HOUSERULE VOTE

Item #2. Vote: 11-3. The following addition to the houserules is approved.

If a player fails to order a unit, fleet or army, and that unit is dislodged in the turn it was unordered, the unit will be allowed to retreat in the succeeding Summer or Winter turn. The only time "unordered" units are automatically removed is if they are units from a country listed as being in Civil Disorder(CD).

d. An order will not be voided due to the particular use of an abbreviation unless 2 or more express meanings are implied. IE f bar-nor is improper, while f lon-nor is not
