Houserule Clarifications

First, the last set of houserules did not have neutral orders for Spring 1901 for Turkey. They are:

F ANK-COM, A SMY H, A CON-BUL.

Second, a question was asked about NHRs. It takes 2 consecutive NHRs to lose a position, although I will call a standby after the first NHR. This will allow a country to go unordered for only 1 season (assuming the standby responds). Also, even though neutral orders are provided for Spring 1901, a player who does not sand Spring 1901 still NHRs, even if he just wanted to use the neutral orders.

Thirdly, I must remind all players that if <u>The Diplomat</u> is excessively late in arriving, it is your responsibility to call me to get the position. And believe me, the post office does mess up on occasion.






