- I also promised a variant announcement this issue. I have had two variants proposed and I will run either one or the other, depending on reader response. AND if reader response is not sufficient, I will run neither of them.

First, we have an original variant proposed by Phil Senn. It is based on Diplomacy as we know it, but it includes a mometary system for the support of units — much like that of the game of Machiavelli. Controlling centers and territory gives the power a certain income each year, and at the end of the year, the power uses that income to support, disband or BUY units.


Secondly, we have JIHAD by Robert Veeder, submitted by Steve Cartier. It's a game of Diplomacy played on a new map. It includes 8 powers, 2 of which are Major powers, and the remaining powers are smaller. Restrictions, mostly by geography, are applied to the major powers, and it looks as though you have a good struggle between the many little guys and the two big guys (Sounds a little like the modern east-west struggle?)

At any rate, I have seen a detailed description from Phil and Steve and I believe that I would enjoy playing in either variant. So, if there's interest, let we know by issue 3.23. Oh, someone had asked me if I would run a MWIIIb variant, and I said I wight. Is there interest in that 15 player variant, based on the whole world?

GAME NOTES: A reminder that each player can sell no more than 500 of any one currency. Also, new players say join at any time with exactly 1000 of each remaining currency. If an invalid order is submitted, the transactions will be completed by selling as much as legally is possible of each of the "sold" currency (up to the amount specified) and then buying will take place in the order specified, until all US funds are depleted (or the amount specified is reached). It also would be nice if each player would show his calculations - so I have something to check back to. Example:






