Area bar show: Digger Jones at the Rail House, Waverly NY, Mar. 15. Blues-rock, roots-rock, great originals and old old songs and groovy Dead.

Area festival: Susquehanna River Big Splash, at Marvin Park, Owego NY, May 24-25. Two stages so I heard parts of 16 bands, including Band of Strings' first show after a nine-month hiatus. Bands based on Donna the Buffalo and the Horseflies, and many local friends, made the whole weekend great fun.

National act in the area: Hot Tuna, with Donna the Buffalo, at State Theatre, Ithaca NY, Dec. 5. After 45 years, Jorma Kaukonen and Neal Casady and friends still have spirit and skill. Sometimes they play acoustic duo shows but this was their five-piece electric version, with over a dozen string instruments being played.





Up above in parentheses is the card you played to get to where you are in the field. The replenishment card is the last card in your list. Be careful to note that the card you played (the one in parentheses) is not available for you, for next turn. Just for fun, I keep track of total replenishment, by turn, which is a rough measure of how the teams are doing. Of course, it is lining up to get across the sprint (40/80) and final (120) lines in the right places that really counts. We can calculate an "efficiency score" later, which will be the ratio of scoring points per replenishment. If I'm predicting how the future of this will come out based on doing this before, about half the players will get scores below 5% and getting better than a 10% score will be really tremendous for this measure.

2) So, the pack continues to lurch very slowly toward the finish line. But this turn the pack reformed so that will change. Someone may finish in Turn 15 now, we'll see.
