is the local town with the most history. It was founded early in the 18th century, and quickly grew to a large town. Dy 1800, it was four times the size of any other town in western Virginia. It was the main stop for the stagecoach heading west. It was full of salens and brothels; business was very good. However, one cold winter night someone dumped their ashes to close to their house because they didn't want to get cold. The whole town burned down with the exception of the church. The townspeople took this as an omen, despite the fact that the church was over 100 yards from the town, and ran the "sinners" out of town. With no more draw, the town stagnated. Eventually, the stagecoach line was moved further south. The final straw occurred when 460 was upgrized to a four lane highway in the 1960's. The western end of town was demolished to make way for the road, and all economic activity

stopped. Now, all that is left is the new convenience store and a few beautiful big houses that were build after that Civil Nar.

Blacksburg is were Virginia Tech is located. Known mainly as an Agriculture & Engineering University, it has recently acquired a reputation as a school that loves to screw up in sports. Tech is frequently in the Top 20 in baseball, and only needs to win one game in the Metro Tournament to go the College World Series, but always blows it. We play great in baskethall until tournament time. And then there is football. We just finished our hest season ever, but in the process fired our coach, had him sue the school for \$1 million, and had two athletic directors resign. And this was a mediacre team; fur had teams thears the starting out of them.

Roanoke is the largest city in our area. It is the National Headquarters for Norfolk-Southern Railroad, the conglomerant that tried to buy ConRail last year. Other than that, it is a very boring place. The city was built by the railroad, and it is slowly dying by the railroad.

We are very isolated in this part of the country. We are five hours from Washington, about the same from Richmond. It is a major trip anyplace farther north. Our closest big cities are located in North Carolina; we are only one hour from the border. This is why I attend more Diplomacy Cons in NC than anyplace else. West there is nothing until you get to western West Virginia, and not much there. (That is where I grew up.) And so to satisfy my love of gaming, I turned to the mails.

To all of those that wanted to visit, and those who asked me to visit them. I hope this helps to explain my reluctance. If you still want to visit, just let me know. As long as you tell me in advance, and you really know where I live, you are welcome. It is beautiful country. Our county has only 2200 people, so you can get away from it all. The deer herd outnumbers the people. We have bear, turkey, and bobcat. There are some roads you can drive for miles without seeing anyhody. I love it here, and am not looking forward to our moving after I graduate.


