GAMEOPENINGS

To play in a game you must maintain a subscription or trade, pay a \$2.00 gamefee, and maintain a \$3.00 deposit which will, as stated in the houserules, be deposited in the ISE (International Subscription Exchange). This deposit will only be refunded if you stay in the game until you are eliminated or the game ends. Please send me your preference list and a lump sum of money if you want to play. If you do not specify which game you want to play in, I will fill them up in the order listed above subject to the rule that no two people from the same state or province (with the exception of New York and California) may be in the same game.

So far, Ira Rosen (Lower NY), Wayne Norton (Nova Scotia), Shawn Naus (Lower CA), David Tutacko (IN), Fred Zornow (Upper NY), and Buddy Tretick (TN) are signed up for the first game and Bernie Oaklyn (MD) for the second game.
