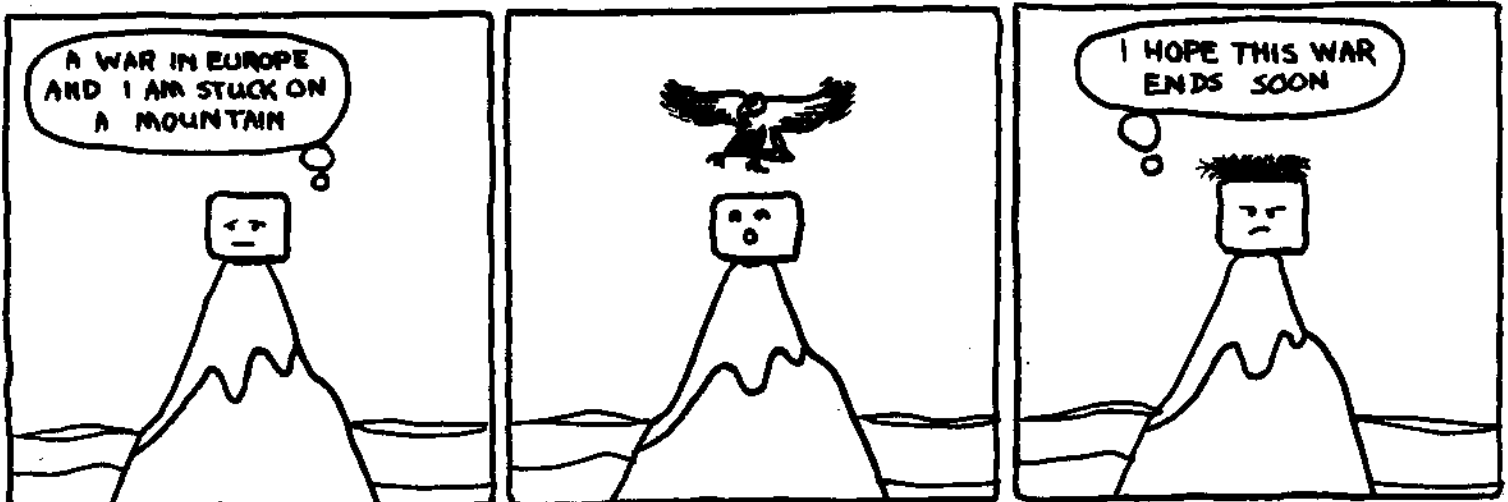
## Notes from the Publisher

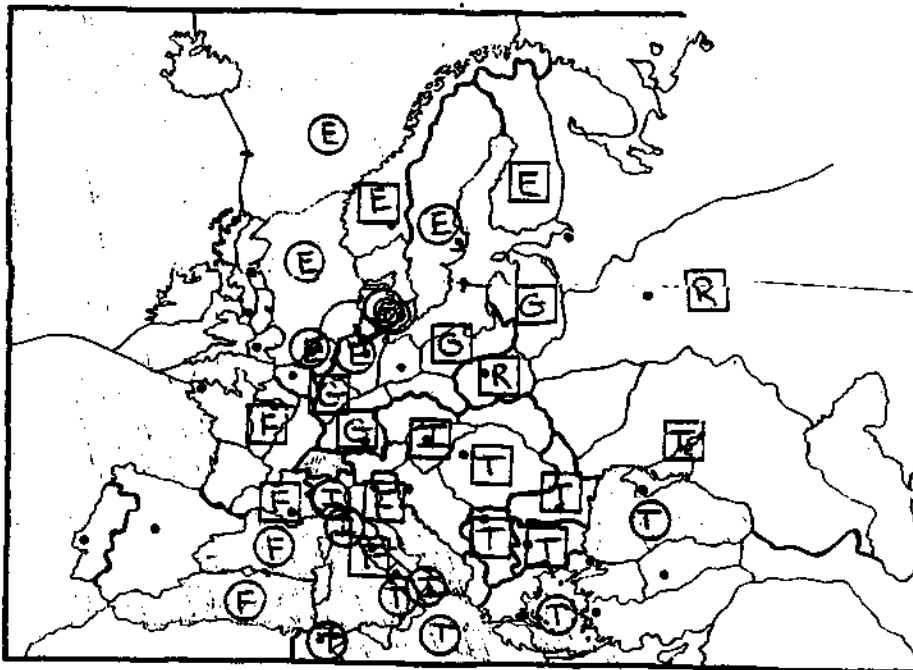

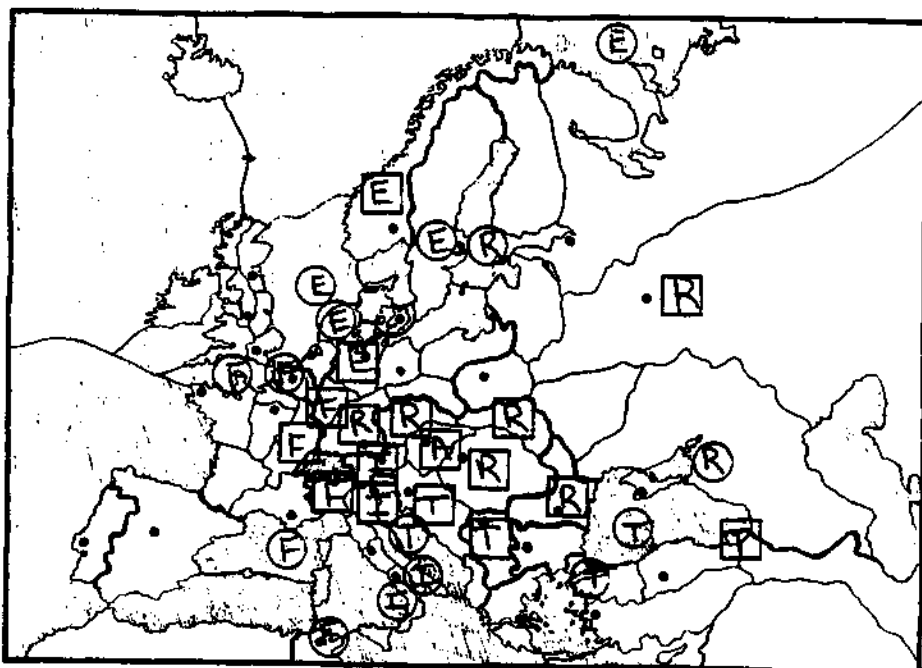
