- 1. Please note CDA's for Rob Scheunk and Brian Cukurs.
- 2. A few of you have asked how the standby list works. Simply, I maintain a list of players that are willing to submit orders in case an actual player fails to submit orders. The standby will assume control of the country if the MMRing player fails to submit orders for a second issue. This insures that no country will be civil disorder for more than I season in a row. Also, standbys will be asked to replace players that have resigned from a game, or have been removed for some reason or another. The selection of the standby to be used from the list is purely a subjective decision by the GM. I attempt to avoid selecting a standby that has a relationship with a players already in the game. I will not choose a standby that was previously a standby for another country in that game or was an original player in that game. If all things are equal, then a standby that is the least number of games and has been on the list for the longest time will be selected. Standbys play free and they earn tremendous respect from the GM (hint, hint). Any subscriber can be added to the list at anytime, and anyone on the list can get off by simply asking. Standbys for variant games will be maintained separately.
- 3. DIPCOM is June 21-24 in Dallas, Texas at the Market Hall Convention Center. There is a five man variant (1939) from 6pm-11pm on Friday. There is a Gumboat variant tourney from 1pm-6pm on Friday and the Diplomacy National tourney will be held Saturday (9am-5pm and 5pm-1am either one or the other) and Sunday (9am-5pm). The DIPCOM Society meeting will be at 9pm Saturday. I know nothing about pre-ticket sales, etc. I will be there, and I know that subbers Matt Fleming and Mark Luedi will be there. I suspect that some of our Texas subbers will be making too. Oh, if anyone wants a ride from Indy-Dallas (via St. Louis), just drop me a note. Thanks to Mark Luedi and J.R. Baker for the information about DIPCOM.

All players that have have asked for 900 insurance (I'll call collect once if I have received no orders for you) and have given me their phone numbers, should note that the phone number is now part of the Player List. Players should check their numbers, and if anyone else wants NHR insurance, just let me know (and include your phone number).

After we have 15 players, I'll turn the information over to Scott and we'll get started.

The Kissinger - game statements

GERMANY - David Baker

This was my first postal Diplomacy game and I've learned a lot. Before this the only Dip games I'd played had been face-to-face among our local group. The only real competition was my brother (JR) and we inevitably ended up on opposite sides with either him or me winning.

One day Bob (JR) told us about people who played Diplomacy by mail. He had gotten involved in playing a game (82HL) and learned from that of a new publication about to come out that need players. Dec 30th was Allen's birthday so Bob paid the \$5.00 entry fee as a present for him. He then talked the rest of us into joining the game. It did sound like fun. I think Bob even paid the \$5.00 fee for us all. Though I'm not sure of that since it was so long ago.

At first, we thought the game as 5 vs. 2 (Texas vs. Indiana), but that couldn't last long, sooner or later we'd have to go up against each other. Then Byron MMR'ed and Greg quit. We had a new situation. Bob, Allen and I had

pow-wow. We decided to ally and sweep the board before "they" did it to us. The moves went in and so did the knife. Bob had stabbed Allen, he was only 13 years old at the time and he really had trusted Bob. (Allen is my step-son). Allen never really recovered from that stab. 

WWIIIb Diplomacy Variant Rules The Diplomat . May 13, 1984

The Diplomacy rulebook is followed, except with the following additions and changes:

1. LAND/SEA SPACES

Islands surrounded by a boundary, which is not the outline of the island itself (for example: United Kingdom, Haiti, Phillipines, etc.) have the nature of both a land and sea province. Armies may move from one such province to an adjacent land or land/sea province without the help of a fleet. An island of such nature may be connected to a continent, in which an army may move from the island to the adjacent continental province, and vice versa. Fleets may enter these spaces from one side and leave from another as if these spaces were water. Fleets in these provinces may participate in a convoy. The following moves are legal:

- Army Philippines-Borneo (Army Celebes S).
- Army United Kingdom-France.
- Army Honan-Taiwan.
- Fleet Arafura Sea-Celebes.
- Fleet Celebes C Army Bornec-Papua.

2. PANAMA & SUEZ CANALS

Egypt and Panama function as Constantinople and Kiel do in regular Diplomacy. The canals may also be used for passage from one body of water to another without stopping in Egypt or Panama. Supports may not be extended through the canal. A fleet can be supported in its passage through the canal by a fleet on the destination side. If a fleet is prevented from moving through the canal by opposition, it remains in its starting location — unless dislodged. The presense of another unit in Egypt or Panama has no effect on the use of the canal. Examples:

- Fleet Egypt-Red Sea
- Fleet Egypt-Israel
- Fleet Caribbean Sea-Gulf of Panama
- Fleet East Pacific Ocean S Fleet Caribbean Sea-Gulf of Panama
- Fleet Caribbean Sea S Fleet Gulf of Panama is ILLEGAL
- Army Panama holds and Fleet Gulf of Panama-Caribbean Sea
- Fleet Caribbean Sea-Gulf of Panama, F East Pacific-Gulf of Panama - BOTH ORDERS FAIL

3. SPAIN/MOROCCO & GREECE/TURKEY

Armies may move from Spain-Morocco and vice versa. Armies may move from Greece-Turkey and vice versa. Fleets may move Spain(sc)-Morocco and Morocco-Spain(sc). Fleets in Greece and Turkey are considered anywhere along the coast and may move to any adjacent province's coast. The Black Sea and the Eastern Mediterranean DO NOT TOUCH. Western Mediterranean and Mid-Atlantic

DO TOUCH. Entrance to and egress from the Black Sea must be made through either Turkey or Greece.

- 4. There are 89 supply centers. Victory criterion is the first power to 30 centers. If two or more reach 30 in the same season, play continues until one power has more and at least 30 centers.
- 5. Play begins in Spring 1990.
- c. Shaded areas are impassable. The coast lines between an impassable area and a valid province are impassable.
- 7. The following provinces are double-coasted: Columbia, France, Honduras, Mexico, North Korea, Quebec, Russia, Spain, Saudi Arabia.
