RANDOM RAMBLINGS

- (1) This issue is slightly late. The adjudications for Fred Brenner's games should have come out on Friday while the adjudications for the other games should have come out last Friday. This delay is primarily due to the fact that I had three tests last week and a lot of other work to do. I am in New York City at the moment and will be returning to Cambridge tomorrow (Tuesday) night. This issue will get run off Tuesday night and mailed Wednessday morning. - (3) In the past, I have been very lenient regarding late orders. I usually would except orders up until the moment I adjudicated the game or games in question. Effective immediately this will no longer be the case. Allowing late orders is unfair and can grossly change the outcome of a game if a player receives a note which he was meant to receive after the deadline and then changes his orders. So, effective immediately, no late orders will be accepted.
- (4) While on the subject of orders, I will state once again that orders for a game must be sent to the gamesmaster for that game. I will not forward orders to other people. I will throw them in the garbage!
- (5) The standby situation has improved quite a bit. However, I could still use some more standbies. If you are interested in standbying please let me know. At the moment my standby list consists of David Lagerson, Ron Kelly, Steve McLendon, Doug Hollingsworth, Eric Verheiden, Chris Schleicher, Don Blasland, Lee Kendter, Wayne Norton, and Andy Cook. Alan Rowland and Roland Straten were dropped from the list for failure to submit standby orders when requested.
- (6) I am thinking about opening one more game of regular Diplomacy. Three games have ended this issue and a couple more should end in the new future. If I do open any new games they will be guest-gamesmastered. So, if you are interested in guest-gamesmastering a game herein, please let me know. The requirements are few and the details can be worked out.
