ZINE REVIEWS

Here are reviews of those zines I receive that have not been reviewed in either issue number 37 or issue number 38. These are mostly zines that I have started to receive since then. Actually, they are not so much reviews but more just a list of the zines, along with pertinent information about each (publisher, gameopenings information, contents of the last issue I received, relative frequency of publication, perhaps an observation about the zine, and so on). I have continued my previous policy and not included any cost information. If I did include cost information, people might just subscribe to or sign up for a game in a zine without ever getting a sample copy. I suggest you send a SSAE (Stamped Self-Addressed Envelope) to the publisher of any zine you are interested in and ask for a sample copy. This way, you will have some more concrete basis for deciding if you like a zine before you send money. Unfortunately, in some cases, I could find no information in the zine regarding gameopenings so I was forced to list that there was no information on gameopenings. Also, sometimes the method of printing or the exact frequency of publication was not clear so I had to guess. Most of the zines listed below are relatively new zines. They are all very good to excellent zines. Although I don't think any of them are about to fold, you should consider how long a zine has been published as a measure of how likely it is to continue before subscribing to it.

miles per gallon on the highway (actually it gets 20) and gas will cost \$1.50 per gallon by June, the round-trip cost for gas would be \$60 for 2 people, \$40 for 3, \$30 for 4, and \$24 for 5 to Dipcon and \$30 for 2 people, \$20 for 3, \$15 for 4, and \$12 for 5 to Origins. Tolls would be a couple of dollars more per person. I'm sure that this beats buying a plane ticket even if only one other person goes with me.

4) John Leeder is running the "Fourth Annual North American Zine and Gamesmaster Poll". To quote him:

If you receive or have received during the last year, a Diplomacy publication published in North America, you are eligible to participate in the Zine Poll. Give each zine you receive a rating on a scale of 0 to 10 (no fractions, please), with 10 being the best possible rating and 0 the worst possible. (It is not necessary that one zine you receive be given a 10 and another a 0; just assign each one a number of whatever size between 0 and 10. Do not give your favourite zine a 10

and your least favourite a O as a matter of course only. I mention these only because some people have done this in the past.) It is not necessary to explain to me your rationale for each rating; it'll never be printed or, probably, read. You may use whatever subjective criterion you wish to arrive at your rating.

If you are playing in a postal Diplomacy or Dip variant game, or have done so within the past year, you are eligible to participate in the Gamesmaster Poll. Give the GM a rating on a scale of 0 to 10, similarly to your rating in the Zine Poll. The GM should be rated by name: a GM rating where the zine only is named will not be counted. ((a) Some zines use guest GMs; I don't know which, nor do I always know such GGM's name; (b) I don't know the names of all zines and publishers anv more.)

Only votes which follow the above format will be counted: deviations will be ignored. (It always fascinates me what inventive screwups people manage to come up with!) Unsigned ballots will not be counted.

Sign your ballot to avoid duplication (but your votes will be kept in strictest confidence). Indicate some way in which you participate in the hobby, e.g.: player in _____, subscriber to _____, publisher of _____, specified hobby functionary, etc.

Any hobby participant anywhere in the world is eligible to participate; however, please vote only for North American zines and GMs.
