- 1) The GM is right 9 times out of 10. If that rare 10th time, the opposite is true: you are WRONG.
- 2) Game requests must include a game fee (\$1) and a country preference list. Countries are assigned by preference. You must maintain a preference sub to play, preferably to this date.
- 3) It is your responsibility to have moves in on time. On time is 5PM(EST) on the due date. Late moves are generally taken if the game hasn't been adjudicated by the time the move arrives; after that you've wasted your time. Phone moves are fine (216-775-2617); however, phone calls to this house after GM are rarely answered, even if someone is here and awake. The GM, or whoever takes the call, takes responsibility for the accuracy of the move.
- 4) If you miss a move, a SB will be called for your next move; if you miss the next move to, your position is forfeit (NMRing out). NMRing out is ground for sub forfeiture without refund.
- 5) In the event of a missed move in 1901, neutral orders will be used. For S01:

- 6) There are 2 divisions of turns: Winter/Spring and Fall, except: In 1901, a W/Spring move is never required. Also, a player have separate any W/Spring move if there are more than 1 builds/removals -- it is not automatic, you must ask, or have a very embarrassing spring move.
- 7) Moves may be conditional on builds/removals, retreats, and the status of a standby player.
- 8) Extensions may be granted on an individual basis. No extension will be granted just to see the retreats of a previous season -- either the guy stabs you or he don't.
- 9) ERRS: If you make one, you're outta luck. If I make one, two, or forty seven, you must let me know in one turn to be corrected. An err standing for after one turn, to include the pubbing of one issue, stands.
- 10) Civil Disorder (CD) is the status of a country with 2 or less units and no player. Assigning CD is at the discretion of the GM. It is rarely given, especially when we have people like BB, Faz, etc who are used to accepting garbage SBs.
- 11) All voting is anonymous. A player may only propose one draw per turn and must vote yes to anything he/she proposes. You may not propose a draw that includes 5 or more players. If you fail to vote, you are considered to abstain; if you NMR totally you are considered to have voted yes. You may voluntarily abstain; you may voluntarily NMR, but in case of the latter two named Guido and Gus will come to your house and break all your fingers. To fail a draw/concession must have at least one "NO" vote, as opposed to a "no vote". A vote is processed before the physical adjudication of the game/SB players take note.
- 12) If you fail to order a retreat for a unit, it goes off-the-board into my 1 yr old's mouth, and you will never, ever, see it again ... not that you'd want to.
- 13) Ambiguous orders will not be processed. Ambiguous is orders with two or more meanings. For example, what do you have if you have a green ball in your left hand and a green ball in your right hand (see below)?
- 14) In the event a player must be replaced other than by the SB-NMR procedure, I will secure the fastest replacement possible. Ans to above: Kermit's attention.
- 15) Press may not, through dateline, be made to sound like it is coming from someone else. Press may be edited or discarded due to excessive length or vulgarity - use digression please. Press will not be edited for outright stupidity despite the wishes of the players in your game. If you have a lot of press, please type it on a ditto master (one or more full pages) - any office supply store should have them for a dollar; they cost 15¢, but you can always pay \$1.
- 16) The GM will never, ever, ever, ever, be responsible for any one set of orders when two or more games are on the same sheet of paper. Tear the things up, please, or accept blind fate.
- 17) I reserve the right to change and/or edit these HRs if the need ever arises, on my own personal whim, so there. Is there anyone out there who's still reading this? If there is then how is a boss like a diaper?

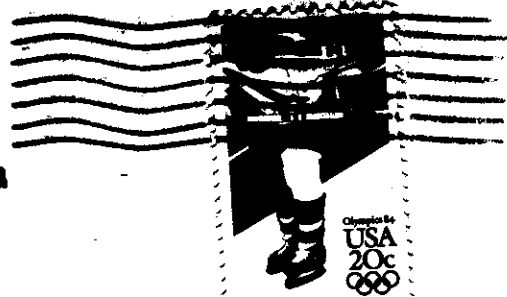
