THE FACTS OF LIFE

This issue is late. Five months late or so. I suspect that a few of you even thought that this issue would never come out. Well, at times I was wondering about that too. Diplomacy isn't as much fun now as it was in high school. I have found other things to do and have a lot more responsiblities. This is not to say that I don't plan to continue to publish. I do. The past five months have been tough on everyone and I am really sorry for the delay. I'd like to thank all of you for sticking with me. I quess I should try to explain some of the reasons why this is so late. Around November my classes started to catch up with me. I had a lot of work to do including a thirty page proposal with two other people. Then in December there was finals. After finals I was busy getting ready to go home for Christmas. I should have taken everything necessary to produce the Tetracuspid home with me but I wasn't smart enough to do that. I thought I'd knock the Tetracuspid off as soon as I got back. Boy was I wrong. I quickly got involved in M.I.T.'s IAP (Independent Activities Period). The Student Information Processing Board (S.I.P.B. for short), which is essentially a group of computer hackers to which I belong, was offering two "courses". One was a course in LISP and the other was a course in the workings of Multics which is the operating system on the main interactive computer system on campus. Well, I got involved with administering much of the first course including registering people on the system and getting the notes xeroxed. I also got involved with teaching the second course. While all this was going on, the ceiling in my room literally collapsed. I woke up one morning to the sound of water dripping from the ceiling. Apparently, the valve on the radiator in the room above me had completely rusted through and sprung a leak. Fortunately, there was no real damage except for the ceiling. It took MIT about a week to get a contracter in and repair the ceiling. They still haven't painted it and I will probably wind up doing that over one of my upcoming vacations. After that, it was back to school. Then came the big blizard (27 inches of snow). Since then I have trying to keep up with my classes and have been making some progress on this. That about brings you up to date. I realize that no matter what happened, a delay of five months is unacceptable but I hope that you'll understand that I haven't been sleeping on the beach all that time. From now on, I hope to do a lot better.

Over the past couple of months I have heard a few players say that they would like to see their games transferred out of the Tetracuspid. I have even heard that one person had a new zine and GM lined up for his game. Although I am not happy with seeing any games in here transferred elsewhere, I am not totally against it either. What I will do is this, if anyone can come up with a GM willing to take over a game herein, they should send me the details, and I will publish them. I will then hold a vote similiar to a draw proposal vote, in which any no vote vetoes the move, but an absention doesn't count. Each player and the GM has one vote. (This is to allow Fred Brenner and Ira Rosen to speak

for themselves. I will vote yes assuming the new GM is fairly competent although I don't want to see any games leave the Tetracuspid.) In addition, the players in any games that are transferred will get their subscription balence and / or deposit refunded if they desire although they will probably have to subscribe to whatever zine the games get moved to (assuming any games do get moved). Also, anyone who is just subscribing to the Tetracuspid and wants a refund on his remaining money can get it.

The next deadline for all games is Monday April 24th, 1978. Orders should be sent to the correct GM for your game. I presume that both Ira and Fred are willing to continue GMing. Ira and Fred should mail me the results of the games as soon as possible after the deadline and I will put out an issue by the next Monday. If you do not want to continue in your game, please let me know now so that I can try to find a replacement for you.

There is a fair chance that I will be going to Europe for a month to a month and a half this summer. If I do go, I would leave in early June and return in either early or middle July. This would definitely interfere with the June deadline and possibly also the July deadline. Assuming I do go to Europe, I would hope that Fred and Ira could send out their games by carbon copy for the one or two seasons. I would then need a temporary GM for my games. I don't think this would be that hard to arrange so I'm not that worried. If you'd like to help me out by running a game or two for two seasons, please let me know. I would of course pick up all costs of postage and duplication.

ON FACING A SUSPECTED ENGLISH STAB by Mark L. Berch

In Diplomacy World, # 15 there appears an article on the play of France by Adam Gruen which contains a good deal of dubious advice, including an opening which in my opinoin is just plain wrong. This was the play for when an English stab is suspected, but the French do not wish to do anything so drastic as FBre -Enq. Gruen recommends "Plain Defense": FBre - Mid, AMar - Spa, APar - Bre. This is inferior to "Iberia", which has APar - Pic rather than - Bre. Both will defend Brest, but that's about as far as "Defense" goes. If you are going to defend Bre by the "Defense" opening, you do ABre H and you cannot build a fleet there come winter, whereas with "Iberia", if APic - Bre, FEng -Bre occurs you have that opportunity. This is not the only extra option that the "Iberia" player will have. Should he be willing to postpone an Iberian center to be almost certain that FBre can be raised, he can do <u>FMid - Bre, APic - Bre</u>. More important, APic can try to divert the attack on France by offering support for the English into Belgium. Whether the support is actually given is another matter, but at least APic can tempt the English elsewhere; ABre cannot.

Further, what happens if FLon - Eng doesn't occur? After all, if you're quite certain that it's coming you'll probably block it anyway. ABre will be completely out of the Belgian sector, and will be a practically useless army.

There is in fact only one rather obscure circumstance where "Defense" is the better option. When FLon - Eng is supected, and you think that Fall 1901 will see FEng - Mid, and you are willing to leave Bre unprotected, the "Defense" gives you the options of FMid C ABre - Iberia, gaining you two builds without losing control of Mid. Even in that case, though, Gruen's "Plan Suicide" (a grossly inappropriate name for an entirely sensible opening): FBre - Mid, APar - Gas, AMar - Spa is probably just as good an option, since you can take your two Iberian builds and do FMid - Eng just in case England does something other than FEng - Mid.

It would be a good idea to look at a few games in which France used this opening, to see how it turned out. After considerable search, I was unable to locate a single one. It appears to be an extremely unpopular opening. In Weidmark's article on openings in Diplomacy World, ‡ 11, his analysis of 50 games fails to reveal a single one that used APar - Bre. Likewise, Mike Bullock's analysis of 62 British games, quoted in Arena, ‡ 36, indicates that in none of them was APar - Bre used. There's a good reason for this shunning: It's a lousy move.


