So, on this day, one month past the 58th Birthday that Don Williams didn't get to, I was hoping to give a little bit better update on Mark Fassio's progress. And of course my progress has been amazing.

I wish I could pass some of my success to Mark. Good thoughts from all of you can't hurt either.

Pray for him please that he may get back on the eating path!
