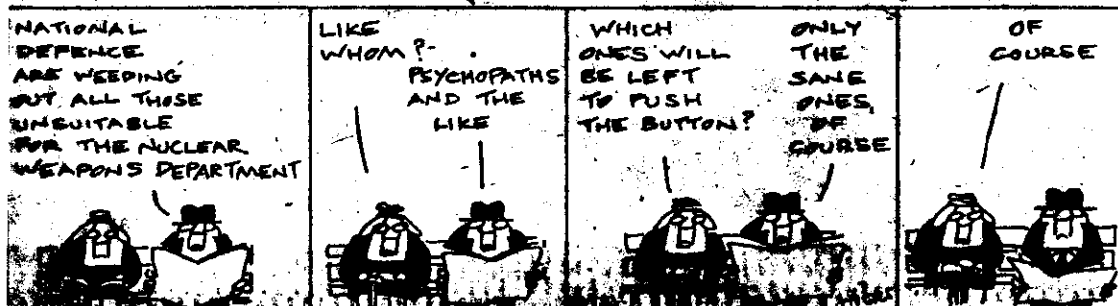

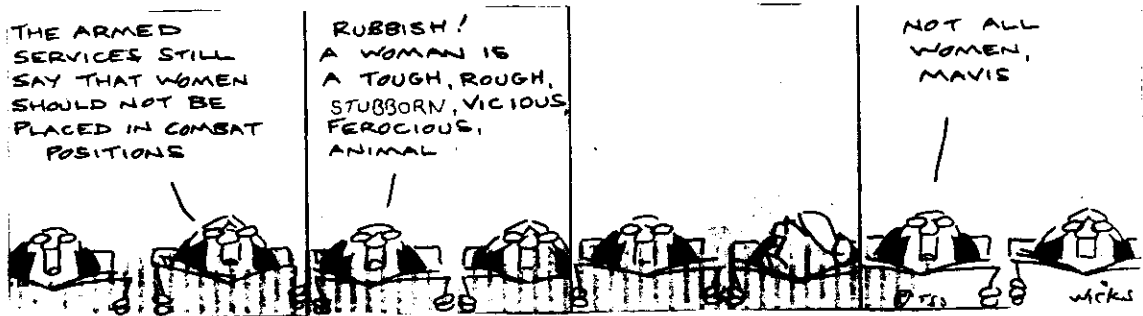

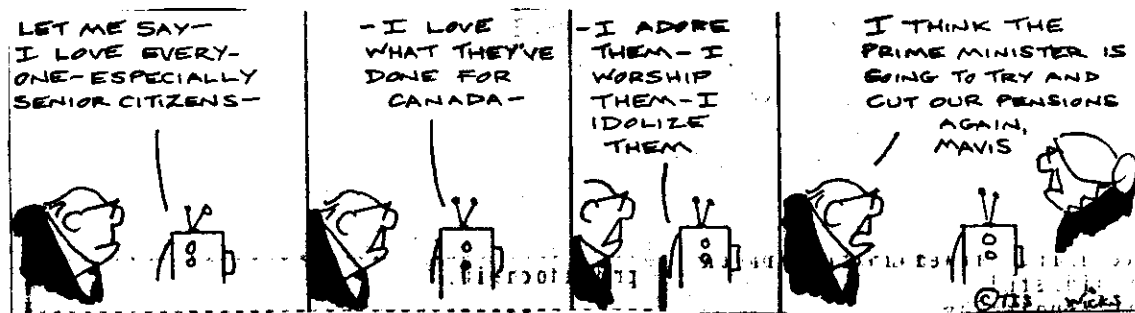


CANADIAN CONTENT

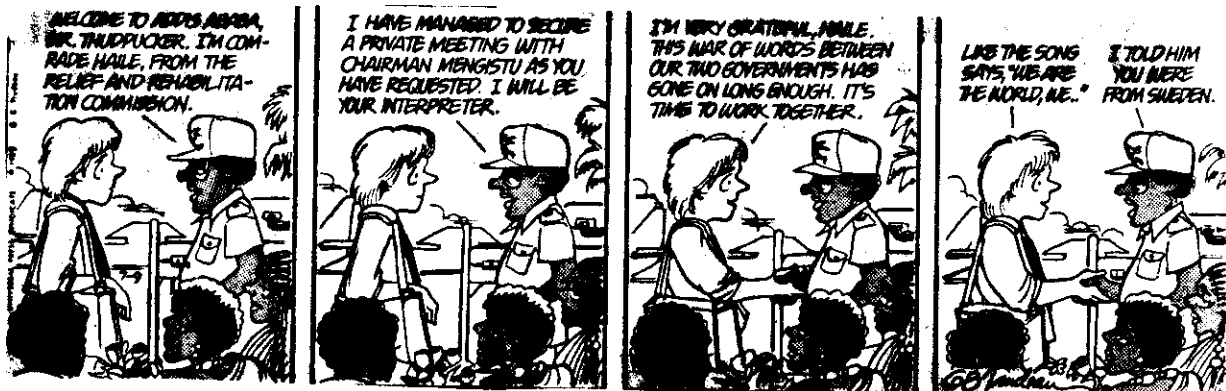
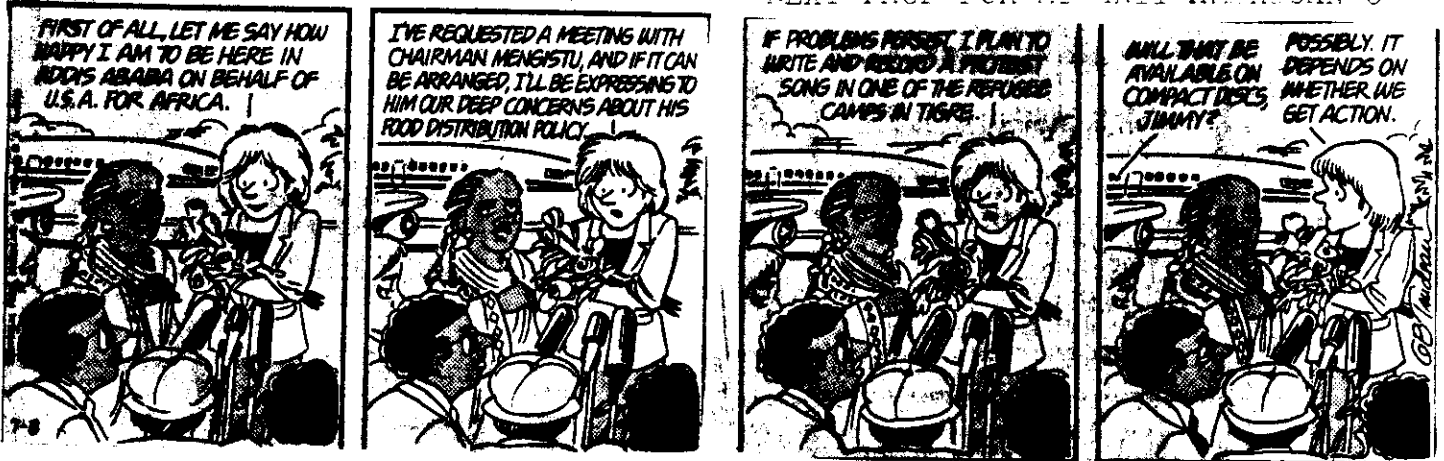

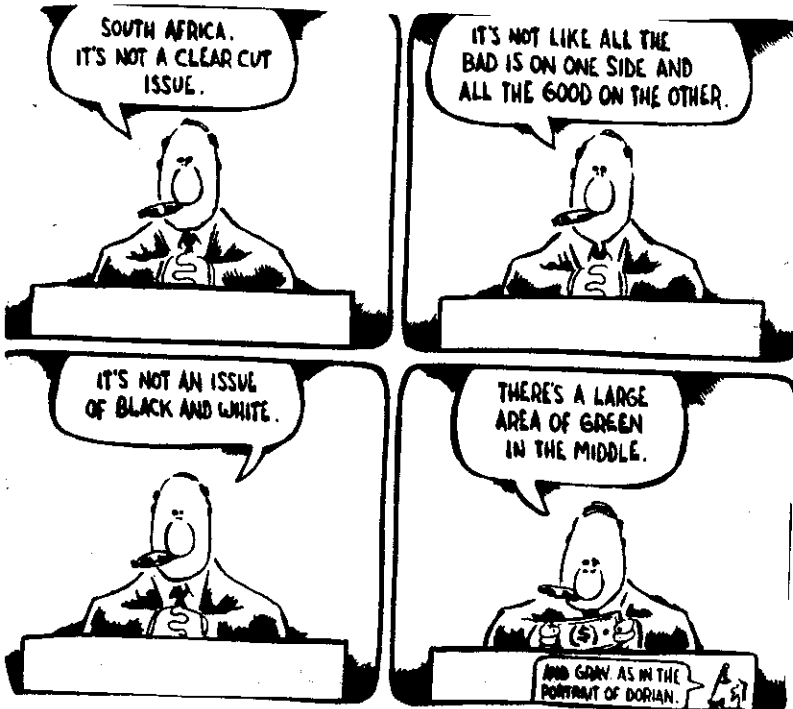

I believe you to be a cross-gamer and I have no stomach for that because it ruins the hobby. You've been in diplomacy a long time, perhaps too long? XXXXX is gone - what is your excuse now?

The only reason you stay with one ally throughout the game is that you're too damn lazy to write to the other players. If that isn't so, then prove it. I want Mexico City back, make me an offer.

ZZZZZZZ

Now, I will have to admit that I'm not one of Diplomacy's premier letter writers. But, after my initial amusement at this letter, I decided to write an article about it. Maybe some of our newer subscribers might benefit from it.

SOME BASIC RULES TO FOLLOW

- No. 1. Do not insult your opponents, even though you may remain enemies for the duration of that particular game. At some point in the future you may meet up with the particular player again. Yesterdays enemy could become tomorrows ally!
- No. 2. In my opinion a good letter writer will not make demands. It's much easier to accept another players suggestions if thats what they're written as. An ally or puppet that you make demands of is a resentful ally and likely to strike at some point.
- No. 3. If you want a favour, i.e. support, from an ally, then you should have something to offer in return. Your prospective ally (ies) don't want generalities offered in return, be specific.
- No. 4. If possible, offer your potential ally options. Sometimes your plan of action isn't in the best interests of your potential ally, and through communication he/she may have a better plan.
- No. 5. Don't give up on an opponent because you've become to a standstill. Even though it may not always work, persistence may pay off later in the game. Peter Fuchs is a good example of this, even though I've opposed him in several games he's always writing, making suggestions, listing options. (I hope that you've no objections to me using your name here, Peter)
- No. 6. Unless your planning to make a stab, keep your agreements if possible. Some players keep (most) all correspondence received during the course of a game, and if you make promises that you can't, don't keep, they could come back to haunt you.
- No. 7. Finally, take the postal services into consideration. If the player that your writing too is located across the continent, then an early letter after you receive your results is in order. You can always follow it up with a more concise one later.
