We work in a "big borther atmosphere" where two-may mirrors lines the walls of the insides of major post offices and tri-weekly check-ups on the street by people hiding in care is commonplace...computers attached to our vehicles for example, I can not say Roagen is an a--, Mondale a dame f---(fool), etc.




