(I only WRITE the things, HE prints them!)

The best way to get zapped playing Germany is to put Faz is Russia and Lu Henry in England (see 1979 AO). The only problem with that is that those lousey SOB's will keep you lingering the game to die a slow and painful death (Lu's hobby is kicking crutches out from under and ladies and Fan Agets a charge out of pulling the legs off flies ... or is that the other way around). Germany is one of the more flexible countries to less with; you have the most options to be erratic. If, however, you find yourslef with so many options you can't decide, select one or more units and determine their movement by rolling a die! If you find yourslef incrediably lucky with die rolls, I would suggest you have K Byrne roll the die for you - Kathy is the expert at shitty die rolls (even Stan Johnson's dice don't help)

The possibilities are endless as their are just so many people to piss off. Probably, though, if you can't talk KB into rolling die for you, you'll just want to select a direction for each piece and move that piece that way until it reaches the board's edge or you have to take it off.
