In <u>Everything</u>, # 26 Doug Beyerlein printed a survey to determine how <u>Everything</u> should be run in view of Avalon Hill's desire to combine it with <u>Diplomacy World</u>. I sent my answers in along with some comments. Although Doug Beyerlein seems to have printed everyone else's comments, he didn't print mine. I won't bother to speculate why here as that would be a waste of time. The purpose of this article is to air my views.

In the survey Doug asks for each publisher to rate each of the following four ideas from completely agreeable to completely disagreeable:*

a) AH should combine Everything into Diplomacy World

b) To support Everything in its current format publishers should subscribe while still sending Doug copies of their zine

c) To support Everything in its current format publishers should pay \$1.00 for a Boardman Number and continue to trade

d) To support Everything in its current format publishers should contribute money to its operation

He also asks "if AH's plan ((to combine Everything and Diplomacy World)) is used in the future, will you ((the publisher)) continue to send me your zine even though you may be trading with ((Walt)) Buchanan for Diplomacy World?"

I feel that the first idea is a good idea. This would give Everything a greater circulation which I think would be good for it. The next three ideas are completely disagreeable to me and I'm sure to most other college students who publish. These options would be too great of a financial burden. I simply can't afford it. Also, all of the zines mentioned were more or less monthly (i.e published on schedules ranging from every three weeks to every month) except for Diplomacy World (quarterly), Europa (semimonthly approximately), Everything (semi-monthly), Fol Si Fie (just about weekly), the Gamesman (quarterly), Janus (semi-weekly), Paroxysm (semi-weekly), and Runestone (just about weekly).

This issue counts as 11 pages for all subscribers.
