Comments by Richard Kovalcik, Jr.:

- 1) In this case John Leeder listed all gamesmasters with two or more votes on his main list.

- 3) Please, no commiserations over <u>Runestone's</u> fall from the number one spot. I fully expected it, and am surprised it did not slip further.
- 4) Congratulations to Randolph Smyth on pubbing North America's top established zine!
