The deadline will remain on Saturdays for the time being and I will shoot to get the szine out the door early in the following week. That also means that NMR insurance calls will be made on the weekends.

Generally, when it appears, Peter Sullivan's subszine Octopus' Garden will go between the letter section of the szine and the games section.

#### WORLD DIPCON VI

ATTENDANCE – One of my major goals for WDC VI is to make it the first real "international" Diplomacy championship event. By that I mean an event in which no single national hobby dominates the event's gaming or other activities. WDC VI has the ability to be such an event, if things go well. ORIGINS should bring people to DC and WDC from outside the usual Diplomacy crowd that attends DIPCON. However, we heard that about DC held in San Francisco in conjunction with PACIFICON, and it didn't happen. I hope the people responsible for DC will put an effort into attracting non-Dippers, as well as diehard hobbyists, to the DC/WDC events. But that's not my concern. My job is to promote international participation in WDC.

I am not so idealistic as to believe that hundreds of foreign Diplomacy fans are going to pour into Columbus, even with a world championship title at stake. My goal is more modest. I hope to see at least two representatives from each national hobby and sub-hobby. Hopefully one of them will be a world class player and one will be a hobby organizer or publisher who can take the story of WDC VI back home and spread the news of the event. What does this mean in real terms? If DC/WDC attracts 100 participants, about the same as Paris, that would mean about 28 of them should be foreign. I would like to see at least two foreigners at every game table during the tournament. That would be enough to give the event an international flavor. Is that possible? I think so.

Anyone who has the money can attend WDC on their own, of course, but for most hobbyists that is not possible. My hope is that these people will pool their resources and raise money to send at least one representative to the event. Major Diplomacy events, and national hobby organizations may be able to help. A group of two, four, or seven (or more) can bring individual costs down considerably. Shared travel and housing expenses can save money. I'll have more information on that in future e-grams.

AND IF YOU CAN'T GO? - You can still participate in WDC VI. First, you can pre-register even if you don't plan to attend. Doing so will get you all the pre-event publications and a copy of the event program and report, as well as access to any publications used in the Con's WDC events. However, you won't be able to vote in the meetings. You can contribute articles and other materials for those WDC events. And, if our plans go well, you'll be able to participate in a special internet WDC activity.

FINANCES – I find it hard to believe that WDC has survived this long without a charter, organization, or reliable funding source. The only other example of such a thing that comes to mind is the early Christian church, and even it had the wealthy widows of Rome to keep it afloat. Still, one of the jobs that goes with being WDC host is that of passing the hat to collect donations to support the event's costs. So, I'm passing the hat.

When I hosted DC in San Diego some years ago I figured it cost me about as much as I collected in fees and donations (excluding the prize pool which was worth several thousand dollars) from those attending. I wanted that event to be something special, and I was willing and able to make it so. But this year there will be no free tee shirts or banquet unless you want them and you are willing to pay for them. My financial commitments to WDC are already at the limit.

When I presented the American bid to host this event I made certain commitments to the Paris meeting because I believed they were both right and necessary. First, I committed us to sending the champion of our event to the next WDC event. Now you know why I am hoping for a Norwegian winner in Columbus, and a Oslo site in 1997! Secondly, I committed us to provide housing, etc. for the visit of last year's winner to Columbus. The French manufacturer of Diplomacy is providing transportation to bring him here, as well as the collection of games he won as part of his prize. Can you imagine Avalon Hill doing that, even if they could? This expense has already been covered by donations, as long as I haven't maxed out my credit cards before the Con. Thirdly, Francois Rivasseau and I have donated a rather grand perpetual trophy that will go to each year's winner on a rotating basis. Hockey, a game not to be mentioned in the same breath as Diplomacy, has its Stanley Cup; and yachting has its America's Cup; which the Kiwis stole from us, but that's another story:-) A major symbol of the WDC championship is a key element of the legitimization of the event and hobby. So, these are where my resources are going.

Now, you see why I am passing the hat. My philosophy, unlike some in the American hobby, is that

### GOODBYE PARIS, HELLO COLUMBUS

I have been officially informed that our bid to host WDC VI in Columbus, Ohio, next 4-7 July was accepted by the Paris assembly. Now begins the work of putting together that event.

### WDC VI ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

WDC VI will be held as part of ORIGINS/DIPCON. The DIPCON Administration Committee consists of Bruce Reiff, Chairman, and members Dan Mathias (scoring system designer) and Steve Cooley. They will be providing the individual, team, gunboat and variant Diplomacy gaming events for WDC. The WDC Administration Committee consists of myself, as Chairman, Bruce Reiff, and Bjorn von Knorring, of Sweden, as members. We will be responsible for the non-gaming aspects of WDC. In addition, the Paris meeting established a WDC Advisory Committee consisting of myself, as chair, Bruce Reiff, Tomas Larsson (Sweden), Samy Malki (France), Shaun Derrick (UK), and Brendan Whyte (NZ) to provide advice to future WDC hosts and help promote the event on an international level.

In addition I have established a WDC Hobby Contacts Network to promote WDC among the various national and sub-hobbies. I hope there will be at least two representatives from each hobby as part of this group. A complete list of its members is in CONTACTS, the WDC mailing list. Finally, this e-mail newsletter is being distributed directly by me and indirectly by others throughout the hobby.

It is fitting, and not very surprising, that our first foreign registrant for WDC VI is (drum roll please...) Bruno-Andre Giraudon, the current individual world Diplomacy champion! I urge the rest of you to pre-register as soon as possible. Remember the cut-off date is 1 June for pre-registation. Until then you pay US\$13. After that and at the door you will pay US\$38! Cash or international money orders please. Remember, also, that pre-reg is your best guarantee at a shot at inexpensive housing for the event. If you need a copy of the pre-reg form let me know.

a world class event can't be done on the cheap, and I expect the American hobby, as well as those foreign hobbyists who can, to assist us. By the way, I don't plan to rely exclusively on donations to fund this year's event. I have some fund-raising ideas in mind as well.

CONTRA TEMPS - Many of the foreigners going to Paris last December were worried about how the French players would conduct themselves (as individuals or as a faction) during the tournament. This concern arose after events in Birmingham the year before. However, the French hobby came up with a very good solution, and things seem to have worked out for the best. This year the foreigners are worried about the "unknown" scoring system proposal for the tournament. Their fear is that an unknown scoring system will discriminate against them, or be so ridiculous as to make the championship meaningless. More than one foreigner has stated that they won't come to WDC unless they know the scoring system well in advance of the event.

I remember the controversy over the scoring system I used at DC in San Diego, even though I had stated what it would be and the philosophy behind it prior to the event. I swore after that that I would never get involved in a scoring system debate again! Naturally I was delighted that the DC people would be running the tournaments and providing the scoring system. That meant I didn't have to worry about it. So much for that. As I stated in the bid package, I have seen the scoring system to be used. I think it is adequate. Indeed, it is somewhat comparable to the system used in Paris. I have asked a respected American hobbyist with considerable world class tournament experience as both a tournament director and player to examine both systems and give me an opinion on them. I'll keep you informed on that. In the meantime, if you have concerns about the scoring system I suggest you direct them to Bruce Reiff or Dan Mathias.

MORE THAN JUST A GAME! - As I said above, I hope to make WDC VI the first real international Diplomacy event. My second goal is to make it more than just a gaming event. Most past WDCs have stressed the gaming aspect of the event with an individual championship, a team championship (team play is more popular in Europe than the States but we're working on that), a gunboat championship, a variant championship, etc. Second came personal interactions, tourist sight-seeing, etc.

My goal is to elevate the educational element of WDC to a status co-equal with the gaming element. I believe WDC can and should be a major element in improving individual Diplomacy skills in a non-confrontational manner, and in developing and promoting the hobby at the international and national levels. Sound good? But how?

At the moment I only have time and space to sketch out my idea. I hope for considerable feedback from all of you concerning my idea. Depending on that feedback and the assistance I get in preparing this program I will scale it up or down in size to fit the available time and interest shown.

I would like, as I have said before, to add a day or two to the DC events planned for Columbus. Most of the gaming events are planned for the 5th, 6th, and early on the 7th (Friday through Sunday) with a round of the individual tournament each day, and (I assume) the other gaming events in the evening. Nothing wrong with that. I hope most of the out-of-town visitors will be coming to Columbus on the 3rd, so they can attend that night's fireworks show. I would like to use part of the 3rd, the 4th, and what's left of the 7th after the gaming events (and perhaps the 8th as well since many foreigners won't be leaving before then) for some non-gaming activities in the areas of personal skills development, WDC improvement, and hobby development.

My past Con experiences and what I have been seeing in the WWPDC event (a 7 game postal tournament with teams from 7 different hobbies) is that there is a considerable difference in how the various national hobbies play the game. There's nothing wrong with that, but we need to be aware of it. In addition, I would like to see the WDC adopt a set of guidelines, or standards, to serve as a guide to any future WDC hosts. To that end I am asking the members of the Advisory Committee to conduct an evaluation of the first five WDC events. Finally, I believe there is a lot we can collectively do to develop (meaning improve and expand) the hobby at both the international and national levels. I'll have more on this in the White Paper.

# LAST NOTES

I have to confess that I crashed the hard drive on my first attempt at this newsletter. I was almost done, too! :-( Anyway, I didn't have any real notes or outline of what I was going to say, so I hope I've remembered everything that I wanted to cover. But not to worry, there'll be more along soon. One last item, and a rather important one at that. As you know this year's WDC event will be held in early July,

barely seven months after last December's WDC in Paris. Seven months is not enough time to prepare and host a world class Diplomacy event, especially given the limitations our hobby faces. It is the opinion of the last WDC host and the most probable hosts for the next WDC, as well as myself, that a WDC site should be selected two years in advance in order to give the future hosts adequate time to prepare for the event, and allow other events to schedule themselves so that they don't conflict with a WDC event. (Consider the EDC being held the week before WDC this year.)

Therefore, I am, by virtue of whatever authority I have, declaring that bids will be accepted in Columbus, Ohio in July, 1996, at the WDC Society Meeting, for both the 1997 and 1998 WDC events. Any site, other than North America, is eligible to bid for 1997. Any region, other than that of the 1997 selectee, is eligible to bid for 1998. Any individual or organization interested in submitting a bid for either 1997 or 1998 should contact me immediately for guidance as to what information will be required as part of the bid package.

As practiced in both Birmingham and Paris, the 10 votes maximum per national delegation will be used. This is to provide a more balanced voting, and prevent the host hobby from dominating the voting. However, in true Stalinist tradition, I am prepared to recognize the following as national delegations: USA, CSA, Texas, California, and Hawaii! Just kidding, folks! Wanted to see who's reading this.

### THAT'S ALL FOLKS!

OK, now it's your turn. I'm looking for ideas and volunteers for WDC VI. A little cash would be nice as well.

((I do strongly believe in the promotion of this event. Thus, I will continue to print Larry's newsletter here. I think it would be a good idea as people decide to go for them to let Larry know so he can let us all know how the attendance list is shaping up. I'm going to have a difficult schedule, but I will make every effort to make it if I can. I especially like Larry's ideas for educational activities or personal/hobby growth interaction. I would encourage response (either here or to Larry) to some of the suggestions there. Lastly, when Larry asks for money a lot of us (me included) get nervous, yet I am sensitive to how much it costs to do these sorts of things, so I've published Larry's request as is. I think he goes awfully far with his hyperbole on how the hobby surviving without a treasury as an anarchy being a one in 2000 years event, but that's only my opinion. Oh yeah, Texas IS its own country and don't you forget it!!!))

## Album of the year:

Massive Attack v The Mad Professor/No Protection [Wild Bunch/Circa] – The remixed version of last year's album Protection, and it seemed to sum up many of the tendencies working in what for want of a more appropriate term we'd still better call "dance music". More specifically, all the trip-hop stuff: deep dub reggae bass, distorted hip-hop beats, jazz inflections, techno arrangements, ambient sound-effects. You get everything from deeply soulful vocals to cavernous reverb workouts, often in the space of a single track. Adventurous but very listenable.

## Some more goodies:

Faust/Rien [Table of the Elements] – Reformed legendary Krautrockers from the 70s, in the company of fashionable types like Jim O'Rourke. Carefully-constructed noise/rock that veers from rhythmic riffing to abstract road-drill stabs. Far better than that just made it sound. (Cool packaging too: plain silver booklet and disc; all the credits are spoken at the end of the cd.)

Labradford/A Discrete Reference [Flying Nun] - The new space-rock, grown out of Mid-West lo-fi grunge and now taking flight (see also Tortoise, Cul de Sac, Space Needle, Ui, Jessamine...). Twanging guitars over cavernous echoing bass, like the soundtrack to a PBS special on Russia; abandoned space program.

Nonplace Urban Field/Nuf Said [Incoming!] - Loping slo-mo spaghetti western techno dub with hints

everyone from Can to Portishead.

Sketch/Reasons to Sway [Apollo] - More ambient dub techno, betraying its Norwegian source, with limpid keyboard drips set amidst marshy bird calls and spring mist atmosphere.

Softcore/Softcore [Fax] - Spacial and suiggly ((sic)) ambient/electronic music that gently insinuates the

strangest noises into your consciousness.

Stereolab/Refried Ectoplasm [Duophonic] - ((I actually own this one too!!)) A collection of early singles crammed full of perfect dronepop. ((Yeah, yeah, love that dronepop!!)) Organ riffs, Krautrock "motorik" rhythms, cool as hell French female vocals: drop-dead great.

Tricky/Maxinquaye [4th & Broadway] - Shivering schizophrenic trip-hop, slowed down beats and slurred samples, underlaying whispered tales of desperate relationships. (And the best Public Enemy cover version

ever.)

Ultrahigh/The View of Ultrahigh [Force Inc] - Enormously "fat" sounding German techno, all hippo-

assed squelching and soaring air-horn riffs. A real thumper.

The Young Gods/Only Heaven [Play It Again Sam] – Only a drummer, sampler and singer and they are still the best rock band I know. Here they're very much back on form, and veer between crunching industrial slamming and bleeping space shuttle dubs.

Single of the year:

DJ Shadow/"What Does Your Soul Look Like?" [Mo'Wax] – A brilliant half-hour, stretched-out triphop symphony (oh yuck, Marc!). Distant radio interference, a loop from Metallica's delicately-picked intro to "One", hip-hop drums fading into a solitary jazz saxophone, some gentle voices, more radio interference... and that's just part one of four. It's a real ride. And it's what the trendy types will all be raving about in '96 when Shadow's album finally appears.

More single goodies:

The Chemical Brothers/"Leave Home" [Virgin] - The fashionable end of dance this year, slow and bass-heavy with monster beats and sampled guitar.

Dreadzone/"Little Britain" [Virgin] - That off-kilter dance from Orff's Carmina Burana sampled over light jungle beats and ragga toasting, a delightful summation of multi-cultural Britain (far more real than so-called Britpop anyday).

The Future Sound of London/"Far Out Sons of Lung & the Ramblings of a Madman" [Virgin] - Jazz-

techno sound experiments; remarkably popular.

Mouse on Mars/"Bib" [Too Pure] - German jungle techno pop; great fun with noises.

Alanis Morrisette/"You Gotta Know" [Maverick] - The album is way too Sheryl Crow-plays-Tori Amos for me but this single is really impressive. "I'm sorry to bug you in the middle of dinner" says so much to me.

Super Cat/"My Girl Josephine" [Columbia] - Cheap ragga pop; I just adore the trademark tatty drum sound and the joyous syncopation.

Tricky/"Black Steel" [4th & Broadway] - Rock music for beard-strokers and odd little black elf-girls.

Urusei Yatsura/"Siamese" [Che] - There's a new UK lo-fi underground growing in the populist shadow of Britpop; these are my favourites, with a scratchy manifesto that's charming in its naivety. (From Glasgow not Osaka, by the way; the name's from a Japanese manga anime.)

The Young Gods/"Kissing the Sun" [PIAS-be] - My own soundtrack to the Bohemian Rhapsody

sequence from "Wayne's World".

Pop magazine:

Ben is Dead [usa] - The most fun, especially the kiddle nostalgia summer special, but only narrowly beating the similarly obsessive but over-trendy Grand Royal.

Pop book:

Julian Cope/Krautrocksampler [Head Heritage/Kak] - A pretty complete guide to German spacerock 1968-76, and a really charming book too. My wants list doubled overnight, and the ones I did have got pulled out for further listening immediately. Like he's sat next to you in the pub, filling your ear with enthusiasm.

#### Weird shit:

[Okay, Jim, I know you like to hear this sort of stuff. This year I've chanced upon three very good sources of diabolical/kitsch old records, and now every week I seem to add to the collection. It's kind of weird to be buying vinyl again, even with a 50p (70=A2) price limit... Among the year's worst/best were:

Various Artists/Believercise: Choreographed Exercise to Contemporary Gospel Hits [Word] — Magnificently dreadful Christian aerobics instruction record, with some poor woman bellowing "and up, and down, and up, now you are truly doing the work of the Lord" over bad Amy Grant songs. ((Hyork, hyork, hyork... this one really cracked me up!!))

Tom Glazer & Dottie Evans/Energy & Motion Songs [Motivation] – Cheesy educational album full of songs about different types of energy; clunky lyrics and samba rhythms galore.

The Hiltonaires/Beatles Hits in the Glenn Miller Sound [Stereo Gold Award] & Count Basie & his Orchestra/Basie's Beatles Bag [Music for Pleasure] – Two nasty takes on classic Beatles tunes, usually playing the fast ones slow and the ballads too fast.

Various Artists/How to Get the Most Out of Your Stereo [Warner Bros] - Delightful 1959 collection of spacially-separated cocktail tunes and exotica (lush strings and jungle noises), with a dopey Spike Jones thing about beatniks stuck on the end, all wrapped up in a disgracefully sexist cover. ((Yup, I knew someone who had this record when I was in college. This really sounds great at three o'clock in the morning when you're trying to motivate someone to drive you to the diner...))

Ray Martin & Orchestra/ The Sound of Sight [Decca] – From 1963, a wonderful collection of pre-ambient musical soundtracks that are meant to tell a whole story. Includes a detective story, space mission, whaling fleet, Egyptian pyramid builders and more. Very ahead of its time; very kitsch.

Czerwono Czarni/untitled [Muza] – And from 1966, Poland's top beat combo, The Red & Blacks, with a selection of rickety beat boom tunes – including the (surely not, surely not!) track "Dad, Buy Me Some Jeans"!

As always, I'll stick a couple of tapes in the post with examples of all of the above and more (all part of the Frank's APA music circuit, so don't worry about excessive effort on my part). ((Thank you, thank you, thank you!!!))

Thanks for the rave review of Ho-Bloody-Ho. I thought it was pretty good too, and the feedback has generally been very good. I'm especially glad you "appreciated" the jungle track. Surprised you hadn't heard Whigfield before; she's a tacky Scandinavian euro-popster who's just about transcended her first couple of irritating dance/pop hits. Also, the song itself was a #1 for Wham for ages in the early 80s... And yeah, next year I'm going to bust a gut ensure you get the tape in plenty of time to review it before January.:-) ((That would be great!))

Got to dash. I'm finishing rewriting my Net-for-Kids book for the US, and I'm just hanging around waiting for Penguin NY to email me back with the final set of corrections. I'll send this now and see it they've come through yet.

Wally Pleasant Houses of the Holy Moly, Eve's Plum Cherry Alive, Sonic Youth Washing Machine, PJ Harvey To Bring You My Love, and Tuscadero The Pink Album. Check 'em out, though Tuscadero and Wally Pleasant are hard to find (Tuscadero is on Teen Beat while Wally's CD is self-released – you'll probably have to write to him personally for a copy, or muck to Michigan to get it). ((Mark Luedi, where are you... Mark runs a record shop in Michigan...))

Now, the harder question: why these CDs? GBV and Elastica have that short-song, post-punk pop thing down to a "T". Make your musical point and move on, Sonic Youth is Sonic Youth, enough said. PJ Harvey is incredible, as she's completely changed what she's doing – and it's still great. Tuscadero is a witty, loud bunch out of Washington with good, catchy songs. Eve's Plum is similar (I like female vocalists). ((I do too, but the proliferation of breathy, same-sounding songs is starting to get to me. Most of it bores me right now.)) That leaves Wally Pleasant. He's just a cool neurotic singer-songwriter. Song titles include: "Post Graduate Overeducated Out of Work Blues," "Dysfunctionally Yours," "Denny's at 4 AM," and "Stupid Day Job." ((I can see how lots of us would make clear connections with these songs...))

Other things I dig: Veruca Salt, Minerva Strain, Drugstore, Jennifer Tryrin, Superchunk, Letters to Cleo, Sleeper, Dish, Echobelly, ZZ Brides, and That Dog.
