4. AREA rated Diplomacy: (*) Interested parties should note this change in normal house rules. Due to the difficulty experienced last time, the AREA rated game will employ no standby players. The position is yours until you are eliminated or return to continue onward. Of course the same holds true for the players around you, be they enemy or ally.

A proper request for this game includes: (1) your country preference list, (2) your game fee \$3, and (3) a signed AREA claim slip, though it is easier for me if you send in 2. one for winning and one for (heaven forbid) losing.
